# Town News

## **Island Manager's Comments**

Greetings Everyone,

**Ferry:** An incident on the Island ramp system on Tuesday damaged the apron (the yellow metal part) on the front of the ramp. An inspection by Frye Island staff and the design engineer determined that 4 out of the 6 brackets that hold the apron on to the ramp were damaged to some degree. It was also determined that heavy use of the system over the 15 years of service had fatigued the metal and contributed to the damage. On Wednesday a crew from Bancroft Construction Company removed a section of the top of the apron and repaired the two center brackets. On Thursday they returned and repaired the other two brackets.

The ferry crews did the best they could to keep ferry traffic going during the repair process but we did create some delays. I would like to thank everyone for their patience and cooperation while these repairs were in progress.

The apron on the mainland was redesigned and replaced two years ago. I have asked the engineer to provide me with a similar design for the island side so that I can get costs to fabricate and install a new apron at the same time we repair the hinge system this fall.

To date the ticket surcharge has added about \$35,400 to the ferry operating revenue. This projects to a surplus of approximately \$20,000 at seasons end. However, I have not factored the latest emergency repairs to the island ramp into these equations. I am guessing that that bill will be somewhere between \$5000 and \$10,000 dollars.

**Special Town Meeting:** Another reminder that there will be a special town meeting at **9:00 AM Saturday September 2<sup>nd</sup>** at the Community Center. The primary purpose is to vote on the future of the Growth Management Ordinance. The Board of Selectmen / Executive Committee (BoS / EC) previously held two hearings to get input on the existing ordinance. At its last meeting, the BoS / EC voted to present a warrant article at the special town meeting to rescind the Growth Management Ordinance. The Planning Board has decided not to present an article to revise the ordinance at this special meeting.

In addition, a warrant article to change the date of the annual town meeting from Columbus Day weekend in October to Labor Day weekend in September will be presented.

The Town Charter establishes the procedure for revising Land Use Ordinances and requires that all revisions to the Land Use Ordinances be approved by the Board of Island Trustees (BIT) before being presented to the registered Town voters. The Growth Management Ordinance is part of the Land Use Ordinances and therefore we must follow this procedure when considering any revision, including rescinding the Growth Ordinance in its entirety. Therefore, any warrant article which affects the Growth Management Ordinance will be presented to the BIT voters for approval first, if approved, the registered Town voters will then be able to vote on the article. If the BIT rejects the article, the registered Town voters will not be allowed to vote on the article and it will be considered defeated. If the BIT voters approve the article but the registered Town voters reject the article, it will be considered defeated. If both bodies approve the article it passes and becomes effective. I think that covers all of the possibilities.

In order to be a member of The Board of Island Trustees an individual must be a citizen of the United States, at least 18 years of age, and an owner, or a spouse of an owner, of real property located within the Town of Frye Island with a fixed home currently occupied by the person. There is a maximum two people per fixed home.

The initial hearing to present the draft budget will be held at 1:00 PM Saturday afternoon September 2<sup>nd</sup> instead of the morning because of the Special Town meeting.

**Board of Appeals:** The Board of Appeals meeting originally scheduled for Friday August 25<sup>th</sup> has been rescheduled for Saturday August 26<sup>th</sup> at 9:30 AM in the Community Center.

**Septic Tank Pumping Permit:** As I mentioned last week, we have initiated a Septic Tank Pumping Permit procedure. Most of the regular haulers are on board with the system and have already used the permit application. I will make sure to get a copy of the application to Joe Potts so he can make it available on our web site.

**Police and Safety:** Dana reports that he has been working with law enforcement officials from other communities and they now have a suspect in the thefts that have been going on around the island. The moped and many of the tools that were stolen have been recovered and the location where most of the materials that were stolen and sold for cash has been determined and the suspect has been identified.

## ***Medical Emergency Procedure Dial 9-1-1***

Your 9-1-1 call will be received at the Raymond Dispatch Center.

State your name, your location, and the nature of the emergency.

The Raymond Dispatch Center will dispatch the Frye Island Fire Department medical First Responders and Raymond Rescue. The Raymond Dispatch Center will also notify the ferry captain for an emergency run. This will occur during normal operating hours and during off-hours.

Time is critical in an emergency! Stay at your location until help arrives. Medical personnel are responding to your location. If you leave that location, you may bypass responding rescue personnel.

## ***Fire Emergency: Dial 9-1-1***

Your 9-1-1 call will be received at the Raymond Dispatch Center.

State your name, your location, and the nature of the emergency. Then **get out of the building if there is a fire.**

The Raymond Dispatch Center will dispatch the Frye Island and Raymond Fire Departments. Raymond Dispatch will also notify the ferry.


Note that all streets and fire lanes on the island are clearly marked. All owners and visitors should know the street, lot number, fire lane, and a nearby landmark where they are located in the event of a fire, medical, or police emergency. This information will greatly expedite the response time for the emergency service that is answering your call. Time is critical!




