Island Manager Comments

Greetings Everyone: It looks as though we may get another nice weekend for weather. I hope you all get an opportunity to enjoy Frye Island this weekend.

Lake Level: The lake level continues to go down. The level on Thursday was at an elevation of 266.13 ft MSL which is down from a high of 266.79 ft MSL. This is about 7 ½ inches. I realize that a number of people are concerned because of the lack of beach front but at this point, there isn't much that we can do. I haven't heard any more on Sappi Fine Paper's application for a new license to operate the Eel Weir Dam, but when I do I will let you know.



Taxes, Taxes, Taxes: Don't forget, the second half of the property taxes are due JULY 1st. After that date property owners with outstanding taxes will be expected to pay the full fare to use the ferries. Reminder notices were sent to everyone last week.

Public Hearing: There will be a public hearing on Saturday, June 19th at 9:00 AM in the Community Center to present a proposed Transfer Station User Fee schedule. It is not the intent to implement these fees until the 2005 season but because of the implications it may have on budget preparations for 2005; we will be putting this on the July warrant. At the same time we will also have a public hearing for the Building Permit Ordinance.

Community Center: The dry wall application and taping in the meeting room has been completed and the painting has begun. We have also started the structural work around the fireplace. The damage caused by many years of water intrusion is substantial. When

the work in the meeting room is finished, we will start on the Teen Room where the damage may even be worse. When finished, we will have a new set of outside stairs from the upper level of the meeting room as well as stairs from the lower level as well.

Elections: Elections for Town and FII officers will be held at the July 3rd town meeting. The following vacancies will be on the ballot:

- **Selectman:** In accordance with the town charter, the Selectmen must be elected, at large, by the Voters of the Town. There are three selectmen; each elected to fill a three year term. These terms are staggered so that each year a Selectman's position becomes open. To be eligible to run for the Board of Selectmen, an individual must be a Town of Frye Island Voter and remain a voter throughout the term of office. All candidates interested in running for the open position of Selectman should give notice at least 14 days before the Annual Town Meeting so that the candidates name can appear on the Warrant. If you are interested please notify the town office no later than June 20th.
- **Board of Island Trustees:** We will be voting to fill one three year term at this year's Town meeting. To be eligible for this position, the candidate "must be a citizen of the United States, at least 18 years of age, and an owner of real property located within the Town of Frye Island with a fixed home currently occupied by the person". To be eligible to vote, an individual must meet the same qualifications.
- **Frye Island Inc, Board of Directors:** There are 9 one year terms on the Board elected each year at the Stockholders meeting held concurrently with the town meeting. To be eligible to run for this office, a candidate must be a stockholder (lot owner) in FII. Only stockholders are eligible to vote for the candidates.
- **Representative to School board on SAD #6:**

These are all very important positions in the operation of our Town. We have been extremely fortunate to have had many very qualified and dedicated people in these positions. Don't underestimate the commitment required to fill these positions. These are not "figure head" positions. They require a considerable amount of time and effort to execute them effectively. If you want to take on this challenge please let us know in the office as soon as possible and no later than June 20th so that we can post the candidates names in the FINS and on our web site. If you are not ready to run for elected office at this time, at least attend the meeting and vote for the candidates of your choice. I look forward to seeing you at the meeting. The candidates that have indicated an interest so far are as follows:

Help....Board Vacancies: We have openings on both the Planning Board and the Board of Appeals. Appointments will be made at the June 19th Selectman's meeting. We need interested people to fill these important board positions. If you are interested, please notify the office as soon as possible.

Primary Elections: I would like to thank the following people for their assistance last Tuesday at the Primary and Referendum elections: Grace Morin, Jim Kuiken, Oleg Svetlichny, and Nancy Fournier. These gracious people served as Ballot Clerks and Ballot Counters

Stuffers and Stickers: I would also like to thank Diane Babineau, Bobbie Aranyi , Bob & Jan Roberts for helping us stuff, stick, and stamp envelopes with the tax reminders and the second mailing of the proxy information. We would never have gotten them mailed without their help.

Asset Transfer: This is a very important vote for all property owners on Frye Island. If you haven't voted and will not be attending the July 3rd meeting where you can vote in person please stop by the office where you can complete the proxy ballot or complete the ballot at home and send it in to the office. We need everyone to participate in this vote.

I have received letters from concerned Islanders on both sides of this issue but I am not publishing any of them because of their length and questions concerning the factual content of the arguments. I will have copies in the office if anyone would like one.

Fire Works: The fire works have been scheduled for Saturday evening, July 3rd. We need everyone's help with donations to accomplish this. **Reminder:** This year like all others, we will have to move some of the boats out of the Marina for the fire works display. I will confirm the slip numbers but I believe it is from #66 on the beach side and #65 on the causeway side.

Water System: We continue to work with the State to get all of the documentation for the Water System upgrade in place. I have been told that the spec for the new Raw Water Pump is complete although I do not have it yet. We have secured Bond Counsel which is necessary as we proceed with the financing. He has already identified the fact that even though the Town voted in October to authorize the bond, the wording on the warrant article has to be very specific so we will have it on the warrant again at the July 3rd meeting. Next week we will be meeting with a representative from the Department of Human Services to finalize all of the paperwork. We plan to put the pump and control system out to bid as soon as we get the specification package.

Misunderstanding: I recently received a written complaint from a couple that was concerned that they couldn't pay for their boat slip rental by mail. This is not accurate. We will accept most payments, (slips, taxes, golf memberships, boat registrations etc) by mail. The only glitch is that we can not accept credit cards. All payments through the

mail need to be by check. Please call the office first to confirm the dollar amount to be paid.

Ferry Meeting: I would like to thank everyone that took time from their busy schedules to attend the meeting that I had last weekend. The two issues that were discussed the most were the ferry schedule, more accurately the elimination of the 1AM ferry, and the request to have property owners call in to let us know when house guests are expected. We are reviewing the ferry schedule for the remainder of the year and will announce any changes. The fact that we request you call in for your house guests is an attempt to enforce the policy that restricts the use of discount tickets to property owners, their families and their house guests. We are now in the process of reviewing the operating schedule, the fees and the policy for next year and will have another meeting in July or August to present the plan for next for comments. I will keep you posted.

Police Activity: We had another theft reported this week. An antique wooden boat was reported stolen from lot number 64. It was seen under the cottage when the Island opened and was missing last weekend. The police are investigating. I would like to ask all Islanders to help us help your neighbors by reporting what might look like suspicious activity. Kind of sounds like homeland security.

FRYE ISLAND FAMILY BOAT BUILDING 2004

We're looking forward to another fabulous (the 2nd annual one) Boat Building contest here on the Island!!! And the date has been set to mesh with other activities on the July 4th weekend. It will be SUNDAY JULY 4TH 1 to 4 P.M. at Recreation Beach

So it's time to gather the family clan and finalize your plans and send your entry form in.

Hancock Lumber company and Red Mill have generously offered to again provide the building materials. All together, there will be materials for 14 families to build boats.

These are the materials that each family will receive. These are the only materials that will be allowed to be used in the contest, other than paint or non-constructive decorations.

- 2 sheets of 1/4 inch lauan plywood, 4' x 8'
- 4 8 foot long 2 x 4's
- 1 pound 3 penny galvanized nails
- 4 tubes construction adhesive

You also may add cloth if you choose to make a sailboat.

The boat building is open to residents of Frye Island and their extended families. At least one of the boat builders must be a child 16 years of age or under. Supplies are to be picked up at the old Fire Barn at the ferry landing on Saturday, June 26 from 2 to 4 PM. This allows a week to build the boat and try it out in water, if desired, before the July 4th judging.

Judges will make awards for such things as best construction, seaworthiness, originality, most decorative, most patriotic, most unique, most amazing, most fun, sleekest, speediest, most historic, best over-all appearance, etc.

EVERY TEAM IS A WINNER ! ! ! ! !

This year there will be more races. Each family building team must have 2 of its members in the boat for each race. All drivers must be swimmers and wear life jackets. Contestants must use paddles, oars, etc. made from their materials supplied.

These are the races that may be held: for teams of 2 under the age of 16; family teams of 2 adult drivers; a race for all-female drivers; for all-male drivers; a race for 1 adult - 1 child. Other races may be added.

A deposit of \$30 will be required of each team when they register. \$5 of this fee will be used for certificate frames, pictures for contestants, etc.

The remaining \$25 will be returned to the registered contestants when they present their finished boat July 4. Registration forms available from Mary Deming at 655-4133 or at the F I office. June 18 deadline for registering. Materials will be given to the first 14 teams registering.
