# Town News

## Island Manager's Comments

Greetings Everyone,

**Long Beach Marina & Quail Circle Canal:** Thursday, May 31<sup>st</sup> was the deadline to pay for your Long Beach Marina and Quail Circle slips. If you haven't paid by now we have probably already contacted you for payment. By policy, we can assign your annually rental slips to someone else so if you want to keep it, and you haven't paid I suggest you call the office immediately.

- Marina Equity Slips \$225.00
- Marina Rental \$900.00
- Quail Circle \$200.00

**Frye Island vs. the State of Maine:** There has been no change in our law suit vs. the State of Maine. Our suit challenges the constitutionality of the legislative action that denies the Town of Frye Island the opportunity to withdraw from a school district; a right that all other communities in Maine have as defined by the State Constitution. In addition, we challenged the exemption applied by legislative action that prevents the Town of Frye Island from using the student population as part of the formula for determining the amount of taxes to be paid to support education. The Town has stated on many occasions that it is not the intention of this law suit to NOT pay toward the education of Maine students, but only to be treated as all other communities in the State are.

**Special Referendum Vote:** There will be two referendum votes held on Tuesday June 12<sup>th</sup>. One vote is for the MSAD 6 budget for FY2007 – 2008. The other is a special State referendum containing 2 articles. The first seeks approval to issue bonds totaling \$112,975, 000 for improvements to highways, bridges, airports, etc. The second article seeks approval to issue bonds totaling \$18,300,000 to support drinking water programs and to support the construction of wastewater treatment facilities.

Sample ballots for both of these referendums are posted on the Town bulletin board, at the office, and on our web site.

Maine Election Law permits any **registered voter** to cast an absentee ballot. If you are a registered voter in Frye Island you may request an absentee ballot by completing the application on our web site or by calling the office at 207-655-4551 during normal business hours. The polls for the June 12<sup>th</sup> referendum will open at 10:00 AM at the Community Center and close at 8:00PM. All ballots, including the absentee ballots, will

be counted after the polls close. If you have any questions regarding this election please call the office.

**Board of Appeals:** We now have two openings on the Board of Appeals. If any one is interest in volunteering for this position, please call the office at 655-4551. This Board provides a very important service to the Town and to all of our residents. We certainly could use a few people to step up and volunteer for these positions.

**Meetings:** The next regularly scheduled meeting of the Board of Selectman / Executive Committee will be Saturday June 16th at 9:00AM at the Community Center. This meeting is open to the public.

The Board of Appeals has scheduled a meeting for Friday evening, June 8<sup>th</sup> at 7:30 PM at the Community Center. The agenda is posted on the Town bulletin board.

**Public Notice:** I would like to take a minute to remind everyone how we notify the public of meetings and other important events. We do this a little differently during the open season than when the island is closed. All year round, we post notices on our web site at [www.fryeisland.com](http://www.fryeisland.com). If you select documents in the drop down menu you will be able to follow the additional drop downs to get to the particular organization you are looking for. This will list the scheduled meetings. It will also allow you to view the minutes of previously held meetings. Quite frequently, there will also be a notice on the home page but the information on this page changes more frequently. Joe Potts, our webmaster, does an excellent job posting all schedules and notices in a timely and easy to access manner.

During the season when the Island is open, we also publish meeting notices in the FINS and they are posted on the Town bulletin board outside the entrance to the office. **Fire Works:** The fire works are scheduled this year on Saturday evening July 7<sup>th</sup>. Every year we get a number of calls asking what time the fire works display will be. That time is whenever the pyrotechnics technician feels it is dark enough. There is no specific time. The rain date has been set for Sunday the 8<sup>th</sup>. This is a non-budgeted event, so we need your donations to make it happen. You can make a donation to this event at the office.

**Reminder:** This year, like all others, we will have to move some of the boats out of the Marina for the fire

works. The slip numbers are from #84 on the beach side to the end and from #67 on the causeway side.

**Taxes:** We are approaching that time of year again when the second half of the taxes are due. You have until June 30<sup>th</sup> to pay before interest starts accruing. I realize that it is still a bit early, but if I start reminding you now, maybe you won't forget.

**Public Safety:** The Frye Island rescue responded to a medical emergency Sunday afternoon in which an Islander was injured in a Jet Ski accident. This provides a good opportunity to remind everyone about the potential dangers involved in boating and all other water activities. Boats and Jet Skis are getting larger and more powerful every year and the potential for accidents and serious injury is very prevalent. Please, when you are driving any boat or other personal watercraft, be very careful for your own safety and the safety of those around you.


## **Gasoline and Lawn Mowers**

- Gasoline vapors are highly flammable. They stay on your clothing and **can ignite** if you light a match or cigarette.
- Store gasoline only in an approved container, outside, or in a building or shed not attached to the house. **NEVER** keep gasoline inside the home.
- Keep gasoline away from all heat sources such as smoking materials, pilot lights, and grills.
- **NEVER** fuel a lawn mower while it is hot. Give it a few minutes to cool off before refueling.
- Keep your hands and feet away from the mower while it is running.

## **Burn First Aid**

- **Stop, drop and roll** to extinguish a clothing fire.
- Cool a burn. For minor burns, run cool water immediately over the burn.
- **Dial 9-1-1** to access emergency help for more serious burns.

This is the 5th year!!! Frye Island families will again have a chance to show their boat designing, building and racing skills when they enter the 2007 contest at Recreation Beach on **Sunday, July 8<sup>th</sup> at 3:00 PM.**

Open to residents of Frye Island and their extended families At least one of the boat builders must be a child 16 years of age or under.

Red Mill and possibly another lumber company will provide the materials.

Each family team will receive the same materials:

2 sheets of 1/4 inch lauan plywood, 4' x 8'

4 8 foot long 2 x 4's

1 pound 3 penny galvanized nails

4 tubes construction adhesive

Only these materials can be used to build the boat. Your own paint or decorations (or cloth if you make a sailboat) may be added.

Teams may pick up their supplies on the Island, at the old firebarn next to the Post Office, on Saturday, June 30<sup>th</sup>. Families will race their boats after the judging.

Judges will make awards for such things as best construction, originality, painting, creativity, sleekness, patriotism, etc. Every team is a winner!!!!

For a register form, call Mary Deming, 655-4133 or RuthAnne Bourque at 655-3593. A \$30 fee is required when registering with the form. \$25 will be returned when you enter your boat on the 8th of July for judging and the race.
