Island Manager's Comments

Greetings Everyone,

Ferry: The saga of the ferries continues. While we were modifying the cable connections on the Island ramp, we noticed what appeared to be an excessive amount of movement in the ramp when the vehicles were off loading. At that time it was decided to inspect the underwater hinges and connections as soon as possible. Brian Nisula volunteered to don his diving gear and check it out for us. His inspection revealed the fact that the concrete had broken away from two of the four support bolts that hold the hinge on the south side in place. The permanent repair requires that we remove the ramp and build a cofferdam around the hinge and abutment area so the water can be pumped out. The repairs could then be made. Because this would require that the ferry service be suspended for days if not weeks we consulted with the engineer that designed the system originally and have decided to make a temporary repair that will get us through the remainder of the season. We will be doing this next week. We have ordered the materials that are needed and as soon as everything is in place, we will make the temporary repair. Impact on the ferry operation should be minimal.

On another note, I have been reporting for weeks that the projected ferry revenues are falling short of projected expenses. Trying to forecast the magnitude of the shortfall is like trying to hit a moving target because it changes daily, but I went through the effort again yesterday and after deducting the reserve contributions from the operating revenue, it appears that the shortfall will be in the \$20,000 to \$25,000 range. We have already reduced the ferry schedule and the labor element of the expenses and through this effort, we were able to eliminate approximately \$40,000 from the operating budget. However, this has not been enough. In order to make this work, we have to maximize our revenues and minimize our expenses. We have experienced a reduction in ferry ticket sales of almost 19% over last year through June 22. If this downturn in revenues remains the same for the rest of the season, and if we cut the second ferry out completely, including Friday, Saturday and Sunday for the rest of the season, we will just about break even based on the current projections. I believe we have three options available to us:

1. We can increase the cost to use a ferry ticket. The executive committee is considering a surcharge on every ticket used to generate more revenue. By Charter, any additional cost for the

ferry must be approved by the Board of Island Trustees (Cottage owners). If you recall, we proposed this last year at the October town meeting and it was rejected.

2. We can reduce the ferry schedule in order to reduce the operating costs. In order to cut \$20,000 to \$25,000 from the operating schedule, we would have to shut down the second ferry completely. This means on the weekends as well, including Friday evening, all day Saturday and all day Sunday. Think about it, 95% of the traffic on Sunday is going off the Island. There is almost no revenue generated on Sunday. From a business perspective, this would be the first place to cut. I realize that people have to get off the Island and most want to do it at their leisure, but on Sunday the expense vs. revenue differential is at its greatest. By charter, the Executive Committee has the authority to adjust the operating schedule.
3. We can vote to pay for any shortfall from the General Fund Balance. This is the surplus that the Town saves for emergency situations. By charter, the registered voters in the Town must approve this.

What ever we decide to do, we must do it immediately. Time is running out. The Executive Committee has scheduled a special Board meeting tonight at 7:00 PM to discuss and approve a warrant article for a special meeting to be held on Saturday July 1st.

Fire Works: HELP!! We only have one week left to raise the necessary money for the fireworks display and we are \$2545 dollars short. If you haven't contributed please stop by the office or drop a check in the mail. Checks should be made out to the Town of Frye Island. Many Islanders are donating to the fire works display in memory of Don Nolen a long time resident, volunteer fire fighter, and employee of Frye Island who passed away last fall. If you would like to donate in Don's name, please let the office know when you make your donation. A bench at the Fire Station will be dedicated in Don's memory during the 4th of July activities.

Town of Frye Island vs. the State of Maine: On June 19th, the court set the date for briefs. Our attorneys must have the briefs submitted by July 19th, the State and SAD 6 will then have 30 days (Aug 19th) to respond. We then have an additional 14 days to respond to their brief, at which time the Court will set a date for oral

arguments. This could take as long as a couple of months.

Headlights: I wrote this a few weeks ago and was asked to run it again. As you approach the ferry landings on both sides you will notice signs asking that you turn off the headlights on your vehicle. This isn't because we want you to fumble around in the dark; it is so that you don't blind the ferry captain as he/she is approaching the dock. The captain's eyes get accustomed to the dark as they transit from dock to dock at night and headlights on the ferry approaches can be blinding to the captain and mate while they are docking the boat. So, for the safety of the ferry, the crew and all of the passengers, please shut off your headlights when approaching the ferry landing and leave them off until you are off the ferry and driving away. Thank You.

Taxes: If you haven't paid the second half of the taxes by Friday, June 30th interest will start accruing on the balance owed.

Board of Directors, Frye Island Inc. There will be an FII stockholders meeting on Saturday July 1st at 9:00 AM. Playground Lane: Playground Lane has become a thoroughfare for traffic between Ridge Road and the ferry landing area. This is not the intended use and in fact has created some very unsafe situations from vehicles speeding through the recreation area and onto the ferry landing road. Therefore, we are closing that road to all automobile through traffic. We will leave an opening for foot traffic and golf carts only.

Growth Management Ordinance: The second scheduled hearing was held last weekend to discuss the future of the ordinance. Following the meeting, the Board decided NOT to have a special Town Meeting to vote on its future. The board will now consider if more hearings are needed in order to give more people an opportunity to express their thoughts and concerns about the ordinance. I will keep you posted.

Are You On Time?

Did you miss the boat by seconds? Don't get mad, check the outside clock on the end of the ferry trailer, the ferry service strives to be an "on time" service and departs according to the "radio controlled" clock on the trailer. If the ferry is still within the slipway and the boat deck can accept an additional vehicle, without rearranging said vehicles, the captain will return to load you (this does not apply when two boats are running).

Contractors

The ferry will allow commercial vehicles to use the ferry during pre and post season weekends, (with some restrictions). Please get a new ferry schedule that lists these restrictions.

Remember that concrete trucks and oversize loads need to have prior clearance or they must wait until they can be transported without "bumping off of the ferry a property owner". Call the office to make arrangements.

Open Burning Law

The State of Maine requires a permit for all open burning.

In the more rural areas of Northern Maine permits may be obtained at the local Maine Forest Ranger Headquarters or at the ranger's residence. In areas of Maine that are not so rural, permits are obtained at the residence of the fire warden or at the municipal facility.

Here on Frye Island, permits are obtained at the Fire Warden or Assistant Fire Warden's residence.

Nothing shall prohibit a municipality from adopting ordinances specifying stricter criteria than the State's open burning laws for out-of-door fires.

THERE IS NO OPEN BURNING PERMITTED ON FRYE ISLAND.

Only permits for warming or cooking are issued provided that an adequate weather advisory has been dispatched to us from the state and that additional guidelines are met.

There are no other types of open burning allowed, including campfires or bonfires either on private or public property.

The state issues what is referred to as a Class Day on a daily basis. Class Days are assigned by number depending on the moisture in the fuels on the ground, the amount of moisture we have received, wind conditions, and general weather conditions.

Class Days are grouped into five (5) categories.

Class 1 is when there is very little potential danger.

Class 2 is when there is some danger.

Class 3 is when there is danger present.

Class 4 is when there is moderate danger.

Class 5 is when there is extreme danger of fire threat.

The issuing of any permit or permission for allowable burning depends on the following criteria:

Forest fire danger (Class Day)

Time of day and season of the year

Temperature, humidity, wind speed and direction

Type of burning proposed

The length of burning period

The presence or availability of sufficient force and equipment to control the burning

Experience and capability of the permittee in the safe use and control of the burning

If a permit is issued, the burning must be conducted according to the terms and conditions of the permit and may not create a nuisance.

Chimenera

Open fires in a screened enclosure designed for such use or in a chimenera are permitted under the following conditions:


- The device must be used only on an acceptable permit-required burn day within the state. (A permit will not be necessary to use the device, but it can only be used on a day on which burning is allowed.) The Forest Service determines the class day every morning. They broadcast this information over the radio to notify all the fire departments. We get this information over our portable radios. In addition local fire departments like Raymond, give out this information in their morning radio announcement. They give class day and whether or not permits will be issued. If conditions are extremely dry or if there are high winds, there probably will be no permits issued. A call to the Raymond Fire Department dispatcher or asking one of our own members should give you the answer.
- The device must stand on sand or dirt in a wide-open area to prevent any spread of fire.
- The device must be placed away from any structure and **cannot** be situated on a porch, deck, or other similar area.
- The device must be continuously monitored by an adult.
- A fire hose or bucket of water must be nearby.

I don't know how many of these devices are on the Island. Many people have inquired whether they are permitted and I have explained the above conditions to them. At first I did issue a burning permit, as there is no open burning on the island - for obvious reasons. Campfires are **not** permitted; nor is any burning of slash, leaves, branches, or tree trunks.

Anyone using one of these devices accepts **full responsibility** for their actions if a mishap occurs.

The fire department has the authority to extinguish any fire that constitutes a hazard.
