Island Manager Comments

Greetings Everyone:

Water System: Construction has begun on the new water treatment building adjacent to the maintenance building. In addition, we have received three quotes for the new raw water pump which will be located at the east pump house. Approval for this will be discussed at the next BoS / Executive meeting.

Budget: The first draft of the budget was presented to the Islanders on Saturday September 4th. There were approximately 25 people that attended the meeting and I think there were some very good questions and suggestions on the appropriations proposed. The draft budget that was presented has an increase of approximately \$1.96 per \$1000.00 of assessed value. Twenty seven cents (.27) of this is because of municipal spending. One dollar and sixty-nine cents (\$1.69) can be attributed to increases in school and county taxes. An Islander reviewed the 2004 Grand List and determined that the average assessed value of a waterfront lot and home is \$254,944 and an inland lot and home is \$113,589. Based on those assessed values, the proposed budget would result in an increase of \$502 for waterfront property and \$224 for an interior property. If you would like input into the budget process, please attend the next meeting on Saturday September 18th 9:00 am at the Community Center. Remember, the 2005 budget is still in the development phase so your input is important.



Ferry Issues: We are in hopes that the new rollers will be installed this week. This project was scheduled for Tuesday Sept 7th but the roller assemblies were not ready. Now we are told that it will be this Friday. As soon as the installation is complete, we will pull a ferry to confirm the modifications are effective. Once this has been done, we will pull one of the ferries for painting the hull.

Meetings: The Board of Selectmen / Executive Committee will hold a meeting on Saturday September 18th at 9:00 AM at the Community Center.

The Frye Island Board of Directors will meet on Friday evening, September 17th at 8:00 PM at the Community Center.

Town Meeting (10-09-04): The following charter amendments will be proposed at the October town meeting October 10th 9:00 am at Community Center.

Article VI. Town Boards and Committees

Section 1. Board of Island Trustees. In accordance with the powers given to municipalities under 30-A M.R.S.A. chapter 111 and the Constitution of Maine, Article VIII, Part Second, a Board of Island Trustees is established.

1. Eligibility for Membership: He or she must be a citizen of the United States, at least 18 years of age, and an owner *or a spouse of an owner* of real property located within the Town of Frye Island with a fixed home currently occupied by the person, maximum two people per fixed home.
2. Other Meetings: The Board of Island Trustees shall meet immediately preceding any Special Town Meeting called in accordance with Article II, Section 1 of this Charter. The Chairman of the Executive Committee of the Board of Island Trustees *or his or her designee* shall preside at all Board of Island Trustees' meetings.
3. Section 3. Use of Golf Carts. Use of golf carts on the Island roads is expressly permitted. The Planning Board will be responsible to maintain a set of ordinances defining what vehicles are allowed, and what local registration and usage requirements are in order to provide for the safety of the people on the island.

In addition, the Panning Board will be proposing a change to the Golf Cart ordinances that requires all drivers have a valid drivers license. Maine state law requires that everyone that drives a golf cart on Island roads have a valid drivers license. This ordinance change gets us into compliance with Maine law.

Police / EMS: Our records indicate that we have had 5 calls to Raymond rescue this summer.

- July 17th Raymond rescue was called for a gentleman with a lacerated foot. This call was handled by the Frye Island Fire Dept and Raymond Rescue was cancelled.
- Aug. 16th Raymond Rescue was called to the Frye's Leap Store / Café for a female employee that had suffered multiple lacerations caused by going through a glass door. The patient was transported to Maine Medical Center by Raymond Rescue.
- Aug 28th Raymond Rescue called to the Frye's Leap Store / Café when a female employee had difficulty breathing. She was transported to Bridgton Hospital by Raymond Rescue.
- Sept 4th Raymond Rescue called to the Frye's Leap Store / Café when a male visitor slipped and suffered a broken arm. He was transported to Maine Medical Center by Raymond Rescue.
- Sept 5th Raymond Rescue was called when an 80 year old woman fell and suffered a possible fractured hip. She was transported to Mercy Hospital by Raymond Rescue.

On behalf of the band and myself, I would like to thank all who were involved with the Dinner / Dance last Saturday for helping to make the event so successful.


