Town News

Island Manager's Comments

Greetings Everyone,

Ferry: For once, we had a pretty uneventful week with the ferry service. The repairs made to the apron last week have held up well. We are still waiting for the new pulleys which, hopefully, will correct the problem with the ramp hanging up.

Ferry Tickets: I published this a few weeks ago for your information but it seems it should be restated. The issuance of complimentary ferry tickets as compensation for services provided is not a new practice but became a policy long before Frye Island became a town.

Complimentary tickets are currently issued to the following:

- Municipal officers: (Executive Committee, Appeals Board, Planning Board, and FII Board); as a way to say "thank you" for the many hours that they have to put in serving the Town. Many communities pay a stipend for these services.
- Store employees: Many years ago when FII owned the ferries and leased the store they realized the difficulty in getting a sufficient amount of help operating this business but felt that it was an important business for the island. In an effort to help the operators of the store provide this service to the residents and guest on the island at reasonable costs the Board included the issuance of complimentary tickets to store employees in the lease.
- Other Town organizations,(ie Fire Department, Garden Club, Conservation Committee, Golf Club) are issued complimentary tickets when they are providing a function for the Town. They are not issued for personal travel.
- Volunteer Workers: Have contributed greatly to the success of the island and, in fact, have completed many important tasks when no one else was available and /or when no funding was available. We have issued complimentary tickets, on a discretionary basis, to some of these volunteers as a way of saying thank you for their services.

In addition, free passage on the ferries has been granted to Town employees, Town deliveries Store deliveries, and Utilities (CMP, Septic Haulers, phone company etc). It is difficult enough getting and keeping good employees to work seasonally for the Town with absolutely no benefits. If we charged these employees to travel to the island daily, it would be necessary to either increase their wages to cover these costs or have the departments pay their fare which would result in an

increase in taxes. Again, a decision was made a long time ago to provide free transport to the island for these people. As stated before, this policy began back in the days of FII and MSC but in no way is it intended to be some sort of clandestine operation as has been eluded to by some.

Special Town Meeting: Don't forget the special town meeting at 9:00 AM tomorrow morning September 2nd at the Community Center. Aside from choosing a moderator, the only article on the warrant is to see if the Board of Island Trustees and the registered voters of Frye Island will vote to rescind the Growth Management Ordinance in its entirety effective on September 30, 2006. As I mentioned last week, the Planning Board determined at a previous meeting that they would not present a warrant article to amend the Growth Ordinance instead of rescinding it in its entirety. However, the Planning Board has gone on record to the Board of Selectmen/Executive Committee that it is in favor of retaining the current Growth Management Ordinance, while acknowledging its inconsistencies and potential unfair provisions. Mindful of this, the Planning Board will take steps to formulate an amended ordinance as soon as possible.

The warrant article to change the date of the annual town meeting from Columbus Day weekend in October to Labor Day weekend in September has been dropped because a public hearing to present this to the Town was not scheduled.

The Town Charter establishes the procedure for revising Land Use Ordinances and requires that all revisions to the Land Use Ordinances be approved by the Board of Island Trustees (BIT) before being presented to the registered Town voters. The Growth Management Ordinance is part of the Land Use Ordinances and therefore we must follow this procedure when considering any revision, including rescinding the Growth Ordinance in its entirety. Therefore, any warrant article which affects the Growth Management Ordinance will be presented to the BIT voters for approval first, if approved, the registered Town voters will then be able to vote on the article. If the BIT rejects the article, the registered Town voters will not be allowed to vote on the article and it will be considered defeated. If the BIT voters approve the article but the registered Town voters reject the article, it will be considered defeated. If both bodies approve the article it passes and becomes effective. I think that covers all of the possibilities.

In order to be a member of The Board of Island Trustees an individual must be a citizen of the United States, at least 18 years of age, and an owner, or a spouse of an owner, of real property located within the Town of Frye Island with a fixed home currently occupied by the person. There is a maximum two people per fixed home. The initial hearing to present the draft budget will be held at 1:00 PM Saturday afternoon September 2nd instead of the morning because of the Special Town meeting.

I urge all property owners to attend the meetings and provide your input.

Police and Safety: It appears that the thefts that occurred on the island have been solved but the vandalism continues. Early last Saturday morning, around 3 AM, someone threw tennis ball sized stones at John and Laura Crosby's home, damaging the siding and just missing their bedroom windows (which were probably their targets). It is a sad fact that we have people like this on the Island. It is even sadder when you wonder where the parents are. Even though they are young adults, one would think their parents would know and care where their kids are and what they are doing at 3 AM in the morning. If you know or hear anything about any of these acts of vandalism we would definitely appreciate your help apprehending the vandals.

“FREE FERRY TICKETS”

The next time you are on a full ferry, YOU could be the only full fare ticket! There is increased Islander resentment over the growing number of complimentary tickets given out (possibly well over \$20,000) for so-called “volunteer” services and store support. We now give tickets out for everything from attending a board of selectmen’s meeting to beer truck deliveries. According to reports, one individual has accumulated over 70 free ferry passes (\$12.00 x 70= \$840.) It has become increasingly difficult to respect the volunteer concept.

We do not give these tickets to other volunteers, such as: the Garden Club, Yacht Club/Quail Circle, Conservation Committee trail workers, Road & Beach trash picker uppers, Recreation and Sports events workers)

It is time to review this practice. There seems to be a need for an Island manager’s discretionary complimentary tickets fund (within general revenue) that is guided by the selectmen and approved as part of the budget process, with each ticket accounted for By NAME of recipient.

Since we bought on the Island in 1968, we were aware of a modest complimentary ticket program, but we now have an exploding program with little public disclosure and accountability.

This program may be subject to some criticism from the standpoint of proper Island announcement of this compensation. It would be helpful for the Island manager to outline the particulars of the present program at the Oct. general meeting and open the floor to questions.

Many Islanders believe that our store/café is an attractive addition, even though their personal use factor is minimal (25% by Islanders). We may have to review the compensation package (rent/utilities) along with the \$20,000. of complimentary tickets. Perhaps store prices should be raised so users pay as they go!

This letter’s purpose is to request SUNSHINE and informed discussion on this controversial issue.

FERRY FACTS

FACT: As of August 18th ‘island volunteers’ have worked on the ferry boats a total of 285 hours. 60 hours as captains and 225 hours as mates. Yes they do get a free ferry trip for every hour that they work. So lets do the math, 285 hours (worked) x \$12.00 (ticket price) = \$3420.00, so the cost to the ferry service is \$3420.00. Now, lets say that these same “volunteers” were put on the payroll at \$9.50 per hour (average mate pay), the town must pay FICA/Medicare, workman's compensation and unemployment insurance, this amount for a \$9.50 employee is an additional \$3.36 per hour for a total cost of \$12.86 per hour x 285 hours = \$3665.10 which is a savings to the town of \$245.10. We are also saving on the ferry salary budget the total of \$3665.10, so I am pretty sure that the town is making out okay giving the “volunteers free ferry trips”.

*NOTE: The savings are even greater if I deduct the \$2.00 surcharge that was put into effect after July 4th from volunteer tickets that were used before July 4th, Also I could have figured into the equation more money per hour for the 60 hours of volunteer boat captain. Also I did not keep track of the hours that I (John Crosby) personally worked as a mate on the ferry.

P.S. The “volunteer workers” are covered under the towns insurance if they are injured on the ferry, this same coverage is also used by the garden club, fire department, trail committee and other town organizations.

FACT: Volunteer ticket takers DO NOT get any tickets or free trips.

FACT: Without these “volunteers” we would have needed to cancel several ferry trips and possibly complete second boat shifts. What is that worth?

Without the volunteer ticket takers your wait for a ferry would have been longer.

FACT: Ferry mate is not an easy job, just ask any of our “volunteers”, better yet why don’t you all “volunteer” for a couple of hours collecting money and tickets, directing vehicles, connecting and disconnecting chains and cables during 90 degree temperatures, rain, wind, whitecaps, thunder, cold and Saturday renter arrivals.

FACT: Our Ferry employees deserve a THANK YOU for helping out with our “volunteer” program, they all did a great job training our “volunteers” and filling in when they could.

Barbecue Safety

- Use all barbecue grills away from the house. LP gas grills should be at least 3 feet from the building, away from doors, windows and any air intake vents.
- All LP gas cylinders with a capacity between 4-40 lbs. must be equipped with an overfill protection device (OPD).
- We recommend LP gas cylinders be ten (10) feet away from the house, especially when in use.
- LP gas is heavier than air and sinks. A leaky grill or cylinder could pose a serious hazard if leaking. Possible ignition sources include smoking materials, pilot lights, automobiles, compressors and heating or cooling units.
- Make sure that all connections are tight and secure.
- Supervise children whenever any type of grill is in use.
- Use only charcoal lighter fluid to start charcoal grills. **NEVER** use gasoline. Once the coals are lit, **NEVER** add lighter fluid to the fire, flames may travel up the stream resulting in serious burns.

Tips for Maintaining Wood Stoves and Fireplaces

Being educated about fireplaces and wood stoves before accidents happen can prevent serious loss of property and life. These safety tips can help you keep your fireplace or wood stove in safe operating condition during the cold weather.

Have the fireplace or wood stove professionally installed according to the manufacturer's guidelines and clearance requirements. Stoves and manufactured fireplaces should pass the test of a nationally recognized testing lab, such as Underwriter's Laboratories, or pass testing equal to UL testing standards.

Purchase a UL listed smoke detector for your house and have it properly installed.


Hopefully your house is already hard-wired for smoke detectors. Purchase a UL listed multipurpose fire extinguisher.

Use the proper fuel for the stove or fireplace. Burn only logs in a wood-burning stove, not paper or building material wood.

Make sure the ashes are completely cool before removal. Place them in a *noncombustible container* for disposal, preferably one not kept inside the house or garage.

Have a professional chimney sweep regularly clean the chimney to reduce creosote buildup.

Don't place furniture or household items on or near the stove during operation. Be safe when it comes to operating and maintaining your wood stove or fireplace!




