Island Manager's Comments

Greetings Everyone,

Ferry: We are still having difficulties lowering the ramps on both the island and the mainland gantries. It appears that the sheaves on the top of the gantries, which were replaced last year, are causing the problem. We saved the old sheaves and we plan to reinstall them on the mainland gantry **on Thursday the 21st** to see if this corrects the problem. It is important that we do this as soon as possible because the difficulties seem to be getting worse. **In order to do this we will have to shutdown all ferry service for about 4 hours.**

Therefore, the last ferry run on Thursday morning will be at 9:00 AM and will not resume until the work is complete. We anticipate this work will take 4 hours to complete. **Please plan your day accordingly!!!!**

The engineer is also finalizing the plans for the repair of the ramp bearings on the Island gantry and a new apron to replace the one on the island that was damaged previously. We plan to start this project as soon as the island closes for the season.

Taxes: We sent out the 30 day notices to all delinquent tax payers this week. The next step is to lien the property. This will be done to all properties that are not paid in 30 days. If you got a notice, please pay the taxes promptly to avoid the lien / foreclosure process.

Milfoil: We had a diver in Saturday to check the Marina and Quail Circle for Milfoil. This diver has been to the Island in the past and is qualified by the DEP to remove Milfoil. He reported that he did see some in both locations and would return after we get the appropriate permits from the DEP to remove the plants.

Elections: We will be holding elections for a selectman and representative to the Board of Island Trustees Executive Committee at the Columbus Day weekend town meeting. If you are interested in running for either of these offices please let the office know so that we can have you complete the volunteer form.

In order to be a candidate for a selectman's position, you must be a registered voter in the Town of Frye Island. In order to be a candidate for a position on the Board of Island Trustees Executive Committee you must be a citizen of the United States, at least 18 years of age, and an owner or a spouse of an owner of real property located within the Town of Frye Island with a fixed home currently occupied by the person.


