Greetings everyone.

Absence: First, Nancy and I would like to thank everyone for their thoughts and prayers during my son's illness. As it turned out, he was suffering with Spinal Meningitis but he is now on the mend and is expected to recover fully.

Water Level: It's that time of year again when we have to start watching the lake level. The limit for larger vehicles is at elevation 263 feet. Once the level goes below 263 feet, some vehicles will not be allowed on the ferry. Please refer to the web site www.fryeisland.com to see the latest water level under the USGS survey. This site will give you the water levels for the current day as well as the past year.

Water System: We have submitted the application for the Drinking Water State Revolving Fund (DWSRF) loan. The request is for \$500,000.00 to purchase the equipment we need to increase the capacity of the system approximately two fold. We have also purchased all of the components we need to assemble and install the pressure reducing valves in the distribution system. One unit has been installed and the three remaining units will be installed next week. We will then shut down the blow off valves and adjust the system pressure. I realize it is late in the season but that may not be all bad if we have some problems, we will affect fewer people. I will keep you posted.

Accountant / Bookkeeper: We have hired a full time Bookkeeper/Accountant to take charge of the Town and FII books. His name is Calvin Nutting. Calvin lives on the Raymond Cape Road. He has a degree in accounting and has a great deal of experience in all aspects of accounting. The company in Portland where Calvin worked is consolidating their operation out of state so Calvin found himself out of work. In addition to the experience Calvin has in accounting, he has also served as a Selectman for the town of Casco for a number of years so he brings that municipal experience to the Island. Calvin will start on Monday. Please help us all welcome Calvin to the Island.

Brush Dump: The tub Grinder was at the brush dump Wednesday and Thursday. We created quite a pile of chips but as the operator stated, they are "dirty chips". There was a lot of dirt mixed in with the brush. There were also some stumps that were too large for the grinder. These will be disposed of. We will review this operation to determine future applications.

Monday Office Hours: As the season winds down, we will close the office Mondays from now on. Please arrange your schedules accordingly.

Community Center: Work has begun on the new lighting system for the meeting room at the Community Center. For that reason, some of the meetings have been moved from that room. The meetings Friday will be held in the Chapel area and the Teen Room if necessary. Saturday's BOS and FII meetings have been moved to the Fire Barn.

Police and Rescue Activity: The Police Officers continue to patrol the Island. Last week-end they issued 8 speeding tickets to contractors. If you are working with contractors, please remind them that the speed limit on the Island is 20 MPH.


