Island Manager Comments

Greetings Everyone: Let’s all hope that Mother Nature cooperates and gives us a good weekend.

Taxes, Taxes, Taxes: Don’t forget to pay your taxes, lien notices will be sent out and recorded at the registry of deeds during the middle of August for all delinquent taxes.

Fire Works: The fire works were a great success again this year and would not be possible without everyone’s generosity. Since last weekend we collected another \$100.00. We are now only \$448.00 short so if you haven’t donated and you would like to, we will happily accept your contribution.

Meetings: There will be a Frye Island Inc. Board of Directors meeting this Friday at 7:00 PM at the Community Center.

There will be a BoS /EC meeting on Saturday July 24th, at 9:00AM at the Community Center. The Yacht Club Policy and the Golf Policy will be reviewed at this meeting.

Both of these meetings are open to all Islanders.



Public Works: The Public Works Department is preparing to treat the roads again for dust control. However, before this can be done it is necessary to grade the roads. The heavy rains have eroded some of the roads and have created a number of pot holes and consequently, we need to level the roads prior to the next application of calcium solution. Unfortunately, the only time this can be done is on the weekend. So, starting today and going through Sunday, watch out for the grader as you travel on the main roads of the island.

Ferry Service: Last Saturday we held an open meeting to discuss the ferry service. These discussions included the operating schedule, the user fee schedule and other aspects of the ferry service. Our intent was to get input from Frye Islanders as we begin working on next years schedule and next years budget. There were a few suggestions that we will evaluate. One was that we operate a 5:00 AM ferry on Monday mornings for those that wish to stay Sundays and leave early Monday morning. This would be through a reservation process and would cost the users. We would have to work out the details on this because it would primarily be a “one way” service. We don’t allow contractors over before 7:30 AM because of the quiet time policy. At this time, if you might be interested in this extra early ferry with a cost, please call and leave word at the office so that we might get a feel for the need.

Golf Cart Use: There have been a number of questions regarding the use of golf carts on Frye Island roads so I have included an excerpt from the Town ordinance for your information.

§ 105–4. Unsafe Use of Golf Carts Prohibited.

The following practices constitute unsafe use of golf carts on Town public roads:

- A. Use of a golf cart one half hour after sunset to one half hour before sunrise without headlights and rear lights installed and illuminated.
- B. Use of a golf cart without a rearview mirror.
- C. Use of a golf cart without a warning device such as a horn.
- D. Use of a golf cart with more than three people on any seat. In no case shall there be more people on any seat than the golf cart is designed to carry.
- E. Use of a golf cart with passengers riding on fenders, bumpers or in the location designed for the transportation of golf club bags.
- F. Use of a golf cart by a driver without a valid motor vehicle driving license unless the driver is fifteen years of age or older and: [October, 2000; [WA03](#); modified]
 - 1. Has successfully completed a golf cart safety course approved by the Town, or an ATV safety course approved by the State of Maine, or,
 - 2. There is a person with a valid motor vehicle driving license seated next to the driver.

- G. Operating a golf cart in violation of ordinances or regulations applicable to motor vehicles, except as expressly permitted by the article, or in a reckless manner in such a way as to recklessly create a substantial risk of serious bodily injury to another person.
- H. Operating a golf cart in a manner to endanger, so as to endanger any person or property.
- I. Operating a golf cart under the influence or with excessive blood-alcohol level. A person commits the crime of operating a golf cart while under the influence of intoxicating liquor or drugs if that person operates or attempts to operate a golf cart while under the influence of intoxicating liquor or drugs or a combination of liquor and drugs; or, for a person 21 years of age or older, while having alcohol levels in that person's blood; higher than the minimum requirements under TITLE 29-A, CHAPTER 19 for operation of motor vehicles, or, for a person less than 21 years of age, while having any amount of alcohol in the blood. Operating a golf cart while under the influence of intoxicating liquor or drugs is a Class D crime.
- J. Failure to comply with duty to submit. A person is guilty of failure to comply with the duty to submit to and complete a blood-alcohol or drug concentration test under TITLE 29-A, CHAPTER 23 of the Maine State Statutes, if that person refuses to submit to or fails to complete a blood-alcohol or drug concentration test or both, when requested to do so by a law enforcement officer who has probable cause to believe that the person operated or attempted to operate a golf cart while under the influence of intoxicating liquor or drugs.

Please drive golf carts safely and responsibly. Citations are being issued for unsafe operation.

Frye Island Transportation: At a recent meeting, traffic on the ferries and on island roads was discussed. I refer to this as Frye Island transportation because it not only involves the traffic on the ferry but it also includes all other existing and potential forms of transportation that the Island must address as we look to the future. We presently have approximately 425 seasonal homes on the Island, with the potential to reach 750. This will create a significant impact on an already stressed infrastructure. We are now operating the ferries at close to maximum. If we ever lost a ferry, due to mechanical failure or any other factor, it wouldn't be fatal to the island but it certainly would create a critical condition. Last year through July 8th we transported an average of 315 vehicles per day. This year, we have averaged 409 vehicles per day, an increase of 94 vehicles per day. It is hard to believe that this increased rate of usage will continue but it certainly means that we have to establish a plan to address this situation very soon. We have had suggested remedies that include a bridge from Raymond Cape to the island, a new barge type ferry like we presently operate, a passenger ferry and many others. As we review all of the potential solutions to the island transportation problems, we must look at how each one would impact other areas of the island as well. For example, as the traffic increases, how do we accommodate more vehicles on the very short access road on the mainland? If vehicles are forced to start lining up on the Raymond Cape Road we could be creating a very unsafe condition for vehicles approaching the access road. If this rate of increase

continues for very long, how will we handle the traffic on the Island? When will it become too much and unsafe? To address all of the transportation issues, we are going to establish a 7 member transportation planning committee. This committee will work with me and the BoS/BIT Executive Committee to generate an action plan to find and implement solutions to the challenges we are facing as we continue to grow. This is a very important effort that we have to commence immediately.

Police Activity: The past week was relatively quiet. We continue to get Golf Cart violations and have issued a number of citations and/or “fix-it” citations. Remember, if you have outstanding violations you can not be considered “in good standing” and will therefore be required to pay the non-resident user fee for the ferry.
