Island Manger Comments

Memorial Day Weekend: This is the first major weekend of the season. I would like to welcome everyone to the Island for this special and very busy weekend. On Saturday morning at 9:00AM there will be a Public Hearing to discuss the proposal to transfer ownership of the Administration Building and the Commercial Land abutting this building, the Marina and Quail Circle, and the Golf Course from Frye Island Inc. to the Town. This hearing will be held at the Community Center. Also on Saturday morning representatives from SAD #6 will present the proposed SAD #6 budget. This hearing will be held at the Community Center at 11:00 AM. At 1:00 PM the Recreation Commission has scheduled their first meeting of the year, also at the Community Center. The Yacht Club Committee will hold their first meeting of the year at the Community Center at 10:00AM on Sunday morning. And, last but not least, the Selectmen / BIT Executive Committee and the FII Board of Directors will hold their meeting at the Community Center on Sunday evening at 7:00 PM.



At 11:00 AM. At 1:00 PM the Recreation Commission has scheduled their first meeting of the year, also at the Community Center. The Yacht Club Committee will hold their first meeting of the year at the Community Center at 10:00AM on Sunday morning. And, last but not least, the Selectmen / BIT Executive Committee and the FII Board of Directors will hold their meeting at the Community Center on Sunday evening at 7:00 PM.

Long Beach Marina & Quail Circle Canal: The fees for 2004 are as follows:

- Marina Equity Slips \$375.00
- Marina Rental \$900.00
- Quail Circle \$200.00

Just a reminder that slip fees must be paid this weekend. By policy, if rental slips fees are not paid by the close of business on Saturday, May 29th, the slip can be assigned to another person on the waiting list. If Equity slip fees are not paid, the slip can be placed in the “General Rental Slip Pool” with all rental fees going to the special revenue fund. Soooo please get your fees paid and avoid any problems.

Ferry Service: I would like to try to clarify the policy concerning the use of ferry tickets. Quite some time ago the policy was established that allowed Property owners, **in good standing**, and their families to purchase ferry tickets at a reduced rate. More recently, the policy was amended to allow house guests of property owners **in good standing** to use the reduced rate tickets as well. The ferry crews are trying to enforce this policy the best they can. Consequently, we generate a list in the office that is distributed to the ferry crews identifying the property owners that are not in good standing. Meaning, they have not paid their taxes or have some other outstanding debt to the Town. The ferry crews must ask your name when you arrive at the ferry to check the list. All the property owner, and all other family members, has to do is identify themselves and the lot number, and they will be allowed the discounted fare. If you are having house guests that are **not family members** we ask that you notify the ferry office at 655-4258 so that they will be expecting your guests. This is an attempt to protect your privilege as a property owner to get the discounted fare and curb some of the abuses.

Everyone associated with the ferry service is doing their best to enforce the policies and fee schedules that have been established for the operation of the ferry. I personally think they are doing a great job of it. If you have a complaint, don't take it out on them.... they are just performing their job. If you have compliments, please let them know. If you have complaints, come see me.

Taxes: Speaking of "In Good Standing" don't forget that the second half of the taxes are due JULY 1st. After that date property owners with outstanding taxes will be expected to pay the full fare to use the ferries.

Public Works: The public works crew has been working diligently to get and keep the roads in good condition, and to open all of the other amenities for your use. If we could only get Mother Nature to cooperate a little it would be helpful. They are trying to get the pool cleaned painted and filled, and will, as soon as the weather permits. We also had a "sink hole" develop at one of the tennis courts adjacent to the Community Center. We have notified the company that installed the tennis courts to get it repaired. Please keep off that court until the repair can be made.

The beaver lodge has been partially removed from Quail Circle, but the beaver(s) are still around. Right now they are making their presence know at the intersection of Birch Road and Leisure Lane. We have a culvert that crosses Leisure Lane to help drain the pond at this intersection. The beaver are now plugging this culvert with a very elaborate stick and mud mixture as fast as John and his crew can unplug it. With all the rain we have had it doesn't take very long for the water level to increase high enough to wash over the road. So use caution when driving in that area. John has spoken with the State Biologist and we are not allowed to trap them and remove them until the end of July. The PWD crew is going to try to build a screen around the end of the culvert to make it more difficult for the beavers to plug the end, but they (the beaver) are persistent critters. I'm sure no one is keeping score, but if we were, I would guess right now the score would be: **Beavers 2, PWD 0**. I'll keep you posted.

Code Enforcement Officer: Paul White has been appointed as the new CEO, replacing Bill Foye, who resigned at the end of last season. Bill will continue to serve as our Local Plumbing Inspector (LPI) until Paul completes his LPI certification. Paul will be available on Thursday and Friday this season. Bill will be available on Thursdays.

Elections: Elections for Town and FII officers will be held at the July 5th town meeting. The following vacancies will be on the ballot:

- **Selectman:** In accordance with the town charter, the Selectmen must be elected, at large, by the Voters of the Town. There are three selectmen; each elected to fill a three year term. These terms are staggered so that each year a Selectman's position becomes open. To be eligible to run for the Board of Selectmen, an individual must be a Town of Frye Island Voter and remain a voter throughout the term of office. All candidates interested in running for the open position of Selectman should give notice at least 14 days before the Annual Town Meeting so that the candidates name can appear on the Warrant. If you are interested please notify the town office no later than June 20th.
- **Board of Island Trustees:** We will be voting to fill one three year term at this year's Town meeting. To be eligible for this position, the candidate "must be a citizen of the United States, at least 18 years of age, and an owner of real property located within the Town of Frye Island with a fixed home currently occupied by the person". To be eligible to vote, an individual must meet the same qualifications.
- **Frye Island Inc, Board of Directors:** There are 9 one year terms on the Board elected each year at the Stockholders meeting held concurrently with the town meeting. To be eligible to run for this office, a candidate must be a stockholder (lot owner) in FII. Only stockholders are eligible to vote for the candidates.
- **Representative to School board on SAD #6:**

These are all very important positions in the operation of our Town. We have been extremely fortunate to have had many very qualified and dedicated people in these positions. Don't underestimate the commitment required to fill these positions. These are not "figure head" positions. They require a considerable amount of time and effort to execute them effectively. If you want to take on this challenge please let us know in the office as soon as possible and no later than June 20th so that we can post the candidates names in the FINS and on our web site. If you are not ready to run for elected office at this time, at least attend the meeting and vote for the candidates of your choice. I look forward to seeing you at the meeting.

Asset Transfer: Just a reminder about the Frye Island Incorporated proposal to transfer some of its assets to the Town at the July stockholders meeting. If you can't be at the meeting to vote in person, please be sure to forward the proxy ballot that was in the winter newsletter to the office. If you have misplaced it, you can stop by the office and get a ballot. This is a very important vote so please exercise your right to vote on these issues.

Fireworks: The fireworks display has been scheduled for Saturday July 3rd at the Long beach Marina. I have been delaying the commitment because we needed to get approval from the State Fire Marshal because of the new development in that area. However, he was here this week and gave us the green light so the fireworks display can proceed as usual. As usual, the cost of this is covered by donations so please help us continue this tradition by donating to this project.

Police Activity: This week we had a reported break in and theft from one of the homes on Ridge Road. This incident is under investigation.

We also had a report of a vehicle being damaged and towed from the Island. I didn't realize that towing companies notify local and or county police officers when they tow damaged vehicles to insure all of the necessary reports are filed. This incident is also being looked into.

Please drive responsibly this weekend.

As busy as this weekend will be with all of the meetings, Bar-B-Que's (weather permitting), and family gatherings, let us not forget that **Memorial Day** was originally established to honor the Men and Women who gave their lives while acquiring and defending the freedoms that we enjoy and all too often take for granted.

MSAD #6 TAXES

GREETINGS!

The recommended 2004-2005 school budget is only 4.29% over the current year budget, which was the same as that of the 2002-2003 school year. However, Frye Island's contribution is now \$729,081, which is an increase of 13.16% as compared to the current level. Why?

The Town of Frye Island is the fastest growing town, in terms of wealth, within MSAD #6 -- as determined by the State of Maine. (Congratulations!) Table A below shows how state valuations for 2004-2005 school year compare to the current school year. Frye Island managed to beat all other towns in terms of growth in valuations. (As I noted several times before, state valuations are not the same as local assessments.) By getting wealthier, percentage-wise, more than other four towns, we are rewarded by getting the largest increase, percentage-wise, in local allocations to the MSAD #6 budget – Table B.
