Island Manager Comments

Greetings Everyone:

Water System: We received three bids for the first phase of the water system upgrades. Quite frankly, they were within the budget but higher than the engineers' estimate. The low bidder was Zachau Construction Co., the same company that did the repairs on the Administration Building and the Community Center. We will be meeting with their representative next week to review all phases of their bid to see if there are any areas where we can reduce the costs.



Ferry Haul Out: We are still on schedule for the installation of the roller assemblies for the carriage on the haul-out facility. I will be meeting with the installation contractor, Bancroft Contractors, next Tuesday to review the project to insure he will be ready as soon as we get the roller assemblies. We are still expecting to receive the assemblies from the fabricator, Coastal Equipment Co., sometime during the last week of August. Once the rollers are installed, we plan to pull one of the ferries for painting. This project is to do the hull from the water line down only. We are experiencing a little difficulty getting a painting contractor to come to the Island but we are working with the supplier of the painting products to find one. If we don't, the representative from Pettit Paint will supervise some of our employees to apply the coatings. This is a four step process.

Budget: We are approaching that time of year again when the budget for 2005 has to be presented to the tax payers. This will happen on Labor Day weekend, which believe it or not is right around the corner. A draft has been sent to the Board of Island Trustees Executive Committee for their review. In accordance with our charter, the BIT Executive Committee is responsible for the preparation of the budget. During the next couple of weeks we will hammer out a version to present to the tax payers.

Ferry Issues: I have been asked a number of times about some of the restrictions we have on the ferry. Why do we shut down construction vehicles at a lake level of 263 feet? What are the true weight limits on the ferry? Why do we limit the dump trucks to 7 yards of product, etc? I have always said that it is the way we have always done it but I don't have a sound basis for these restrictions so I am working with the people that made the ferries and our own people to try to get some of these answers. I am not saying anything will change but hopefully the next time someone asks, I will have a good answer and a good reason.

Hurricane Charley: Many of our summer residents have winter homes in the Punta Gorda area of Florida which was ravaged last week by Hurricane Charley. I know some have returned to Florida to make repairs, while others were a little luckier and survived with little damage. Our thoughts and best wishes go out to all that were in the path of the storm.

Meetings: The Board of Selectmen / Executive Committee will hold a meeting and a public hearing on Saturday August 21st at 9:00 AM at the Community Center. The public hearing will be to discuss the following:

Charter Amendments:

1. Eligibility for membership in BIT
2. BIT Chairpersons responsibility
3. Remove ATV's from use on Frye Island

The FII Board of Directors will have a directors meeting on Thursday evening, August 26th, at 7:00 PM in the Community Center.

Police and Rescue Activity: We had a belated report, from a witness, about a golf cart accident. The report indicated that the driver was intoxicated. Unfortunately, by the time that the police officer was notified it was too late to bring charges. Fortunately, no one was injured.....This time.






