Island Manager's Comments

Greetings Everyone,

Ferry: I hate to start out every week with comments about the ferry but it has been the issue on everyone's front burner lately.

You probably already know that a \$2.00 surcharge on all discount ferry tickets used (\$4.00 for non discount tickets) was passed at a special town meeting held on Saturday July 1st and implemented on Tuesday July 4th. If you are buying tickets at the office, the surcharge will be added to your bill and your ticket will be stamped indicating that the surcharge has been paid. If you have pre-purchased tickets that have not been stamped, you will be charged the additional \$2.00 when you use the ticket to board the ferry.

If you have a number of pre-purchased tickets, we encourage you to stop at the town office to pay the surcharge and get your tickets stamped. This will reduce the amount of cash handled at the ferry trailer and help minimize the pre-boarding congestion. If you are upset with the increase, please don't take it out on the ferry crews; they are just doing their jobs. We have a history on the Island of attacking the messenger and this is unwarranted. Your cooperation will be greatly appreciated.

If you haven't been on the Island, I have commented for weeks that the projected ferry revenues are falling short of the anticipated expenses to operate the ferry. Through June, I projected a \$20,000 shortfall by the end of the season, even though we reorganized the entire operation and reduced the 2nd ferry schedule. The fact is, the revenue lost in May and June is not retrievable. As one person stated at the meeting, the weather was so poor in May and June she and her husband didn't come to the Island. I am sure that many people felt the same, contributing to the reduction in revenue. Unfortunately, I can't add weekends to July and August, to make it up. I would love to have an 8 weekend August but I just can't make it happen. Therefore, we have to make it up by adding the surcharge. It must also be pointed out that this surcharge isn't intended to add revenue so that we can increase the operating schedule. This surcharge is to increase the revenue so that we can maintain the present operating schedule.

Last week I reported that we had reduced the second ferry schedule in order to reduce expenses and we had been able to do this with little pain to the Islanders. However, if you were trying to get off the Island on Wednesday between 10:00 AM and 2:00 PM you probably felt a little pain. On Tuesday the 4th we scheduled the ferries the same as we normally do on Sundays anticipating a large exodus of weekenders and actually moved 367 vehicles from the Island. With 9 vehicles per ferry it means we need to make about 41 trips to move all of those vehicles. With 2 ferries shuttling 3 trips per hour each, it requires almost 7 hours to get all of the vehicles off the Island.

On Wednesday the 5th, we had an additional 250 vehicles leaving the Island. The difference was that we scheduled the ferries as a normal mid week day. That is, the 2nd ferry ran from 7 to 9 AM and 3 to 5 PM. Between the hours of 9 AM & 3 PM we had one ferry scheduled, which is when most people showed up at the ferry. We have scheduled the second ferry based on historical usage. I might suggest that you check the schedule to see when the second ferry is scheduled to plan the best time to leave the Island. Weekly schedules are printed in every issue of the FINS, and seasonal schedules are available at the ferry trailer or in the office.

Fire Works I am pleased to announce that once again your donations have pushed us over the top for the fire works display. We needed \$5500.00 and actually received \$6050 in donations. The excess will remain in the fund for next year. Thanks again.

Taxes: If you haven't paid your taxes by now, you are late and will be charged interest. The next step in the legal process will be to lien the property. This will take place during the week of September 18th. In addition, you will no longer be considered "a resident in good standing" and will be required to pay full fare (\$20.00 + \$4.00) for the ferry; and, don't get ugly with the ferry crew, its not their fault that your taxes aren't paid.

Water System: We had a number of fairly significant leaks in the system this weekend which is indicative of the problems we have with the distribution system. We must increase the pressure in the system in order to distribute an adequate amount of water to certain areas on the Island during times of high usage. When we do this however, we have the potential of breaking these black plastic lines that have been weakened by age, sun light, and traffic. This is what happened this weekend. I am sorry if you had water problems this weekend but the crew is doing all that it can to keep the system functioning for everyone.

Beaches: I have received a number of complaints about dogs on the beaches. Last year, the beach committee established rules for the beaches which were approved by the Executive Committee. These rules are published elsewhere in this FINS. I have also heard that someone has been tampering with the swim area buoys and ropes. I remind you that this is illegal and violators can be fined. The beach rules and swim areas are intended to help provide a safe and enjoyable place where all Islanders can enjoy Frye Island at its best. Please be considerate of your neighbors and read and abide by these rules and leave the swim areas alone. If you won't, I will ask our police officer to enforce them.

Police and Safety: We had a number of complaints over the weekend, two of which resulted in arrests for operating under the influence. Every year I preach about safety on Island roads. Our roads are gravel, narrow by design, and heavily used by children, walkers and golf carts. We have been extremely lucky so far when you consider all of the traffic on our roads and how some people here seem to think that State laws and common sense don't apply on Frye Island. If you break the law, you will be ticketed.

Beach Committee

There will be a meeting of the Beach Committee on Monday, July 10th at 6:00pm at the Community Center. The public is welcome to attend.

The Beach Committee met on several occasions last season to finalize new rules for the beaches. The following rules were proposed last August and approved by the Executive Board. The new Beach Rules are as follows:

1. No open fires on beaches (*)
2. No camping overnight on beaches
3. No personal items left on beaches overnight
4. **No Dogs** on beaches between the hours of 10:00am to 5:00pm. (Must clean up after your dog(s)).
5. No powered watercraft left, or tied, up on beaches. Pick-up and drop offs only. (All power boats on Long Beach must have a Frye Island sticker).
6. Canoes, kayaks, rowboats, and paddleboats must be pulled up beyond sandy area, racked, or in designated areas only.
7. No littering. Use trash containers provided.
8. Moorings must be out beyond swimming areas, and must not cause interference with swim area barriers.

Are You On Time?

Did you miss the boat by seconds? Don't get mad, check the outside clock on the end of the ferry trailer, the ferry service strives to be an "on time" service and departs according to the "radio controlled" clock on the trailer. If the ferry is still within the slipway and the boat deck can accept an additional vehicle, without rearranging said vehicles, the captain will return to load you (this does not apply when two boats are running).

Contractors

The ferry will allow commercial vehicles to use the ferry during pre and post season weekends, (with some restrictions). Please get a new ferry schedule that lists these restrictions.

Remember that concrete trucks and oversize loads need to have prior clearance or they must wait until they can be transported without "bumping off of the ferry a property owner". Call the office to make arrangements.

Medical Emergency Procedure Dial 9-1-1

Your 9-1-1 call will be received at the Raymond Dispatch Center.

State your name, your location, and the nature of the emergency.

The Raymond Dispatch Center will dispatch the Frye Island Fire Department medical First Responders and Raymond Rescue. The Raymond Dispatch Center will also notify the ferry captain for an emergency run. This will occur during normal operating hours and during off-hours.

Time is critical in an emergency! Stay at your location until help arrives. Medical personnel are responding to your location. If you leave that location, you may bypass responding rescue personnel.

Fire Emergency: Dial 9-1-1

Your 9-1-1 call will be received at the Raymond Dispatch Center.

State your name, your location, and the nature of the emergency. Then **get out of the building if there is a fire.**

The Raymond Dispatch Center will dispatch the Frye Island and Raymond Fire Departments. Raymond Dispatch will also notify the ferry.

Note that all streets and fire lanes on the island are clearly marked. All owners and visitors should know the street, lot number, fire lane, and a nearby landmark where they are located in the event of a fire, medical, or police emergency. This information will greatly expedite the response time for the emergency service that is answering your call. Time is critical!


