Island Manager's Comments

Greetings Everyone:

John and the Public Works crew have received and installed the new raw water pump in the east pump house. This pump has more capacity than the older pump and has been capable of keeping up with the demand. This, however, does not affect the distribution system, so it is still necessary to continue with the ban on watering lawns and gardens. Your cooperation is appreciated.

Police Activity

From June 1 through July 31, a total of 31 infractions were cited. The vast majority of these were motor vehicle/golf cart-related. Of the 31 incidents, only three resulted in tickets being issued, the other 28 resulted in warnings only.

One of the tickets issued was to an individual for speeding **29** miles per hour *over* the posted speed limit. I realize that a large number of Islanders feel that we do not need a police presence on the Island or, at most, we only need to have someone waiting for us to call him or her. However, can you imagine the result if a full-sized vehicle going 50 miles per hour on our roads were to hit a golf cart?

Ferry Ticket Prices

We have received a few complaints about the price of the ferry tickets for property owners driving “construction type” vehicles. The Committee appreciated the input from the Islanders present at the meeting and agreed to review the fee schedule and consider possible changes for the fee schedule presented for next year. If you have comments or suggestions for the 2006 fee schedule, please get them to the office and I will make sure that they are forwarded to the Committee.

The Transportation Committee has prepared a brief survey to help them determine how and why the ferries are utilized on a daily basis. This survey consists of six questions and will be distributed at the mainland ferry terminal as you prepare to board. Medical Emergency Procedure

Dial 9-1-1

Your 9-1-1 call will be received at the Raymond Dispatch Center.

State your name, your location, and the nature of the emergency.

The Raymond Dispatch Center will dispatch the Frye Island Fire Department medical First Responders and Raymond Rescue. The Raymond Dispatch Center will also notify the ferry captain for an emergency run. This will occur during normal operating hours and during off-hours.

Time is critical in an emergency! Stay at your location until help arrives. Medical personnel are responding to your location. If you leave that location, you may bypass responding rescue personnel.

Fire Emergency: Dial 9-1-1

Your 9-1-1 call will be received at the Raymond Dispatch Center.

State your name, your location, and the nature of the emergency. Then **get out of the building if there is a fire.**

The Raymond Dispatch Center will dispatch the Frye Island and Raymond Fire Departments. Raymond Dispatch will also notify the ferry.

Note that all streets and fire lanes on the island are clearly marked. All owners and visitors should know the street, lot number, fire lane, and a nearby landmark where they are located in the event of a fire, medical, or police emergency. This information will greatly expedite the response time for the emergency service that is answering your call. Time is critical!


