Island Manager's Comments

Greetings Everyone,

Ferry: Last week I reported that we had to shut down the ferry service for a few hours to adjust the cables on the Island side ferry gantry. This job was accomplished on Wednesday. I would like to thank the Public Works crew and the Ferry crew for successfully getting this job done and completing it on time. I would also like to thank all of the Islanders for their cooperation and patience while the work was being done.

We were a bit lucky to finish the job in the morning because an afternoon thunderstorm knocked the electricity off for a couple of hours. As is always the case, this happened during the afternoon rush. When this happens, the ramp has to be raised and lowered by hand; and believe me it is not an easy task - I have done it myself. If you were in line during this time, I apologize for any delays. I also want to thank the ferry crew for their hard work to keep the ferry operating.

Last week I also reported that the ferry revenues were lagging behind last year and even though we had reduced the operating schedule, we were still projecting to fall about \$24,000 short by the end of the season. The revenues are still lagging behind last year by about \$19,000. However, we made some additional adjustments in the schedule and in our labor expense and have reduced the projected shortfall, revenue vs. expenses, to about \$5,000. We are watching this very closely and if revenues do not start picking up soon, we will be forced to take additional steps to balance the revenues and expenses.

Voting: The primary elections and the vote for the SAD 6 budget were held Tuesday, June 13th. All of the SAD 6 budget articles passed. 29 Islanders voted for the SAD 6 budget. The results are as follows:

In the Primary elections, Baldacci won the Democratic vote for Governor; Woodcock won the Republican vote and Pat. Lamarche won the Green vote. It appears that Jean Hay Bright won the Democratic vote for the District 1 U.S. Senate seat and will oppose Olympia Snowe in November. All of the other primary races were unopposed. Frye Island had 17 Republicans, 6 Democrats, and 1 Greens vote in the primary.

Fire Works: We only have a few weeks left to raise the necessary money for the fireworks display. If you haven't contributed please stop in the office or drop a check in the mail. Checks should be made out to The Town of Frye Island. Many Islanders are donating to the fire works display in memory of Don Nolen a long time resident, volunteer fire fighter, and employee of Frye Island who passed away last fall. If you would like to donate in Don's name, please let the office know when you make your donation. A bench at the Fire Station will be dedicated in Don's memory during the 4th of July activities.

Town of Frye Island vs. the State of Maine: The attorneys have finally agreed on the stipulations for the case between Frye Island and the State of Maine. We are waiting now for the Court to set the dates when the briefs will be required.

Public Hearings: The final hearing on the Growth Management Ordinance will be held on Saturday June 17th, at 9:00 AM at the Community Center. If you have an opinion and would like to comment please attend the meeting. If you are unable to attend this next meeting, drop me an e-mail at wfourier@fryeisland.com and I will see that the Board gets it.

Taxes: We are getting close to the time when the second half of the taxes is due. You have until June 30th to pay before interest starts accruing.

Transportation Committee: Many of you may recall that last year we formed a committee to review the operation of the ferries and what the impact of an increase to 750 homes would have on our transportation infrastructure. The members have spent a lot of time collating data from the ferry reports and are in the process of developing a report for the Board of Selectmen / Executive Committee. At the last meeting a thought for discussion was developed that I would like to share with you.

Thoughts about:

“THE FERRY IS OUR LIFELINE”

We take for granted how smoothly our ferry system operates on a regular basis, however just a small glitch in that system could drastically affect the level of service that we have enjoyed for these many years.

*The Frye Island Transportation Committee has spent time looking at the run data for the ferry and offer some observations. With one ferry operating, we can move 18 to 27 cars per hour in either direction (to and from the island). With two ferries operating, we can move 36 to 45 cars per hour. Now let's consider typical Sunday ferry traffic from the island during high season. In the month of August 2004, we moved an average of 352 cars each Sunday from the island. **With one ferry running, that would take 13 to 19 hours!** On the average Sunday, we move the majority of our cars between 2 pm and 8 pm. Based on current usage, with only one ferry running on a Sunday during high season estimated wait times would be 3 to 6 hours.*

Is it realistic not to expect that one of our 40-year-old ferries might break down over a weekend during high season?

Consider island growth- we have approximately 470 homes on the island right now and we are growing at a rate of at least 15 homes per year. Growth will expand ferry wait times if the current usage pattern is maintained.

I agree, the ferry is our lifeline, and I think the gantry system is the weak link in that lifeline. This week we shut the Island gantry down for 2 hours for scheduled repairs. Think about the consequences if a gantry were down for 2 days or 2 weeks.

Are You On Time?

Did you miss the boat by seconds? Don't get mad, check the outside clock on the end of the ferry trailer, the ferry service strives to be an "on time" service and departs according to the "radio controlled" clock on the trailer. If the ferry is still within the slipway and the boat deck can accept an additional vehicle, without rearranging said vehicles, the captain will return to load you (this does not apply when two boats are running).

Contractors

The ferry will allow commercial vehicles to use the ferry during pre and post season weekends, (with some restrictions). Please get a new ferry schedule that lists these restrictions.

Remember that concrete trucks and oversize loads need to have prior clearance or they must wait until they can be transported without "bumping off of the ferry a property owner". Call the office to make arrangements.


