Island Manager Comments

Greetings: This will no doubt be a very busy weekend on the Island. We have our July Town Meeting on Saturday, the fireworks display on Saturday evening and many other planned activities as well. Please be very considerate of others when driving on the Island roads, when boating, and using the other amenities available on the Island.

Golf Cars: A very nice young lady was in my office this week a bit upset with the State law and the Island requirement of “valid drivers licenses of any class” pertaining to driving a golf car. Because she presented herself as well as she did, I agreed to contact the Bureau of Motor Vehicles (BMV) on her behalf to see if there were any options. We were told that the same laws that apply to automobiles also apply to gas driven golf cars. At the same time we were told that the licensing laws did not apply to electric golf cars. We were told that gas powered golf cars were considered motorized vehicles and electric cars were not. This came as quite a surprise and we questioned the logic. But knowing some of the laws on the books that seem to defy logic, we accepted the word of the woman from the BMV. Less than an hour later we got an urgent call from the BMV notifying us that the word we received exempting electric golf cars from the licensing laws was totally wrong. So if anyone heard that you don’t need a driver’s license to drive an electric golf car, don’t believe it, we were given wrong information.



To the parents of the young lady, you should be very proud of her. She presented herself very properly and very maturely despite her disappointment. I wish I could have done something to help her. Also, I hope you didn't rush out to buy her an electric golf car to get to work because the requirement to have a valid drivers license applies to all golf cars being used on Town roads.

Willis Property: We closed on the property last Friday. We now own 25+ acres of land on the Raymond Cape Road.

Election of officers: Election of officers will take place at the annual meeting to be held on Saturday July 2nd. Registrations are from 8:00-9:00am. The Town Meeting begins at 9:00am in the Meeting Room at the Community Center.





MEMORIAL GARDEN

A number of Frye Island residents have expressed an interest in establishing some form of a cemetery on Frye Island. Last fall a committee was formed to look into the possibility of this. The committee members are: Mimi and John Nun, Rick Pertel, Don Nolan, Steve Kaplan, John Crosby, Grace Morin, Cappy Capobianco and Nancy Fournier.

This Committee researched different choices for Memorial Gardens as well as a site to put one on. It was unanimously decided that a Columbarium Memorial Garden would be the best choice as it would require minimum amount of space and minimum amount of investment. A columbarium is a granite monument with "niches" built into it. Each niche holds two urns and the outside of the niche would have a memorialized facing. The cost for one niche would be approximately \$1,500.00 (\$750.00 per urn). The columbarium monument would look something like this picture:



We also looked at several sites for the Memorial Garden and chose the old tennis court site at Recreation Beach. This site already has a chain link fence around it that is in remarkably good shape, it would be relatively easy to clear out, and it has a beautiful view of the lake.



FYI

You should arrive at the landing at least 5 minutes before the boat is scheduled to depart. The boat is loaded according to what vehicles are in line at loading time. The boats will not be “reracked” once loading begins. Once the unhooking process has begun, we will not rehook to load people as experience has proven that if we rehook to accommodate one person, several more will show up at intervals and the schedule is disrupted. When we have 2 boats running, you may wait 10 minutes for another boat, or if we shuttle (run continues with no schedule) the turn around time is quick as well. Please be patient and know that the Captains are the best judge of how their boat should be loaded for optimum load, balance and **FOR YOUR SAFETY** – what looks like a space from 60’-100’ away may not be a space at all.

Q: Is a permit for a dock required?
