

Manager Comments: Greetings everyone.



Hazardous Household Waste: This is your last chance to participate in the household hazardous waste pick-up day for this year. It will be Saturday August 2nd. There is a list further in the FINS identifying what you can and cannot bring to the brush dump. Everything for this pick-up must be there before the dump closes on Friday August 1st so that we can get it to Raymond Saturday morning.

At a recent Planning Board meeting the Board discussed the potential of a “Growth Ordinance” to help curb the impact on the Island infrastructure. A number of Islanders attended the meeting and, I think correctly, voiced their concern about initiating a Growth Ordinance without addressing a plan to improve our infrastructure. All of the systems in our infrastructure including our amenities will be impacted by growth but the two most critical to the Island and those that need immediate attention are the water system and the ferry service. We have not yet developed a long term plan to improve these systems but we will and we are starting now.

Water System: The water system is really the easier of the two to address and we have started. At the July town meeting the voters approved applying for a \$500,000.00 loan through the Drinking Water State Revolving Loan Fund (DWSRF). If this loan is approved we will use these funds to initiate improvements to the supply and treatment side of our system. These improvements will increase the capacity of the supply system to accommodate the usage expected with 750 homes on the Island. We will be purchasing and installing new and larger raw water pumps and larger distribution pumps. We will also build a new treatment building, add filtration capacity, continuous monitoring equipment, and start a new distribution system. All of the improvements will be designed for the long term. The mains will be up to 8” diameter pipe (we currently have 2”) to increase the capacity and will be buried below the frost line in order to reduce if not eliminate the frequent breaks we have. In the mean time, we have issued proposals for 4 pressure reducing valves that we will install in the system as soon as we can. These valves will replace the “blow off” system we are currently using to control pressure in the system. It is estimated that these blow off valves are wasting 21,000 gallons per day of treated water which amounts to 16.6% of the peak days flow. These valves will improve the short term capacities and will also be used as we design the replacement system.

Ferry Service: Everyone that has to use the ferry service is aware of the short comings of this system. These issues can probably be categorized into two parts. (1) The short term issues, how do we best address the current needs of the Island population? And, (2) the long term issues, how do we address the needs of the Island population when we grow almost double our existing size to 750 homes? The solutions to the ferry service will be much more difficult to arrive at then the water system solutions. We just have to engineer the appropriate water system. The ferries are much more complex. I have had many discussions with a number of people during the past couple of weeks to identify the short term as well as the long term problems and some possible solutions but I need your help.

I will be scheduling some open forums to “brainstorm” these 2 systems. (The water system and the ferries). These sessions will be limited to 1-1/2 hours so we will have to stay focused, and they **will** stay positive. We will identify the challenges we now face with these systems and then we will identify potential solutions. This is the time to think “outside the box” as they used to say. The purchase of a new ferry for \$1,500,000.00 that will transport 6 cars more than we do now may not be the right solution. We must think innovatively. I plan to schedule these meetings both during the week and on the weekends to maximize participation. The first meeting will be held on **Tuesday, August 5th at 9:00 AM at the community center**. If this proves to be beneficial, I will schedule more. This is your chance to become part of the solution. Please try to come to one of these meetings.

Speaking of the ferries, we are trying a few changes to help move the traffic. Last week we had Kevin (PWD Director) and his wife Susan as Mate, drive a second boat to try to minimize the wait. Ross has expressed his thanks to Kevin and Sue and we echo that. I'll discuss this in more detail next week.

Police and Rescue Activity: Last week we had our first rescue run of the season. A young child fell down a flight of stairs. Members of our Fire Dept. and the Raymond Rescue responded to the scene. It was determined that the child, who's parents were renting, did not need to be transported to the hospital. We have also had a number of speeding tickets issued. In one particular case a contractor was stopped for speeding and it was determined that he also didn't have his registration and could not produce his proof of insurance (he did fax it to us later).



HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE

What is Household Hazardous Waste?

Household Hazardous Waste is any product that is classified as toxic (poisonous), corrosive, flammable, or reactive (explosive). Such products can be found in homes, garages, or work-shops. When improperly disposed of, it can poison people, animals and can pollute homes and the natural environment. Many of these can be identified by reading labels. Look for the words: poison, corrosive, caution, flammable, danger, or warning.



Cost:
Will depend on quantity of waste delivered. Each Town will provide subsidies on a first come first serve basis.

Pre-registration is recommended. In previous years, costs have ranged between \$10 and \$20 per 5 gallons of waste. For more information please call your Town Office.

How do I transport these materials?

Bring materials in original containers, be sure they are securely closed.

Pack containers in sturdy upright boxes and pad with newspaper.

Never Mix Chemicals Together !!!

Never smoke or eat while handling or transporting hazardous materials. Leaking or broken containers must be contained. Leave pets at home. Pack your car and drive directly to the sight.


