**Island Manager Comments**

**Manager Comments:**

**Greetings:** It looks as though we are going to have some more good weather this weekend. I hope everyone gets an opportunity to enjoy Frye Island this weekend.

**Long Beach Marina & Quail Circle Canal:** We have had some changes in the slip assignments because some people decided not to pay the appropriate fees and therefore the slips have been reassigned. We now have 6 available slips at the Marina. If you would like a slip for the season please contact the office. Quail Circle is full and we have a number of people on the waiting list for that area. The updated slip assignments are now posted.

**Willis Property:** At the Special Town Meeting held last Saturday the Board of Island Trustees and the registered voters of Frye Island voted to purchase the property on the mainland owned by the Willis family. I have spoken with our attorney to initiate the title work and the bank to initiate the interim financing. I will keep you posted as we progress. Our goal is to close on or before the June 17<sup>th</sup>.



**Election of officers:** During the annual July town meeting, one responsibility of the voters is to elect municipal officers (i.e. Selectmen) and Board of Island Trustee representatives to the Executive Committee. This year, however, the election of municipal officers will be unique in that we will be voting on candidates for all three selectmen's positions and 2 of the 4 Board of Island Trustee representatives to the Executive Committee. Many times I have heard concerns about how the Town's affairs are managed. This is your chance to make a difference by running for one of these vacant positions. I have included excerpts from the Charter that pertain to these officials.

**Section 1. Composition, Eligibility, Election.** There shall be a Board of Selectmen of three members nominated and elected at large by the Voters of the Town. The eligibility for service on the Board of Selectmen shall be limited to Town of Frye Island Voters who shall remain a Voter during such service. No more than one person from an immediate family shall serve on the Board of Selectmen. Election to the Board of Selectmen shall be filled by election using written ballot at the Annual Town Meeting; all positions can be listed on a single ballot. Candidates should give notice at least 14 days before the Annual Town Meeting (allowing a candidate's name to be included on the Warrant). The winner of the election shall be the individual with the largest number of votes; no majority of votes cast is required for election; in the case of a tie, the individuals involved with the tie will be asked if one or more will withdraw to eliminate the tie, otherwise, another election will be held as soon as possible. No absentee ballots will be permitted.

**Board of Island Trustees Eligibility for Membership.** He or she must be a citizen of the United States, at least 18 years of age, and an owner or a spouse of an owner of real property located within the Town of Frye Island with a fixed home currently occupied by the person, maximum two people per fixed home.

**Executive Committee.** Executive Committee of the Board of Island Trustees (referred to as Executive Committee in this Charter) shall be composed of seven members; the three Selectmen are automatic members and the other four are elected by the Board of Island Trustees. The Executive Committee shall elect from its members a Chairman, a Secretary and any other positions it deems necessary. Elections to the Executive Committee shall be for staggered three year terms by written ballot. Each position with a different term shall be a separate position so indicated at the time of the election; multiple positions can be on a single ballot. The winner of the election shall be the individual with the largest number of votes; no majority of votes cast is needed for election; in the case of a tie, the individuals involved with the tie will be asked if one or more will withdraw to eliminate the tie; otherwise, another election will be held as soon as possible. Candidates shall give notice to the Town Office at least 14 days before the Annual Meeting of the Board of Island Trustees or nominations can be made from the floor at that Annual Meeting.

The following positions will be open at this year's election:

- Selectman – one-one year term
- Selectman – one-two year term
- Selectman – one three year term
- BIT/EC representative – two three year terms

If you are interested in running for any of these positions please submit a short, one paragraph biography to the office. I would like to publish this information in upcoming FINS so that Island voters will get some information on the Candidates before the elections.

**Taxes:** Just a reminder that the second half of the 2005 tax payments are due on June 30<sup>th</sup>.

**Police Activity:** Quiet week, lets all hope that it remains this way.

**RESIDENCY AND MAINE'S INCOME TAX**

Many Islanders who have a home in another state have difficulty understanding how becoming a voter on Frye Island will affect their tax responsibilities in Maine. There is a document prepared by the State of Maine Revenue Services group that is intended to help you understand the difference between "resident" and "nonresident" for tax purposes. A copy of that document can be found on the Frye Island website. Look under the pull-down menu "Find Information", then "Topic Index", and then "Maine Residency Status" on the Index of Contents page. It is possible for a person to have their primary domicile in another state, not be required to pay any Maine income taxes, and to become a Town of Frye Island Voter. Check out this information to see if you can become a Town Voter.

## VOTING

The Polls will be open on Tuesday, June 14<sup>th</sup> (10:00 am – 8:00 pm) at the Community Center for Town of Frye Island registered voters to vote on the MSAD6 budget.

### MAKING SENSE OUT OF BUDGET REFERENDUM ARTICLES

Frye Island's contribution to school tax in 2005-06 is only \$6,637.47 (0.91%) larger than that in the current year school tax. This should be good news to all islanders. (In 2004-05, the increase was 13.16%, or \$84,809 dollars!) This substantial relief is a result of applying new formula for state aid to education, known as Essential Programs and Services or EPS. The total 2005-06 MSAD6 budget is \$35,642,125. State contributes \$17,309,006 of this total, which is \$2,845,313 more than in the current year budget. You will be voting on this budget in terms of several separate articles. (State bureaucracy prescribes the wording of these articles using language that does not make much sense to most of us.) Article 2 means that if we want to receive full amount of state aid, we must raise through school tax the sum of \$12,968,613. Article 3 states that the annual payments on previously issued bonds add up to \$515,922. (I do not understand the need for having this article. How can anyone say "No" to the obligation of repaying debt? It's like saying "No" to your home mortgage - It would not work!). In 2005-06, EPS aid to education is not at its final goal (by year 2009) of contributing 55% of cost of education -- it is only 84% of the 55%. Therefore, taxpayers must contribute the difference. This is the prime reason for \$3,848,584 of additional tax in Article 4. Adding the three tax components (\$12,968,613 + \$515,922 + \$3,848,584) gives us the total of \$17,333,119 for 2005-06 school tax. This tax is allocated to five towns in accordance with the state valuation of each town. Since Frye Island valuation is 4.22% of the total valuation, Frye Island school tax is 4.22%, or \$735,718, of the total tax. (In the current school year, Frye Island portion is \$729,081.) Articles 5 (authorization to spend funds) and Article 6 (Adult Education) are straightforward. Article 7 authorizes District to receive and expend other funds, such as grants. Thus, Article 7 does not add a penny to tax. I really do not understand why anyone would vote "No" on Article 7. If Narragansett One Foundation wants to give MSAD6 a grant for this or that program (they do it each year) why anyone would object to that? I am hopeful that this might help you to make a more informed decision in the voting booth on June 14. As a final note, Frye Island state valuation grows at a faster rate compared to rates of other towns because people are willing to pay high prices for water front properties!

## **BOAT BUILDING and RACING CONTEST**

For the 3<sup>rd</sup> year in a row, Frye Island families will have a chance to show their boat designing, building and racing skills when they enter the 3rd of July contest at Recreation Beach.

Open to residents of Frye Island and their extended families – at least one of the boat builders must be a child 16 years of age or under.

Hancock Lumber and Red Mill are among the lumber companies who will provide the materials. Each team will receive the same materials:

- 2 sheets of ¼ inch lauan plywood, 4' x 2'
- 4 8 foot long 2 x 4's
- 1 pound 3 penny galvanized nails
- 4 tubes construction adhesive

Only these materials can be used to build the boat. Your own paint or decorations (or cloth if you make a sailboat) may be added.

Teams may pick up their supplies on the Island on Saturday, June 25 at the old firebarn next to the Post Office. The finished boats will be judged July 3 and families will race their boats after the judging. Judges will make awards for such things as best construction, originality, painting, creativity, sleekness, patriotism, etc. Every team is a winner!!!!

Transfer Station**

In order to insure we comply with “*Universal Waste Disposal Procedure*” – we must control access to the Transfer Station. Starting this season the Transfer Station gates will be fully closed and locked when the Transfer Station is not attended. If you are inside the Transfer Station when the gates are locked and the attendant is not present you are TRESSPASSING. Also if you leave trash or other items in front of the gate or over the gate you are LITTERING (of which, if caught is a minimal fine of \$100.00).

Fees will be charged for some items. Bagged household trash and sorted recyclables may be deposited at no charge. To deposit all other items you must display a current resident sticker on the vehicle transporting the disposable items to the transfer station. Only property owners in good standing will be issued these stickers.

All fees and operating rules were approved by the 2004 October Town Meeting after several public hearings. A disposal fee must be paid for these items before they can be off-loaded at the transfer station. As a reminder, the approved fee schedule has been printed with this news. Transfer station hours of operation are as follows.

Low season operating hours;

Saturdays 10am to 3pm

Sundays 12 noon to 5pm

Holiday weekends, closed Sundays, open Monday, 8am to 12 noon

If you need access to the Transfer Station Monday through Friday (between 8am to 3pm) Please call the Public Works Garage at 655-7493 or the office at 655-4551 for an appointment. (Advance notice is greatly appreciated.) We will need your name and island phone number.
