Brush Dump: We have had a number of incidents at the brush dump so far this year. On three separate occasions we have had to ask young people to stop climbing in the dumpsters. There is broken glass and many other things in these containers that could cause serious injury. It shouldn't have to be said that this is not acceptable. We have also had someone throw propane tanks into the dumpster. This was not discovered until Pine Tree Waste dumped the container at their facility. These containers have exploded in the past and caused serious personal injury. Needless to say, the management at Pine Tree was very upset with the Island. They could shut us down if this occurs again. During this same week we also found a television in the trash that goes to MERC. This again is not permissible. Please dump your trash in the specified containers only. We have been trying to leave the brush dump open for as long as possible for the convenience of the Islanders. However, if people are not more considerate, we may have to go back to having this area open only when we can have a monitor there.

Selectmen / Executive Committee Meeting: Please note that the location for the Selectmen / executive Committee meeting has been changed from the Administration Building to the Community Center. Also, the joint BIT/ FII Board meeting to hear the Marina Committee "Grandfathering" requests has been changed to 9:00 A.M. Sunday June 29th at the Community Center.

Ferry Schedule: This weekend begins the "high season" so make sure you check the ferry schedule!!!

Police Activity: Dana Wessling and Eric Pearce have now been sworn in as Law Enforcement Officers for the Town of Frye Island. They have received the appropriate training and are now authorized to enforce both State and local ordinances.

We continue to have our share of unregistered and / or inappropriately marked golf carts on our roads. Name another town in the State of Maine where you can go and ride your golf cart to the beach, or to the store or to visit a friend. I don't believe you can. Using a golf cart on the roads in Town isn't a right. It is a special privilege. Let's not abuse it.

We are also getting our share of more serious incidents. Last week-end we had a run-a-way boat crash at full speed into shore on the West side of the Island. Fortunately, no one was injured but the boat was destroyed. We had an individual verbally harass our law enforcement officer, who showed a great deal of constraint and drove off to avoid escalating the situation. We had a young person on a motor scooter flee from the officer and almost hit a young girl on a bicycle. And, we had an individual clocked at 60 miles per hour on Sunset. This individual was intoxicated, and in the process of attempting to get home, ran two stop signs. The officer escorted the gentleman home. We are very fortunate, **this time**, that there wasn't another vehicle, a golf cart or a pedestrian at the intersection at the same time as our speeding friend. I have identified a number of these incidents in the FINS to make you aware of some of the issues we face. I sometime get the impression that many people feel that we develop ordinances to punish them, but that is certainly not the case. The ordinances we have are there to protect everyone on the Island. We have been very lenient so far in addressing these violations, but this weekend begins the "high season" and we are going to get tougher. There will be more and more people on the Island using our roads, and we must enforce the ordinances we have for the safety of all. If you are caught violating one of our ordinances, you can and should expect to get punished.

Remember, the speed limit on our roads is **20 Miles per Hour**.





Newspapers (and magazines), #2 Plastic, Clear Glass, Metal Cans.* Please **DO NOT MIX ITEMS** in the compartments. Mixing causes contamination and the item lot is rejected and the town won't get any credit towards the tonnage of recyclables. Please help in making Frye Island a good example of recycling. If a compartment is full, as they sometimes are, do not overfill that compartment, or deposit in another compartment. *Only you can help to prevent contamination of the recycling dumpster compartments by depositing in proper designed compartments.* If you are not sure where to put items, ask the attendant or any Public Works employee. Please don't leave materials outside the dumpster, as the wind can blow them around and into the woods causing unsightly littering. Thank you for your cooperation! PLEASE CONSIDER PARTICIPATING ON THE FII BOARD

What is the Board? – The Board consists of nine members who are elected by the stockholders each July to serve for a one year term. The Board then represents the stockholders on the various issues that come up during the course of the year.

What are the major issues the Board will be dealing with? – While there are several matters the Board will consider, the two big items for next year will be managing the real estate policy and considering the possible transfer of FII assets to the Town.

Real Estate Policy – FII owns hundreds of lots on the Island. Last year an updated Real Estate Policy was passed by the stockholders. This policy provides guidelines on selling and purchasing lots. As the real estate market is currently very active, there will be several proposed transactions that will come before the Board.

Transfer of Assets – FII owns a large majority of the assets on the Island. Almost everything that is not owned by a private individual is owned by FII. Most of these assets are leased to the Town. For a number of years there have been discussions regarding the possible transfer of assets to the Town. This may result in cost savings and reduced liability. In recent years the Board recommended that the water system be turned over to the Town. This was approved by a stockholder vote. The Board will continue evaluating the possible benefit of additional transfers. No transfer will occur without a full vote of the stockholders, but the Board will be very active in collecting information to present to the stockholders.

What is the Commitment? – Good question. There is a very important commitment – your time! Last year, in addition to the July and October stockholder meetings, the Board met eight times during the summer and two times during the winter. The average meeting during the summer lasts 2 to 3 hours. During the winter the meetings last 6 or 7 hours. It is not a problem if you live away from Maine during the winter. You are telephonically connected to the meetings through the wonders of modern technology.

A great candidate – All it takes to be a great candidate is your willingness to donate your time and to represent the stockholders to the best of your ability.

Real Estate Steering Committee – A wonderful alternative to serving on the Board would be serving on the Real Estate Steering Committee. This Committee will be formed in July to assist the Board in long and short term real estate planning.

If you are interested – If you are interested in the Board or Steering Committee, please submit your name to Wayne at the Office. This is a very good year to participate. Generally, between seven and nine incumbents run for re-election to the Board. This year at least five current members of the Board are “retiring”. There is plenty of room for new blood!!
