Island Manager Comments

Greetings Everyone:

Water System: We have met with the low bidder, Zachau Construction, once and plan to meet again on Monday to sign the construction contract. We anticipate that work will begin on the project during the week after Labor Day.

Ferry Haul Out: I met with the company that will be installing the roller assemblies on the carriage last Tuesday. They are set to begin the installation as soon as the rollers are available from the fabricator. We expect this to be towards the end of next week.

Budget: I have met with the Budget Committee and will be working on some revisions that were discussed. One area that gathered a significant amount of comment was the Ferry System budget. The budget for the ferry is very dependent upon the level of service provided. Consequently, the schedule will be discussed when the budget is presented to the public on Saturday September, 3rd. The school budget for 2005 is anticipated to increase approximately \$93,000 which will add \$1.23 to our tax rate by itself. If you would like input into the budget process, please attend the meeting on Saturday. This is the first meeting and we are still in the development stage so your input is important.



Ferry Issues: Last week I asked about the reason for some of the restrictions on the ferries. Well, I got some answers from one of our seasoned ferry captains, Rob Hawley, complete with buoyancy formulas. Thanks Rob. I am still waiting on some information from the Blount Marine and we will be taking some soundings (nautical talk for getting the depth of the water) in Rubbs Cove to determine how much water we have under the ferries in different locations in the cove on the mainland. Once this information is complete, I will share it with everyone.

Meetings: The Board of Selectmen / Executive Committee will hold a meeting and a public hearing next Friday evening September 3rd at 7:00 PM at the Community Center. The public hearing will again discuss the following:

PROPOSED CHANGES TO THE TOWN OF FRYE ISLAND CHARTER

Article VI. Town Boards and Committees

Section 1: Board of Island Trustees. In accordance with the powers given to municipalities under 30-A M.R.S.A. chapter 111 and the Constitution of Maine, Article VIII, Part Second, a Board of Island Trustees is established.

Eligibility for Membership: He or she must be a citizen of the United States, at least 18 years of age, and an owner or a spouse of an owner of real property located within the Town of Frye Island with a fixed home currently occupied by the person, maximum two people per fixed home.

Other Meetings: The Board of Island Trustees shall meet immediately preceding any Special Town Meeting called in accordance with Article II, Section 1 of this Charter. The Chairman of the Executive Committee of the Board of Island Trustees or his or her designee shall preside at all Board of Island Trustees' meetings.

Section 3: Use of Golf Carts. Use of golf carts on the Island roads is expressly permitted. The Planning Board will be responsible to maintain a set of ordinances defining what vehicles are allowed, and what local registration and usage requirements are in order to provide for the safety of the people on the island.

If you would like input into these proposed charter changes, please attend this public hearing.

Transportation Committee: I received a number of volunteers for this committee. The task of choosing seven was difficult but I tried to get a good cross section of Islanders; some new Islanders, some who have been here longer, with varied professional backgrounds. We have called this the Transportation Committee but in truth it will encompass much more. It is obvious that the ferry service is critical to the Island and we must concentrate on maintaining and improving this service but just concentrating on this part of our infrastructure will be insufficient.

This committee will study the demographics of the Island and attempt to determine what the Island population will look like in 5, 10, 15+ years and what transportation services will be required to accommodate this population in the future. I am sure that the information identified by this committee will be extremely valuable as we assess other aspects of future life on the Island. The committee members are:

We are rapidly approaching the end of high season and once again our Captains and Mates have done a magnificent job of safely transporting an unbelievable quantity of vehicles. We have, as of 8/24, taken 11,889 vehicles to and from the Island with no accidents / incidents. We have transported 46,740 vehicles since April 29th with only 2 minor incidents. Many people have the misguided idea that these boats are easy to pilot and that our loads are generally 3 neat rows of cars. You'd be wrong on both accounts. Most of our loads, particularly during the weekdays are large construction vehicles which not only impair the Captains visual field, but act much like a sail when the wind blows making docking a challenge, throw in white caps and swells (to add a little danger to the mix) and you'll find our Captains and Mates courageously and consistently rising to the challenge and getting you safely to your destinations. Please remember to say thank you to these men and women who have worked so hard for your benefit all summer in the heat and rain as you leave the Island to return to school, etc..




Emily LaMarre
