Island Manager's Comments

Greetings Everyone:

One of the hot topics this week appears to be the use of watercraft around the waterfront and the beaches. In an effort to clarify some of the uncertainty, I would like to summarize a few of the laws and definitions found in the 2005 State of Maine Boating Laws.

Water Safety Zone: The area of water within 200 feet of any shoreline, whether the shoreline is of the mainland or of an island. Remember this, as it is important in the General Laws discussion below.

Motorboat: Any watercraft equipped with propulsion machinery of any type.

Personal Watercraft: Includes, but is not limited to, jet skis.

General Laws

Swimming Area: Watercraft shall not be operated in an area marked or buoyed for swimming.

Speed Regulations: Watercraft may not be operated at a speed greater than headway speed while within the water safety zone (see above).

Age Requirements: A person under 16 years of age may not operate personal watercraft (including jet skis).

Water Skiing: A watercraft towing a person or persons on water skis, surf boards, or similar devices shall not operate within the water safety zone. It is lawful to pick up and drop off a skier in the water safety zone, but this must be done as directly as possible. In addition, the operator must consider the effect of the wash and waves created by their watercraft to people, waterfront piers, floats, other property, and shorelines.

Copies of the "State Of Maine Boating – 2005 Laws and Rules" are available in the office or can be reviewed on line at www.mefishwildlife.com. If you witness violations, please call the Frye Island Police Dept.

Beaches: In 2003 – 2004, the Frye Island Beach Committee reviewed activity on all of the Island beaches and designated specific areas of each beach

for swimming only. The Public Works Department has placed buoys at the beaches to identify these areas. For safety's sake, if you are a boater, stay out of the swimming areas; if you are a swimmer, stay inside the swimming areas. Please *do not* tamper with the swimming areas.

Police Activity

We have had reports of several boats at the Long Beach Marina being burglarized over the 4th of July weekend. Apparently, radios and other electronic equipment were stolen. If you have knowledge of any of these burglaries or witnessed suspicious activity, please report to the police officer.



Memorial Garden

A number of Frye Island residents have expressed an interest in establishing some form of a cemetery on Frye Island. Last fall a committee was formed to look into the possibility of this. The committee members are: Mimi and John Nun, Rick Pertel, Don Nolan, Steve Kaplan, John Crosby, Grace Morin, Cappy Capobianco and Nancy Fournier.

This committee researched different choices for Memorial Gardens as well as a site to put one on. It was unanimously decided that a Columbarium Memorial Garden would be the best choice as it would require minimum amount of space and minimum amount of investment. A columbarium is a granite monument with "niches" built into it. Each niche holds two urns and the outside of the niche would have a memorialized facing. The cost for one niche would be approximately \$1,500.00 (\$750.00 per urn). The columbarium monument would look something like this picture:



We also looked at several sites for the Memorial Garden and chose the old tennis court site at Recreation Beach. This site already has a chain link fence around it that is in remarkably good shape, it would be relatively easy to clear out, and it has a beautiful view of the lake.

What would you do if an immediate family member, relative or neighbor was sick or injured and no one came to help? Not a good feeling, is it?

Become a member of the Frye Island Fire Department. No experience necessary, just a willingness to learn. Training is held on Sundays at 10:00 AM at the Central Fire Station.

Summer Safety Tips

On extremely hot and muggy days, exposure to heat can lead to heat exhaustion and heat stroke. Seniors, infants and individuals in poor health are at greatest risk. Joggers and others who exercise outdoors are also at risk. The Frye Island Fire Department recommends the following prevention tips for beating the heat this summer.

- Stay out of the sun because sunlight increases body heat and sunburn prevents the release of body heat.
- Avoid jogging, or do it at night when it is cooler.
- Wear clothing that is lightweight, light-colored, and loose fitting.
- Drink plenty of water and cool, non-alcoholic beverages.
- Stay indoors; use a fan and air conditioning if possible.
- Eat light food and avoid high protein and high calorie foods, which increase body heat.

- Seek medical advice if you or someone you know becomes ill. If someone develops a high temperature, is flushed, and stops perspiring; bathe the person in cool water and seek medical advice immediately.
- Keep a flashlight with fresh batteries close by since blackouts often occur during extremely hot weather. Please remember that candles are a serious fire hazard.
- Check on elderly or infirm neighbors to see if they need help. Escort them to a "cool area" if necessary.

Barbecue Safety

- Use all barbecue grills away from the house. LP gas grills should be at least 3 feet from the building, away from doors, windows and any air intake vents.
- All LP gas cylinders with a capacity between 4-40 lbs. must be equipped with an overfill protection device (OPD).
- We recommend LP gas cylinders be ten (10) feet away from the house, especially when in use.
- LP gas is heavier than air and sinks. A leaky grill or cylinder could pose a serious hazard if leaking. Possible ignition sources include smoking materials, pilot lights, automobiles, compressors and heating or cooling units.
- Make sure that all connections are tight and secure.
- Supervise children whenever any type of grill is in use.
- Use only charcoal lighter fluid to start charcoal grills. **NEVER** use gasoline. Once the coals are lit, **NEVER** add lighter fluid to the fire, flames may travel up the stream resulting in serious burns.

Gasoline and Lawn Mowers

- Gasoline vapors are highly flammable. They stay on your clothing and **can ignite** if you light a match or cigarette.
- Store gasoline only in an approved container, outside, or in a building or shed not attached to the house. **NEVER** keep gasoline inside the home.
- Keep gasoline away from all heat sources such as smoking materials, pilot lights, and grills.
- **NEVER** fuel a lawn mower while it is hot. Give it a few minutes to cool off before refueling.

- Keep your hands and feet away from the mower while it is running.

Burn First Aid

- **Stop, drop and roll** to extinguish a clothing fire.
- Cool a burn. For minor burns, run cool water immediately over the burn.
- **Dial 9-1-1** to access emergency help for more serious burns.
