FII BOARD IMMEDIATELY FOLLOWING.....

Greetings everyone.

Weekend meetings: Both the Board of Selectmen / Executive Committee and the FII Board of Directors will hold meetings this Saturday. The Board of Selectmen / Executive Committee will start at 9:00 AM with the FII Board meeting immediately following. Both meetings will be held in the Administration Building. (We have heat in this building.)



Water Level: The water level is now at 263.24 ft. The heavy rain we had Wednesday actually increased the lake level a little. At an elevation of 263.0 ft we have to shut off all concrete trucks and gravel trucks and other large trucks. **CONTRACTORS:** Take note Don't get caught.

Docks: We have scheduled to have the docks removed from the Long Beach Marina on Saturday November 1st. Please plan to have your boats out of the Marina by then. The Marina Committee had asked that we wait to remove the docks so that boaters could keep their boats in the water until the last minute. Like everything else, it will depend some on the water level.

Power Outage: On Wednesday the heavy winds caused power outages throughout the State. I heard that at some point during the storm as many as 200,000 people were without power. On the Island we had localized outages. Power was out along most of Ridge Road and also along High Point in the Lancaster Loop area. The power was out for about 24 hours. If you were gone during the week and had refrigerated food you planned to use, you might be wise to check it well to make sure that it didn't spoil during the power outage.

Ferries: A comment was made at the Town Meeting about some contractors, and cement trucks specifically, not having to pay for the use of the ferry. This was said because there were no tickets passed to the mate which gave the impression that some contractors making deliveries to the Island were not paying their fair share. I want you to know that many of the tickets for contractors are purchased by their Island customers at the office and left in the ferry trailer "earmarked" for the appropriate contractor. When the contractor arrives with the delivery, the ticket transaction takes place in the trailer. This is a service that has been utilized by Islanders for many years I am told.

Managers Comments: This will be the last issue of the year for the "Managers Comments". I want to thank everyone for the help and support I have received all this year. I will be spending a lot of time this "off season" (I hate the thoughts of that cold and snowy "W" word) getting the policies organized and revised to reflect the needs of the Island and addressing the many comments and suggestions I received the summer. As different policies are reviewed, I will distribute them on our email distribution list for your review and comment. If you are not on the list send us your email address ... if you have changed your email address, send us your new one. I hope you all have a very safe off season. Enjoy the Holidays.

FRYE ISLAND FAMILY BOAT BUILDING IT'S ON FOR 2004 1

Because there was so much interest in the Boat Building Contest held this year in conjunction with the 2003 Children's Fair, an opportunity for families to enter a similar contest next year will be given.

The date selected for presenting the finished boats will be Saturday, July 4th

Families will pick up their materials the Saturday before, June 27th. That will give them a week to construct and try out their boats in the lake before the judging and race on July 10. Each family team, consisting of at least one child 16 or under, will be given the same materials for their building:

2 sheets of 1/4 inch lauan plywood, 4' x 8' 4 8 foot long 2 x 4's

1 pound 3 penny galvanized nails

4 tubes construction adhesive

No other materials may be used, other than paint or non-construction decorations

This year a new category will be added - sail boats. In this case cloth and rope can be used . Details on this later.

Hancock Lumber Company and Red Mill Lumber Company have again generously agreed to provide the materials for the boat building.

Every boat is a winner, in such categories as: most creative, most original, best construction, most amazing, sleekest, most attractive, best painted, fastest. A number of races will be held this year . These have not been finally determined yet, but may be races with just men in the family team, or just women, just children, a combination of ages, etc.
