Town News

Island Manager's Comments

Greetings Everyone,

Weather: The topic of most discussions on Frye Island lately has been the weather. With the exception of the Memorial Day weekend, it seems like we have had nothing but rain. When we first arrived on the Island I was very concerned with the low lake level and the affect it might have on ferry traffic in the fall. Now the problem is the high water level and the affect it is having on the operation of the ferry ramps.

We recently rebuilt the ramps and made some modifications to increase the allowable travel, primarily to gain more travel when the water level is low, but those modifications were limited by the physical structure of the ramps and gantries. Now, because the lake level is so high, the cables and the shackles on the Island side are rubbing on the gantry structure which weakens the cables and would contribute to their failure if not corrected. Therefore, we are making plans to change the shackles and modify how they are connected to the ramp. In order to do this we must shut down the ramp and consequently the ferry service for a couple of hours. We are planning to do this next Wednesday or Thursday at 9:30 A.M. if we can get all of the materials that we need. As soon as we know for sure, we will post it but please plan your travels accordingly.

If you are wondering why we are doing this during the day it's because it will be much safer for those doing the work to do it during daylight hours. And, if we run into unexpected problems we will be able to get additional parts and materials during the day.

We will be setting up a contingency plan should an emergency occur while the ferry is inoperable.

Your cooperation will be appreciated during this time.

Ferry: Last week I tried to explain how the finances for the ferry service work; and explained how the expenses to operate the ferry service could not exceed the revenue received from the sale of tickets. I hope I was able to explain it so that it was understandable. This week, I'll try to explain it a little more.

The biggest single expense to operating the ferries is the labor and its associated costs (*i.e. FICA, Medicare, Workers Compensation etc.*). These expenses are pretty much dictated by the ferry schedule, as are a number of other *variable* costs, or costs that are affected by the operation of the ferries, like fuel, ferry maintenance, ferry and gantry repairs etc. The only real way to reduce these expenses is to reduce the number of trips the

ferries make. When I prepared the schedule for this season, I reduced the schedule and the labor component as much as I could while trying to maintain as much service for everyone that I could.

We are on a bi-weekly payroll program meaning that every 2 weeks we collect time cards and calculate the payroll and all other associated expenses for that pay period. I watch revenues and expenses for the ferry operation more closely than this, but when I get the most recent ferry payroll data, I extrapolate these expenses through the end of the season. I then estimate the other variable and fixed costs and then project the total operating costs for the season. In addition to the expenses, I also determine the operating revenue for the same period and project that through the season. The hope is that the revenues projected for end of the season are greater than the expenses. Right now; "that ain't happening".

Through the end of May, my calculations indicate that revenues, projected through the end of the season, trail expenses by approximately \$24,000. I realize that the season is still young, and the recent weather certainly hasn't helped much, but if this trend continues we will have to do something more to correct this situation and we don't have a lot of options. To put it into perspective, the total operating payroll for the ferry service for the whole month of May was about \$16,000. So trying to make-up \$24,000 by cutting expenses without revenue increases could be very difficult.

Operating revenues through May of this year are about \$4500 less than last year at the same time; and total revenue, (operating revenue plus reserve contribution) through June 9th is down about \$14,000.

I hope this isn't too confusing because that's not the intent. The intent is to keep you as informed as I can so you will understand if and why we have to make additional changes in the ferry operation. There will be more to come in future editions.

Headlights: As you approach the ferry landings on both sides you will notice signs asking that you turn off the headlights on your vehicle. This isn't because we want you to fumble around in the dark; it is so that you don't blind the ferry captain as he/she is approaching the dock. The captain's eyes get accustomed to the dark as they transit from dock to dock at night and headlights on the ferry approach roads can be blinding to the captain and the mate when they are docking the boat. So, for the safety of the ferry, the crew and all of the passengers aboard, please shut off your headlights when

approaching the ferry landing and leave them off until you are off the ferry and driving away. Thank You.

Fire Works: We have confirmed with the Pyrotechnics Company that Saturday July 1st is the date for the Frye Island Fireworks Display with Sunday the 2nd as the rain date. This is a non-budgeted event so we need your donations to make it happen. Many Islanders are donating to the fire works display in memory of Don Nolen a long time resident, volunteer fire fighter, and employee of Frye Island who passed away last fall. If you would like to donate in Don's name, please let the office know when you make your donation. A bench at the Fire Station will be dedicated in Don's memory during the 4th of July activities.

Town of Frye Island vs. the State of Maine: The attorneys have finally agreed on the stipulations for the case between Frye Island and the State of Maine. As soon as I hear more I will let you know.

Public Hearings: We held the first public hearing to discuss the future of the Growth Management Ordinance with 38 property owners present plus the Board of Selectmen / Executive Committee. The next hearing will be held on Saturday June 17th, at 9:00 AM at the Community Center. It appears the options being discussed are to modify the way the process is administered from an ever increasing waiting list to some type of an annual lottery, to issue a certain number each year on a first come first served basis, or to rescind the ordinance all together. If you have an opinion and would like to comment please attend the meeting. If you are unable to attend either of them, drop me an e-mail at wfournier@fryeisland.com and I will see that the Board gets it.

Voting: There will be a state-wide Primary Election on Tuesday June 13th. The Frye Island polls will be open from 10:00AM until 8:00 PM at the Community Center. There will also be a vote at the same time on the SAD #6 budget. All Frye Island registered voters will be able to vote on the SAD 6 budget. In addition, all registered voters enrolled in the Democratic Party, the Republican Party, or the Green / Independent party will be able to vote for candidates in their respective parties. Sample ballots are posted at the Administration Office for your review. If you have any questions on the School or the Primary elections please call the office. Absentee ballots are available in the office if you are unable to be here to vote in person.

Taxes: We are approaching that time of year again when the second half of the taxes are due. You have until June 30th to pay before interest starts accruing. I realize that it is still a bit early but if I start reminding you now, maybe you won't forget.

Police and Safety: No report this week.

Information for June 13 Referendum

In the recommended 2006-2007 SAD #6 budget, the total (district-wide) school tax went down by \$388,569.90 dollars. However, Frye Island taxpayers are facing an increase of \$77,413.76 (not counting Adult Education) in the school tax burden. Why? The answer has two parts. The first one has its roots in the last-minute change to the LD1 legislation. It states that MSAD #6 must allocate local school taxes based upon state property valuations, rather than the number of students that each town sends to District schools. The second one lies in the way the state does its valuation of towns. Believe or not, the state valuation of Frye Island went up by \$21,400,000 or 30.92% from 2004 to 2005. Increases in the valuations of other towns in the school district were not as drastic. Therefore, Frye Island's share of the total school tax went up from 4.22% to 4.80%. The School Board has no control over these circumstances.

My second comment relates to the language of the two referendum articles, which is also forced upon us by the state bureaucracy,. Article 1 talks about the "total cost" of funding public education and Article 3 calls for "additional local funds." This might be confusing. Article 3 includes aid-to-education dollars that the state does not provide at this time because it funds only 90% of its commitment. It also includes shortfalls in the aid-to-education for special education, transportation, and technology. Thus, these funds are an integral part of the budget. They are not some arbitrary "additional" figures.

Are You On Time?

Did you miss the boat by seconds? Don't get mad, check the outside clock on the end of the ferry trailer, the ferry service strives to be an "on time" service and departs according to the "radio controlled" clock on the trailer. If the ferry is still within the slipway and the boat deck can accept an additional vehicle, without rearranging said vehicles, the captain will return to load you (this does not apply when two boats are running).

Contractors

The ferry will allow commercial vehicles to use the ferry during pre and post season weekends, (with some restrictions). Please get a new ferry schedule that lists these restrictions.

Remember that concrete trucks and oversize loads need to have prior clearance or they must wait until they can be transported without "bumping off of the ferry a property owner". Call the office to make arrangements.

Summer Safety Tips

On extremely hot and muggy days, exposure to heat can lead to heat exhaustion and heat stroke. Seniors, infants and individuals in poor health are at greatest risk. Joggers and others who exercise outdoors are also at risk. The Frye Island Fire Department recommends the following prevention tips for beating the heat this summer.

- Stay out of the sun because sunlight increases body heat and sunburn prevents the release of body heat.
- Avoid jogging, or do it at night when it is cooler.
- Wear clothing that is lightweight, light-colored, and loose fitting.
- Drink plenty of water and cool, non-alcoholic beverages.
- Stay indoors; use a fan and air conditioning if possible.
- Eat light food and avoid high protein and high calorie foods, which increase body heat.
- Seek medical advice if you or someone you know becomes ill. If someone develops a high temperature, is flushed, and stops perspiring; bathe the person in cool water and seek medical advice immediately.
- Keep a flashlight with fresh batteries close by since blackouts often occur during extremely hot weather. Please remember that candles are a serious fire hazard.
- Check on elderly or infirm neighbors to see if they need help. Escort them to a “cool area” if necessary.

Gasoline and Lawn Mowers


- Gasoline vapors are highly flammable. They stay on your clothing and **can ignite** if you light a match or cigarette.
- Store gasoline only in an approved container, outside, or in a building or shed not attached to the house. **NEVER** keep gasoline inside the home.
- Keep gasoline away from all heat sources such as smoking materials, pilot lights, and grills.
- **NEVER** fuel a lawn mower while it is hot. Give it a few minutes to cool off before refueling.
- Keep your hands and feet away from the mower while it is running.

Barbecue Safety

- Use all barbecue grills away from the house. LP gas grills should be at least 3 feet from the building, away from doors, windows and any air intake vents.
- All LP gas cylinders with a capacity between 4-40 lbs. must be equipped with an overfill protection device (OPD).
- We recommend LP gas cylinders be ten (10) feet away from the house, especially when in use.
- LP gas is heavier than air and sinks. A leaky grill or cylinder could pose a serious hazard if leaking. Possible ignition sources include smoking materials, pilot lights, automobiles, compressors and heating or cooling units.
- Make sure that all connections are tight and secure.
- Supervise children whenever any type of grill is in use.
- Use only charcoal lighter fluid to start charcoal grills. **NEVER** use gasoline. Once the coals are lit, **NEVER** add lighter fluid to the fire, flames may travel up the stream resulting in serious burns.

Burn First Aid

- **Stop, drop and roll** to extinguish a clothing fire.
- Cool a burn. For minor burns, run cool water immediately over the burn.
- **Dial 9-1-1** to access emergency help for more serious burns.
