Island Manager Comments

Greetings Everyone:

Water System: We have signed the contract with Zachau Construction Co. for the first phase of the water system. This phase includes constructing a new building dedicated to the water treatment process, relocating the filtration equipment to the new building, replacing the treated water pumps with larger ones, adding required monitoring equipment, and replacing and reconfiguring all of the piping in the maintenance yard to increase the capacity. We will also be replacing one of the Raw Water pumps. The new pump will have a capacity sufficient to supply the whole system as we continue to grow. One of the existing pumps will be retained as a spare. We hope to get as much of this work done this year as the weather will permit.



Budget: The first draft of the budget has been prepared and will be presented to the Islanders on Saturday September 4th at 9:00 am. The presentation will be in the Community Center, probably in the Chapel because the meeting room will be set-up for the dinner / dance. This year the tax rate is \$16.07 per one thousand dollars of assessed property value. Of this \$16.07, approximately \$7.67 provided for municipal services while \$8.40 was for non-municipal (school & county) obligations. The draft budget that will be presented has an increase of approximately \$1.96 per \$1000.00 of assessed value. Twenty seven cents (.27) of this is because of municipal spending; primarily for increases in ferry services, office services and PWD services. One dollar and sixty-nine cents (\$1.69) can be attributed to increases in School and county taxes. If you would like input into the budget process, please attend the meeting on Saturday. Remember, this is the draft budget and we are still in the development phase so your input is important.

Ferry Issues: Last summer we had Associated Marine Surveyors do an ultrasonic survey on the ferry hulls. This survey was to determine the thickness of the steel to insure the ferries are still structurally safe. The results indicated that there was some overall pitting of the steel, but for their age, they were in pretty good condition. However, they did recommend that we paint the hulls which we did try to do last year but were unable to because of the weather. We have now made plans to paint the hull on one of the ferries this September. It is imperative that we get one of them done this fall. The painting process requires the application of 7 coats. Hopefully the ferry traffic will be less after Labor Day and the impact on the ferry traffic won't be too bad. Please bear with us as we operate with one ferry while the painting is in process.

We also had Associated Marine Surveyors perform a safety inspection on our ferries. We do not have the written report yet but in general they thought the ferries were in pretty good shape and the operation was conducted safely. We may want to replace the anchors with heavier ones, stencil the personal flotation devices and a few other relatively minor items. They also recommended that we generate written operating and emergency procedures which we had already made plans to do this winter. I asked this company to do this survey so we could get an independent review of our safety equipment and practices.

Meetings: The Board of Selectmen / Executive Committee will hold a meeting and a public hearing Friday evening September 3rd at 7:00 PM at the Community Center. The public hearing will be to discuss the following:

PROPOSED CHANGES TO THE TOWN OF FRYE ISLAND CHARTER

Article VI. Town Boards and Committees

Section 1. Board of Island Trustees. In accordance with the powers given to municipalities under 30-A M.R.S.A. chapter 111 and the Constitution of Maine, Article VIII, Part Second, a Board of Island Trustees is established.

Eligibility for Membership: He or she must be a citizen of the United States, at least 18 years of age, and an owner or a spouse of an owner of real property located within the Town of Frye Island with a fixed home currently occupied by the person, maximum two people per fixed home.

Other Meetings: The Board of Island Trustees shall meet immediately preceding any Special Town Meeting called in accordance with Article II, Section 1 of this Charter. The Chairman of the Executive Committee of the Board of Island Trustees or his or her designee shall preside at all Board of Island Trustees' meetings.

Section 3. Use of Golf Carts. Use of golf carts on the Island roads is expressly permitted. The Planning Board will be responsible to maintain a set of ordinances defining what vehicles are allowed, and what local registration and usage requirements are in order to provide for the safety of the people on the island.

If you would like input into these proposed charter changes, please attend this public hearing.

Michelle Shepard




