Growth Management Ordinance Questionnaire

August 2005

The Town of Frye Island Land Use Ordinance, Chapter 101, Article V – Growth Management Ordinance, Section 10. Review Procedure, requires this ordinance to be reviewed by the Board of Selectmen to assess the efficacy of the ordinance. Results from this questionnaire will be used by the Board of Selectmen in determining the need for amendments to the ordinance.

- 1. Do you believe there is a need for a limit on new dwelling units? Please explain.**

- 2. Have the building limitations affected you? If so, how?**

- 3. Based on your experience with the ordinance, can you recommend any changes?**

- 4. Currently there are 120 lot owners on a waiting list for a building permit. 15 building permits are issued from the list each year. Some lot owners have experienced hardship by being forced to build before they are ready. Do you feel this is fair? If not, can you suggest a better way?**

- 5. The ferry, roads, and water system are just a few parts of the Island infrastructure that have been cited by the ordinance as reasons for the limited building. Can you suggest solutions that will help protect the rights of all lot owners?**

I've always been an outdoor person and I enjoy the challenge that piloting the boat involves (dealing with the wind, the weather, the vehicles etc.).


