Island Manager Comments

Greetings Everyone:

Water System: The phase one water system upgrades are finally out to bid. The bids will be opened on Tuesday August 17th. Hopefully we will be able to get started on the construction phase shortly after. The first phase includes a new and larger raw water pump to pump water from the lake to our water treatment system. This phase will also include the construction of a new water treatment building which will be located adjacent to the existing maintenance building. This building will house our filtration equipment, which will be doubled in size, new and larger treated water pumps, all new control and water quality monitoring equipment and the beginning of a new 8” distribution header to replace the old 2” plastic pipe. We will not be able to replace much of the piping in this phase but we will be reconfiguring the maze of piping and valves around the maintenance building and running the new header to High Point Road.

Ferry Haul Out: The engineering company that designed the haul out facility has now designed roller assemblies which will be attached to the carriage. You may know that we have had a great deal of difficulty getting the carriage to slide down the rails. These rollers should make this process much easier. The roller assemblies are being fabricated now and are supposed to be ready around the last week in August. I have also scheduled the contractor to attach the roller assemblies to the carriage as soon as they are ready.



Once that is done, we plan to pull one of the ferries so that we can paint the bottom. We had surveys done last year on the hulls and it was determined that we should prepare and paint them. We made plans to have it done last fall but the weather didn't cooperate. The temperature has to be above 50°F so the paint will cure properly. You may remember that we had a freeze again last year before we were able to get the Island closed. Therefore, we are considering pulling one of the ferries in September to get the painting done. I will keep you posted as that time approaches and the plans become more firm.

Budget: We are approaching that time of year again when the budget for 2005 has to be prepared and presented to the tax payers. This will happen on Labor Day weekend, which believe it or not is right around the corner. A rough draft has been sent to the Board of Island Trustees Executive Committee for their review. In accordance with our charter, the BIT Executive Committee is responsible for the preparation of the budget. During the next couple of weeks we will hammer out a version to present to the tax payers.



I hope your Friday the thirteenth is an uneventful one. Please drive safely and have a **great** week!



We have been very fortunate this year to have so much new talent join our ferry family, we have more new faces in the wings for next year and all are dedicated to giving the Islanders great service.

Kudos go to our mate Michelle, who saved a drowning dog at the store docks. The dog had apparently been tied in a boat and jumped out, slipped his collar, fell into the water between the boat – docks and then got under the dock where he began to drown. Michelle ran off the docked ferry and saved the dog, returned it to an indignant owner who left without so much as a thank you. **We** were very proud of her actions!

FYI#1: On Friday mornings there is only one boat in operation until noon. We schedule maintenance on those mornings (oil changes, etc.) so as not to disrupt a regular schedule.

FYI#2: There is parking allowed on both sides of the access road as long as all tires are OFF THE TAR by a foot. There is NO PARKING in the lot beside the ferry trailer as it is for employees only – all others are towed at owners expense.

Fun Ferry Fact: As of Monday, August 9th, we have transported 4,532 vehicles with a year to date total of 39,383.


