Island Manager Comments

Greetings Everyone:

Taxes, Taxes, Taxes: We are rapidly approaching the August 20th deadline when we will be sending lien notices to everyone who is delinquent. If you haven't paid your 2004 taxes, time is running out.

Meetings: There will be a meeting of the Frye Island Inc. Board of Directors meeting at 7:00 PM on Friday August 6th at the Community Center.

There will be a BoS /EC meeting on Sunday, August 8th, at 1:00 PM at the Community Center. These meetings are open to all Islanders.

In addition, the Selectmen / Board of Island Trustees executive Committee will be meeting on the first Friday of each month at 7:00 PM and on the third Saturday of each month at 9:00 AM at the Community Center. These meetings will continue throughout the summer.

Community Center: The structural work at the Community Center has been completed as has the remodeling in the meeting room. Everyone should be pleased with the results.



Community Center Tennis Courts: As you may know, we had some “sink holes” in the tennis court that we had to repair. This repair work was completed by the Public Works Department. Vermont Tennis Company was then contracted to shim the patches and repaint the surface. When they came, earlier this week, there was another sink hole. Even though the hole in the surface doesn’t look too large, the eroded area under the pavement appears to be substantial. We will have to check this to see if it is worth trying to patch this new hole or if the whole court needs to be rebuilt. Unfortunately, it probably won’t be completed this summer.

Ferry Service: This morning one of the ferries had a fuel line break requiring repair. As usual, it occurred at 8:00 AM when a number of people were trying to get off island. The ferry was returning to the mainland with a load of vehicles following the 7:30 AM run when the failure occurred which complicated things a little but I would like to thank all of the people that got caught in the delay for their patience. I would also like to thank everyone on the ferry for pitching in to get the ferries moving and the repairs made as quickly as they did.

Emergency Management Plan: We are still in need of a volunteer to take over the Emergency Plan from Fritz. It is important that we get a replacement while Fritz is still on the Island this summer. If you are interested in assuming this very important position please call the office.

Police Activity: To update you on our progress in last weeks theft of signs around the Island, we have spoken with the District Attorney and because this is a felony a Grand Jury has to be convened. This should happen in the next couple of weeks. If the Grand Jury feels that there is enough evidence to convict, a warrant will be issued for the suspects’ arrest.



We Frye Islanders have great affection for Vic; the Frye Island we now enjoy is a result of his steady hand, dedication, and vision -- and it is in this spirit that a memorial is being planned in his honor. Plans are underway to acquire a granite bench, which will be placed in "Vic's Garden" on the right-hand side of the ferry landing -- a spot that Vic planned, purchased, and planted while he was our Town Manager. This seems an appropriate site, as Vic's wife Janet, has reminisced how much Vic enjoyed being near the lake and loved the view from his office window.

WINDHAM ROTARY SPONSORS SEBAGO LAKE BOAT POKER PARTY

On Saturday August 7, the Windham Rotary is sponsoring the first Sebago Lake Poker Party as a fund raiser for worthwhile causes such as: Camp Sunshine, The Maine Children Cancer Society, The Maine Inland Fisheries and Wildlife Department, The Windham D.A.R.E. Program, The Sebago Lake Anglers Association and the Rotary International Student Exchange.

Program: The rules are explained on small yellow cards located on the Frye Island bulletin board and on web site www.sebagolakepokerparty.com. All you need is a boat and the desire to have a good time. It is not a boat race. The game begins at 11 AM Saturday, a mandatory safety brief will be held for participants at the Jordan Bay Marina at 10 AM.

The object of the game is to follow the clues provided at clue nodes around the lake and assemble a winning poker hand - high or low. A small booklet will provide initial information that will lead you to clues that lead you to 5 card locations on the lake. If you follow the clues successfully you will have 5 cards for each of your hands. At your option, you may purchase clues leading to 3 additional cards for a possible total of 8 cards per hand (you play your 5 best cards). The clues cost \$10 each. The Rotary will crown the Poker Party Winner at a party beginning at 4:00 PM in Cub Cove, near Point Sebago, at a private residence where there will be live music, the poker showdown and prizes for winners. Food will be available to purchase, there will be a porta potty and taxi boats to take players to and from their boats. The party will wrap up by dusk, approximately 7:30 to 8:00 PM.

BIRD WATCHING & NATURE WALK



We have just begun the second ½ of high season so we want to offer a reminder and clarify the schedule for August. First the schedule:

So as you can see there is usually no need to panic or be rude should you miss the boat, there is usually another one right around the bend! Also the night captains are expected to go to a 15 minute schedule from their usual ½ hr. schedule whenever there is excess of 4 cars in line departing on the closest quarter hour. We are doing everything we can to make sure traffic moves as quickly **AND SAFELY** as possible. Safety is a priority for us and with that in mind, please have your window down and be ready for direction from the Captain as to where they want you loaded on the boat. Even if you have lived on the island for 30 years, you do not have any say about where you will be loaded, that is the Captain's call. The Captain is the only & final authority on a vessel and can deny passage to anyone who appears to be a hazard (driving to endanger, drunk, disorderly, speeding onto the boat). We had a pickup truck driver from Mass. this week, speed onto the boat ignoring the Captain & Mate. The Captain asked him politely to slow down next time - and before she could finish was cut off by the driver who let her know that he had been doing this for 25 years, longer than she'd been alive and that he knew what he was doing. This is not the first or even second time that this has taken place. Please be alert and follow directions so we can all have a safe August.


