Island Manager Comments



Frye Island Directory: We are in the process of updating our Island Directory. Please contact the office if you want your Island phone number, home address and your e-mail address in the directory.

Candidates: Don't forget that the elections for Selectmen, Board of Island Trustees, and Frye Island Incorporated Board of Directors will be held during the July 5th Town Meeting. If you are interested in becoming a candidate for any of these boards, please notify the office so you can be placed on the appropriate warrant.

Milfoil Stickers: We have noticed that a number of boats in the Marina do not have their Milfoil stickers displayed. If your boat was registered in Maine you would have gotten the sticker at that time. If you registered your boat outside the State of Maine you must stop at the office and get an "Out of State Milfoil Sticker". It is a requirement that these stickers be displayed.

Ferry Lines: The waiting lines for the ferry have returned to the Island. It is an unfortunate and somewhat aggravating situation that we all have experienced at one time or another. However, if you are in line on the Island please stay as far to the right as possible, especially in the area approaching the store. It is important to leave a path for emergency vehicles. In addition, there may be Islanders trying to get to the store and/or the office, so please be considerate of them, and leave enough room for them to pass.

FII Board / BIT Executive Committee meeting: The meeting to review the Marina Committee recommendations regarding "grandfathering" of slips in the Long Beach Marina and Quail Circle Canal will be held on Sunday June 29th.

Re-evaluation: I am sure that everyone is aware by now that a re-evaluation is in progress. (I am already receiving complaints about the anticipated increase in taxes). This re-evaluation will be completed this summer and applied to the 2004 taxes. While it is true that there is a relationship between taxes and the assessed value of a property, a re-evaluation does not necessarily mean there will be an increase in taxes. The money we need to raise in taxes is determined by the operating budget which is prepared by the Town Manager and the Selectmen / Executive Committee and approved by the voters at the October town meeting. The portion of the tax which each property owner must pay is based on the "Fair Market Value" of their property. This is determined by the Re-evaluation. I do expect that the total value of the property on Frye Island will increase and this increase could be significant. I would not be surprised to see the total value double. However, this does not mean that the taxes will double. The **total** assessed value of the Island combined with the money needed to pay operating expenses determines the "Mil Rate". This year the "Mil Rate" is \$38.60. If the total assessed value doubles next year and the money needed in taxes remains the same, the "Mil Rate" would be in the \$20.00 range. This value combined with the **individual** property value determines the property owners share. This process is required by the State. The only thing the Town can do is to insure that each property owner is treated fairly and consistently.

Police Activity: The Selectmen voted at their last meeting to establish a Frye Island Police Department. We will sub-contract with First Response Security to provide this service. They have a significant amount of experience and have attended special training required by the State to enforce State laws. The message received at the infamous "beach closing" meeting was "enforce the State laws". This will enable us to do that. I hope everyone will cooperate with the officers. A note of warning!! I have noticed a few unregistered golf carts on the roads. These must be registered with the town. If your golf cart is not registered please stop at the town office and get this done. You can be fined if this isn't done. It's the law!!



WHATS HAPPENING AT THE FRYE ISLAND GOLF COURSE

A lot of activities are underway and I thought it would be a good time to mention those that I'm aware of at this time.

The first thing that people visiting the golf course or Leisure Lounge will notice is the continuation of work on the parking lot. Things have really taken shape in short order, and the now almost completed parking lot is an attractive enhancement to the golf course and the island instead of an eye sore. A tremendous amount of volunteer effort has been donated on this project and the project gained significant momentum because of a few very hardworking individuals. I would like to offer special thanks to Paul Lyons and his side kick Bob Minor for keeping this project on track and moving forward. They have had a lot of help as well from Bruce Nisula, Bill Tessier, Tom Bishop and others and I would ask everyone to offer a hardy thanks to all these folks when you see them.

Well volunteerism must run in families because a number of the spouses from the parking lot crew grabbed their brooms, scrub brushes, and Brillo pads and went to town on the basement of the club house. It may not seem like something to get too excited about but if you had the displeasure of seeing the condition of this area before the make over, you will find it pleasurable when you enter it the next time. And I encourage people to take a look and if you are as impressed as I am be sure to say thanks to Loraine Lyons, Margaret Minor and Patsie Tessier for a solid day of scrubbing cleaning and organizing. It looks great ladies!

Even a little further behind the scenes I want to mention the efforts of Kathy Lyons and Laura Crosby who have dealt very effectively with a ton of Pro Shop Goods that no one expected to be delivered. These two ladies sorted through all the merchandise deciding what was needed what wasn't and matching up deliveries to invoices and preparing purchase orders. They also inventoried every item, established a proper selling price and then reorganized the merchandise in the Pro Shop. Once again, I would like to express my appreciation for a fine job and the many hours that went into this project.

I certainly don't want to overlook the golf course itself. Most noticeable is the new drainage installed last fall by Jay on hole five and hole three. I have found hitting out of the woods back into the fairway much more enjoyable and on the rare occasion when I do hit the fairway off the tee I've yet to plug the ball on either of these holes. The tee boxes are also noticeably greener and more uniform and looking great. Although we experienced some winter kill on our greens, in speaking with representatives from the MSGA, many Maine courses suffered much worse. We also have benefited from one other volunteer and this fellow isn't even an owner on Frye Island, his name is Jim Hodge. Jim is the course Superintendent at Valhalla Country Club in Cumberland and his brother John is his connection to Frye Island. Jim has generously donated some of his time while visiting Frye Island to tour our golf course with Jay and Bruce Nisula and to exchange ideas with Jay about course conditions and treatments. I've heard that Jim is impressed by our Frye Island Golf Course indicating that it one of the best nine hole courses in Maine. From all of the members and islanders thanks Jim for both the kind words and the time and expertise that you have given us.
