Town News

Island Manager's Comments

Greetings Everyone:

Many of you have probably heard that the water system suffered a lightning strike a few weeks ago. New components have been ordered and temporary ones have been installed to keep the system running. The insurance company has been notified and the damage will be covered.

This, however, has nothing to do with the recent ban on watering lawns and gardens. The recently completed upgrade will increase the supply of water to the distribution system, but we still have restrictions with the old distribution system. The Island is shaped like a big dome, with areas around the water (Leisure Lane and Ridge Road) being the lower elevations and the center of the Island (Highpoint Drive and Independence Road) being the higher elevations. Water runs downhill, so it naturally runs toward the lower areas and away from the higher areas. We have installed some valves to help balance this tendency, but it will not cure the problem. We will have to upgrade the distribution system to accomplish that. During the high season (July and August), the increase in population places greater demands on the system and it hardly seems right that homes in the lower areas of the Island are able to water their lawns while those in the upper areas barely have enough water to wash the soap from their hair or flush their toilets. Therefore, we have initiated the ban on watering lawns and gardens (you may water only between the hours of 9:00PM and 6:00AM). This will help keep enough water available for the essential needs of everyone.

Taxes

The second half of the 2005 taxes were due on June 30. In accordance with State law, a municipality can send out lien notices to delinquent tax payers anytime between 8 and 12 months after the taxes have been committed. The municipality can then issue and record liens 30 days after these notices are issued. We commit our taxes on November 1 every year. This means that we can issue lien notices

anytime after July 1, 2005 and before November 1. This year, the 30-day lien notices will be mailed on August 22 and liens on all properties with outstanding taxes will be recorded at the Cumberland County Registry of Deeds on September 22. If taxes are still not paid eighteen (18) months after recording the liens at the Registry, the property is automatically foreclosed and becomes Town property. In addition to the taxes and interest, the delinquent tax payer is also responsible for all other costs incurred including recording fees, mailing fees etc., so please pay before the lien/foreclosure process begins.

Police Activity

We continue to receive reports of irresponsible operation of Jet Skis around shore and near swim areas. There have also been a number of complaints about boats speeding in and out of the marina. Remember, use headway speed only in that area. The police officer, as well as State game wardens, will be patrolling around the Island and anyone violating state law will be ticketed.

For your information, I heard that a boater was recently stopped by a Game Warden and fined \$500.00 for not having a Milfoil sticker. The wardens are patrolling the lake, so be sure that you are boating safely.

FINS

I have heard many positive comments about the new format for the FINS. For that, I can take absolutely no credit. Lisa and Nancy are now working with Peter Hartman, who volunteered to help us. My special thanks to all of them.

Hazardous Waste Day

Voting on Article 4 of the MSAD6 District Referendum

The polls will be open for **registered town voters** from 10:00 AM to 8:00 PM on Tuesday, July 26, at the Community Center Meeting Room for voting on Article 4 of the MSAD#6 District Referendum, which was voted down on June 14.

If you are a registered town voter and will not be able to vote on that day, you may come to the Office and pick up an absentee ballot. Hand-delivered ballots must be received by 3:00 PM on Saturday, July 23. Mailed ballots must be received no later than July 26.

About the Referendum

Voters of MSAD6 approved the 2005-2006 school budget of \$35,642,125 dollars at June 14 district-wide referendum. However, one funding article - Article 4 - failed to get approval by a margin of 51 votes. In accordance with state law, District voters must reconsider this article.

Since the total budget was approved, voters have not asked for budgetary cuts. Therefore, the problem with this article might be in the language. The state dictates the language of referendum articles. Unfortunately, Article 2 refers to "total cost of education from kindergarten to grade 12," while Article 4 refers to "Additional Local Funds."

The \$3,848,583.35 in Article 4 is part of the total budget figure, *not* an additional sum. State aid to education for 2005-2006 is short by 16% of what it would be if the new state funding formula (known as EPS, or Essential Programs and Services) were to be fully implemented. (It will be fully implemented in four steps: 84% in 2005-06, then 90%, 95%, and 100%.) This shortfall in state aid is the largest part of Article 4. It also includes more than \$500,000 of special education budget that state is not covering. (Federal government mandates Special Education programs and the District must provide the services, whatever the cost.)

A third significant component of Article 4 is the cost of student activities that fall outside of EPS. Finally, the 2005-2006 budget was developed under new paradigm: needs-based budgeting. (In the private sector, this is known as zero-based budgeting.) Thus, it is as lean a budget as it possibly could be. Please pick up a yellow data sheet at the Office for additional information.

In conclusion, without Article 4 funds, MSAD6 would not be able to provide quality education to more than four thousand American kids. It is these kids that MSAD6 is all about!
