**Greetings everyone.**

**Brush Dump:** I would like to clarify a few points at the brush dump. I've heard a number of comments about the large, and growing, pile of brush at the brush dump. It was suggested earlier that we consider "recycling" some of our brush and slash into wood chips and in that way reduce the number of trucks coming and going on the ferry. We have an opportunity to do this to see how it will work. We were told some time ago by the State Forestry Service that we had to move the large pile of brush and wood that was piled in the back of the dump from the ice storm a number of years ago because we have to maintain access around the dump for the fire department and we are no longer allowed to bury it as has been done in the past. We moved this pile to the land fill area. In addition, we have allowed the contractor building the road to Emerald Point to stock pile his brush and stumps there because he will be assisting us financially when we hire a tub grinder to grind this material into wood chips. This will be scheduled in September. It will be a good trial to see how effective this is.

**Ferry Usage:** The contractor building the road for Emerald Point has leased the second ferry for four days next week (Sept 2<sup>nd</sup> through the 5<sup>th</sup>) to transport gravel to the Island. The trucks they will use will have a fluorescent red visitors pass in their windshield for identification. The ferry they will be using will also be marked. These trucks will get priority on the second boat. However, they have consented to allow us to put other vehicles on the ferry if room permits. If you see these vehicles getting loaded on the ferry, don't get angry.... the contractor has paid for the ferry for the whole day.

**FII:** At the FII Board of Directors meeting held on Saturday August 23<sup>rd</sup>, the Board voted not to sell any more property this year. FII sold 2 Buildable lots, 1 pump-back lot and 4 privacy lots this year.

The Board also voted unanimously to recommend to the stockholders that the ownership of the ferries be transferred to the town. Every stockholder will receive a "proxy" ballot in the mail. Please review the material you receive and cast your ballot accordingly.

**New Fire Truck:** For the past few years the Federal Government has made millions of dollars available to municipalities throughout the country, in the form of grants, for the purchase of emergency equipment. Chief Perrson has applied for grant money for the purchase of a fire truck for the past few years with no success. Undeterred, he tried again this year, and much to everyone's surprise, we got word this week that we had been approved to receive a grant in the amount of \$130,000.00 for the purchase of a new fire truck.

**Police and Rescue Activity:** This was a busy week for the EMS crews. Last Saturday they responded to a report that a power boat had swamped and overturned in rough water sending four people into the lake. None of these people had life jackets available. They were all very fortunate when a good Samaritan from New Hampshire arrived on the scene and plucked them from the lake. He also towed the swamped boat around to the Recreation Beach where it was pumped out and turned upright. Luckily no one was injured. This wasn't the case on the second call that came in during this same time frame. In this second incident, a 23 year old man from Massachusetts jumped from Frye's Leap and drowned in the rough water before he could be pulled from the lake. We also had a young construction worker that was suffering from anaphylactic shock from a bee sting. A middle aged man was suffering from severe stomach pains and another young construction worker was hit in the head by a backhoe. All were transported to the hospital.

**Summer 2003:** As I sit here writing this report, it is hard to believe that the last week-end of the summer of 2003 is upon us. For some that might be considered a blessing but for most it marks a return to school and to our more normal lives wherever our "winter" homes might be. I hope everyone that will be leaving this weekend had a very pleasant and enjoyable summer.

## COMMUNITY CENTER

1. Recommendation to ask FII to have FII lots abutting beaches 5, 6, & 12 merged with respective beaches.
2. Recommendation to have FII spend \$ 1,000 for the cost of materials to construct racks for canoes and kayaks for beaches 4,5,6, Recreation area on Leisure Lane, & 1 2: to construct bike racks for beaches 1,5,6, Recreation area on Leisure Lane; and to construct a storage area for beach 5.
3. Recommendation to have FTI budget or spend \$ 1,1 00 for picnic tables for beaches 1,3,4,6,7,12, and Recreation beach.
4. Recommendation to have FII budget or spend \$1,800 for a swing set and slide at Recreation Beach.
5. Recommendation to ask FII for \$6,000 for buoys and sign buoys at beaches 5,6,8, Long Beach, and recreation beach.
6. Recommendation to ask FII to spend \$ 1 00 for extra rubbish containers for the beaches.
7. Recommendation to ask the Town of Frye Island to clean up the debris at the beaches (mostly dead branches).
8. Recommendation to ask The Town of Frye Island to prune some of the branches and brush at the beaches and their parking areas during the fall of 2003 and spring of 2004. Beach committee will mark areas for pruning.
9. Recommendation to FII to reimburse the Town of Frye Island for the compensation of the employee if any Town employee is involved with the construction, during the winter of 2003/2004, of racks for canoes and kayaks.

A Yacht Club Membership meeting is scheduled for August 31st at 10am, at the Community Center. Yacht Club Members, in good standing, will elect members to the existing Marina Committee, to fill positions left by members who have resigned, and also to elect members to fill the positions of those whose one year term is up. The Marina Committee will continue to provide representation for equity rights cert. holders(owners), as well as annual renewable slip renters at both the marina and at quail circle. There will be a short meeting of the newly elected Marina Committee immediately following the election. At this time, the Marina Committee will elect a chairperson. Any Yacht Club Member who wishes to serve on the Marina Committee, may add his or her name as a write-in candidate onto the ballot at 10am. ## DIAL 9-1-1

### TIPS ON FIRE SAFETY

#### 1. SPACE HEATERS NEED SPACE

Keep portable space heaters at least three (3) feet from anything that can burn. Never leave a heater on when you are not at home or when you go to bed. Keep children and pets well away from space heaters. Do not place any clothing or other combustibles on a heater.

#### 1. PLAN AND PRACTICE TO ESCAPE

Even if you have lived in your home for 20 years or more, in a house fire you will not know where you are. The smoke is blinding and toxic and it will kill you long before the flames get to you. As a family, plan an escape route. Plan two ways out of each room. Choose a meeting place outside where everyone will gather. Practice your plan at least twice a year and make it realistic.

If fire breaks out in your home, you have to get out fast. Don't stop for anything. Do not try to rescue possessions or pets. Go directly to your meeting place and call the fire department (9-1-1) from a neighbor's house. Once you get out, stay out and don't re-enter the house. The heat and smoke of a fire are overpowering. If people are trapped, the firefighters have the best chance of rescuing them.

### KNOW WHERE YOU ARE LOCATED ON THE ISLAND

- During a fire or medical emergency, time is of the essence. You must know where you are so that fire, EMS and/or the police will be able to respond in a timely manner.
- **Dial 9-1-1.** If you use a cell phone, it will only delay public safety response time.
- State your location including the lot number and road name and any other pertinent information such as a nearby pertinent landmark.
- If you are renting property or have lived on the island for years, **you should know this information before an emergency occurs.** This should be a top priority when you come to Frye Island. Please make sure you know where you are located if the need arises.
- At nighttime, please help us to find you by turning on lights and meeting us on the roadway. It becomes extremely dark on the island and it may be very difficult to locate you.
- Stay where you are during a medical emergency. Medical personnel are responding to the location that you gave – if you change location (i.e. drive to the ferry landing) critical medical assistance may be delayed.


