**Manager Comments:** Greetings everyone.

**Revaluation:** The Assessor has completed the revaluation of all of the Island property. On Saturday, August 2nd, at the Selectmen's meeting he presented the overall results. By now, everyone should have a letter identifying their new property values and providing an **estimated** tax for the 2004 year. We used an estimated tax rate of \$15.00 per \$1000.00 of value to determine this estimate. This rate will be finalized once the budget has been approved at the October town meeting but should be close to this figure. The assessors are holding hearings with people that have questions concerning their new values. If you have any issues with your new assessment and have not yet met with one of the assessors, please notify them as soon as possible. If changes are necessary, there is less impact on the budget if they can be addressed before the budget is finalized and the taxes are committed.

**Water System and Ferry Service:** We have now held two meetings to discuss near term and long term challenges facing us in regards to these two systems. We continue to get good ideas which we are in the process of reviewing. We will hold another meeting on Saturday the 16<sup>th</sup> at 9:00 AM in the Community Center for anyone that would like to attend and offer their thoughts.

**Water System:** As I have explained at the meetings, we presently use blow off valves located throughout the system to control pressure. It is estimated that we discharge approximately 20,000 gallons a day through these valves. We have ordered pressure control valves which should do a better job at controlling the pressure in the system and not waste the 20,000 gals of treated water.

**Ferry Service:** We have started running a second ferry during the day to relieve some of the traffic. Some will say that this "is a day late and a dollar short" and it may be but we have just recently been able to arrange the work schedules of our captains and mates to accomplish this. It is a schedule we plan to adopt as we develop the budget for next year. It has been suggested that we explore training Islanders for part time service as Captains and Mates for the future. If anyone is interested in this for next year, or even this Fall, please contact the office. I have also received many suggestions that relate to the operating policies of the ferries. I am in hopes of getting some of these drafted for review while the Island is still open so that we can maximize the input from everyone.

**Police and Rescue Activity:** Earlier this year a young man was given a citation for operating an un-registered vehicle and failure to show proof of insurance. We just received notice that the young man defaulted on the citation, meaning that he failed to pay the appropriate fine or challenge the citation in court within the allotted time frame. Because of this a warrant has been issued on this young man. If he is stopped again anywhere, this will show up when the officer checks "wants and warrants". He could be taken to jail, a fact that I doubt he is aware of. I still don't believe that people on the Island are tuned in to the program. You must realize, that like every other town across the nation, we too must obey all local, state, and federal laws and ordinances. Contrary to popular belief sometimes, they are there for our protection.

We have added 4 way stop signs at the intersection of Middle Beach Road and High Point Drive. Please be aware of this as you travel in this area.




