Island Manager Comments

Greetings: Summer is here, the sun has finally peeked through the clouds and the temperature is going up. Things are getting better.

Ferry Service: We had a number of issues arise this past week that should be mentioned:

1. A number of people arrived at the Island ferry terminal Sunday evening only to get in a line of 20 to 30 vehicles. Then many took out their frustrations on the ferry crews. First, the ferry crews do not set the operating schedules. So to lambaste them for scheduling issues is wrong and uncalled for. They are only trying to operate the ferry service as fairly and consistently as they can based on the operating schedule given to them. On Sunday evenings during the pre & post seasons the second ferry is scheduled to shut down at 6 PM, as was the case last year as well. The schedule showing the operation of both ferries was published in the Winter Fins that was mailed to everyone. In addition, the schedule is posted in a number of locations on the Island and is available at the ferry office and at the town office. We tried our best to insure that everyone had access to this ferry schedule. If you don't have one, please ask the ferry crew on the mainland and they will get you one.



By chance, I happened to come over from the mainland around 6:30 on the second ferry's final run Sunday evening. At that time there were only about 4 cars in line and they were taken right off. Had there been a back-up then, I can assure you I would have held the second ferry over. Apparently, around 7:00PM – 7:30PM everyone showed up at the ferry at once. I am sure that the first good Sunday of the spring coupled with the fact that the U.S. Open golf tournament ended around 7:00 PM prompted a number of people to wait longer than usual. The crew that was on duty did a great job shuttling through that busy period to clean up the back log as quickly as they could, but at the time, I am sure that this service wasn't acceptable for many of the people in line. I have learned that we can not anticipate all of the scenarios we might encounter but we are constantly reviewing the traffic patterns and we do our best to adjust the schedules when the need arises.

In an effort to remedy this situation, we have extended the schedule to run the second ferry until 9:00 PM on Sunday. We will be monitoring the ferry usage to insure we are not over reacting to a one time issue.

2. The fee structure for 2005 was published last summer during the budget process and was amended and approved at the October Town Meeting by the Board of Island Trustees. The ferry crews have no control over the rates being charged, so again, please don't blast them if you have a complaint. You can get a copy of the rate schedule from them and a complaint form if you wish. I can not arbitrarily change the rates, but if they are being applied inconsistently, we can review them and I can take recommendations to the Executive Committee for clarification or refinement.
3. Another issue that came up three or four times recently concerns the operation of the last ferry in the evening. Following the final scheduled run of the day the ferries are shut down and the crews go home. We do not have crews on standby 24/7. If you show-up after everyone has gone home, they will not be called back in to run the ferry unless there is an emergency situation. The fact that you missed the final ferry does not constitute an emergency. The operating schedule for the ferries is prepared based on operating history, and is presented to the Executive Committee (EC) for approval. Once the schedule is approved, we do our best to communicate it to all Islanders. Please Read It.

If you know that you are going to be late and call the ferry office ½ hour before they shut down they will hold the crew for up to an hour. We charge \$50.00 for the first ½ hour to hold the ferry crew over and an additional \$50.00 for the second ½ hour for this service. Again, please check the operating schedule when coming and going on the ferry. It could eliminate a lot of difficulty for everyone.

Long Beach Marina & Quail Circle Canal: There have been some changes in the slip assignments because some people decided not to pay the appropriate fees and therefore the slips have been reassigned. We now have 5 available slips at the Marina. If you would like an annual renewable slip or if you have a slip and would like another for the season please contact the office. Quail Circle is full and we have a number of people on the waiting list for that area.

Willis Property: All of the documents have been signed for the interim financing, the title work is finished and all other required documents have been signed. The closing has been scheduled for 11:00AM this morning.

Election of officers: Election of officers will take place at the annual meeting to be held on Saturday July 2nd. This will be held at the Community Center Meeting Room. Registrations are from 8:00am-9:00am, Meeting begins at 9:00am.

Taxes: Just a reminder that the second half of the 2005 tax payments are due on June 30th so you have about a week left to submit them.

John Riley was chosen as the chairman and Carl Hommel agreed to serve as the Secretary. I was very impressed with the members of this committee. I am looking forward to working with them. One of the first things they are planning is to prepare a brief survey that will be distributed as you board the ferry. The data they would like is not intended to pry into your private lives but is to gather information to help determine what Island needs are now and what they may be like in the years to come. As the Island population changes, the demands on the infrastructure and when those demands occur, may change as well. The plan is to pass these out as you board the ferry. If you complete them in transit and leave them with the mate as you disembark the committee will gather them and prepare the data. Your help in this effort will be appreciated.

Fire Works: The annual fire works display is scheduled for the evening of Saturday July 2nd. That means it is time for me to begin my annual plea for donations. We have committed to \$5500.00 again this year and so far we have only collected \$3417.00. If you have not contributed yet please do - so that we can continue this tradition.



MEMORIAL GARDEN

A number of Frye Island residents have expressed an interest in establishing some form of a cemetery on Frye Island. Last fall a committee was formed to look into the possibility of this. The committee members are: Mimi and John Nun, Rick Pertel, Don Nolan, Steve Kaplan, John Crosby, Grace Morin, Cappy Capobianco and Nancy Fournier.

This Committee researched different choices for Memorial Gardens as well as a site to put one on. It was unanimously decided that a Columbarium Memorial Garden would be the best choice as it would require minimum amount of space and minimum amount of investment. A columbarium is a granite monument with "niches" built into it. Each niche holds two urns and the outside of the niche would have a memorialized facing. The cost for one niche would be approximately \$1,500.00 (\$750.00 per urn). The columbarium monument would look something like this picture:



We also looked at several sites for the Memorial Garden and chose the old tennis court site at Recreation Beach. This site already has a chain link fence around it that is in remarkably good shape, it would be relatively easy to clear out, and it has a beautiful view of the lake.

FAQ'S (Frequently Asked Questions)

The Office has been inundated with phone calls. In an effort to minimize the phone calls, we would like to publish a Part 1 of a 3 Part series of repeat questions called in to the office constantly.

Q: I need to buy non-resident tickets for a box truck, How many do I need?

A: The ferry crew has provided a schedule of vehicles and how many tickets are required. We only sell tickets in the office so if you're not sure, check with the ferry. Also, it is your responsibility to get these tickets to the Mainland so you may want to plan ahead.

Q: Is the Code Enforcement Officer in?

Q: What time is the ferry running till tonight?

A: Ferry schedules are posted on the Office Door, Store Door, Golf Course and Post Office Doors, and at the ferry landing along with our web site. Copies of the schedule can also be obtained by the office and the ferry.

Q: We have no water pressure?

A: Most likely we have a line break and the Department of Public Works responds immediately.

Q: When can I get into the Dump?

A: Just call **ahead** – please call the Public Works Garage at 655-7493 first, if you cannot get a hold of them you may call the office at 655-4551 for an appointment. Leave your name and island phone number and DPW will return your call.
