

Island Manager Comments

Greetings The sun is shining and it feels like summer has finally returned to Frye Island. We are now in our "High Season" and we have lots of fun activities as well as our annual Town meeting coming up.

The annual Town Meeting will be held on July 5th, sign in is at 8:00 am to 9:00 am. We have to vote on several positions for the Board of Selectman, BIT, and the FII Board.

Candidates: I need to make a couple of corrections to the list of candidates that was published last week. We have also had a few additions. Hopefully I have it right this time. These people have indicated a desire to be considered for the following boards:

Please attend the meeting on Saturday, July 5th to vote for the candidate that you feel will best represent your interests as well as the interests of the whole Island.

Fire Works: The donations for the fire works this year are lagging way behind the contract price, and again, the fire works display is in jeopardy of not happening. The cost to put the fire works on this year is \$5500.00. The donations we have collected to date total \$1750.00. If you haven't donated yet, you can stop in at the office and make a donation. The fire works display has become a much anticipated activity on the 4th of July weekend for many people. Please help us continue this tradition that was begun when we became Maine's newest town.

It is also important to remember that the State Fire Marshal requires that we remove all of the boats in the Marina from slip numbers 66 and higher on the beach side, and 47 and higher on the road side. If you have a boat on one of these slips it must be removed no later than **5:00 PM**. If you do not remove your boat, we will have to do it in order for the fire works display to be held.

Community Yard Sale: I would like to thank Nancy Perry, Elaine Vande Hei and every one else who worked on and / or contributed to the yard sale held last week-end. The sale realized a profit of \$260.00 that was donated to the fire works display.

Water System: I got an e-mail this week questioning why we should consider spending \$2,000,000 to upgrade the water system just to supply water for the new proposed sub-division. I hope there are not too many people that are thinking this way. Two years ago \$370,000 was approved by the voters to upgrade portions of the water system. For whatever reason, this funding was never used even though we were on the approved list to receive these funds from the Drinking Water State Revolving Fund program (DWSRF). We have now reached the time when our drinking water system needs significant upgrading. The black plastic distribution piping has served long beyond its designed and expected life. The pumping system from the lake is aged and inadequate, and the treatment system needs to be modernized to meet new requirements. The fact is that if we didn't build another home on the Island we would still have to upgrade our system in order to provide a safe and reliable drinking water system. However, we all know that there will be more homes built on the Island. There is a potential for 300 more over time so it is important to develop a well planned, well engineered, long term replacement program now. The upgrade we are considering will modernize the system but it would be irresponsible not to consider the expected growth in the design process. It has nothing to do with the proposed subdivision.

Police Activity: Dana Wessling and Eric Pearce have now been sworn in as Law Enforcement Officers for the Town of Frye Island. They have received the appropriate training and are now authorized to enforce both State and local ordinances. Bud Faulk will no longer be serving as our constable. We would like to thank Bud for his service in this position.

We have been working diligently to iron out the communications links for our new police force. You can report a **Medical Emergency**, a **Fire Emergency**, or a **Police Emergency** by dialing **911**. For a non-emergency police issue, you can dial **749-1666** or **471-7614**. When and if this changes, we will let you know.

We continue to experience our share of violators. We had ten speeders that were stopped and warned and a motor vehicle accident in which an automobile destroyed a phone pole and caused a significant amount of damage to the vehicle this past week. The driver of the vehicle was located, ticketed and will have to discuss it next with the district court judge. We have also had two reported "Break-ins". We will continue to consistently prosecute violators.

We are now into our busy season. Schools are out, children of all ages are using the roadways, walking, riding bikes, etc. Be considerate and drive safely.

Remember, the speed limit on our roads is **20 Miles per Hour**. This includes Sunset Road. It is not the drag strip to the ferry. Speeding on this road or any could become very costly. Also remember that your vehicle will not respond as quickly on our dirt roads as it will on dry, paved roads.


