# Town News

## Island Manager's Comments

Greetings Everyone,

**Long Beach Marina & Quail Circle Canal:** We are finalizing the Marina and Quail Circle slip assignments and the waiting list. We will post it and publish it on our web-site as soon as we are finished. There are a number of conditions stated in the policy that warrant termination of a rental slip assignment. This isn't something that we relish doing but we have to be fair to everyone and enforce the policy as it has been approved. I have listed some of these conditions below but would suggest that you go to our web-site and review the whole policy if you haven't already.

- A. The Annually Renewable Slip will be terminated if it is not used for a boat owned by the owner or a member of the owner's immediately family. Immediate family shall mean the owner and owner's spouse, and their children, siblings and parents. This would mean if a slip renter is not using his or her slip for a boat, the rental will be terminated.
- B. If any conditions of slip assignment are not met, the Board may terminate the slip assignment. This shall include, but not be limited to:
  1. Non-payment or untimely payment of fees. Fees must be timely paid so that an orderly process of slip assignments can be maintained.
  2. Renting or permitting use of the slip by others, except as expressly provided for in the Policy.
  3. Non-compliance with the provisions of this Policy, provided notice of the non-compliance is given and the non-compliance is not corrected.
- C. If an owner no longer owns Property at the start of the boating season (between Memorial Day and docks out), the owner's slip assignment shall not be renewed unless the owner has a contract for purchase of another property.
- D. If an owner's Property is sold during the season, the slip assignment terminates and the slip is available for reassignment, unless the owner has purchased, has a contract for purchase of another Property, or has another property with an active building permit.
- E. The party purchasing the user's Frye Island real estate property does not have any rights to an Annually Renewable Slip assigned to the previous owner.
- F. If the individual uses an Annually Renewable Slip or a General Rental Slip as commercial venture (i.e.,

"re-renting" their rented slip), that individual's slip assignment will be terminated, effective immediately.

### Special Referendum Vote:

There will be two referendum votes held on Tuesday June 12<sup>th</sup>. One vote is for the MSAD 6 budget for FY2007 – 2008. The other is a special State referendum containing 2 articles. The first seeks approval to issue bonds totaling \$112,975, 000 for improvements to highways, bridges, airports, etc. The second article seeks approval to issue bonds totaling \$18,300,000 to support drinking water programs and to support the construction of wastewater treatment facilities.

Sample ballots for both of these referendums are posted on the Town bulletin board, at the office, and on our web site.

Maine Election Law permits any **registered voter** to cast an absentee ballot. If you are a registered voter in Frye Island you may request an absentee ballot by completing the application on our web site or by calling the office at 207-655-4551 during normal business hours. The polls for the June 12<sup>th</sup> referendum will open at 10:00 AM at the Community Center and close at 8:00PM. All ballots, including the absentee ballots, will be counted after the polls close. If you have any questions regarding this election please call the office.

**Volunteers:** We still need a few volunteers to help at the polls for this election. If you haven't already volunteered, and would like to help out, please call Lisa in the office at 655-4551.

**Board of Appeals:** We now have two openings on the Board of Appeals. If any one is interest in volunteering for this position, please call the office at 655-4551. This Board provides a very important service to the Town and to all of our residents. We certainly could use a few people to step up and volunteer for these positions.

**Town Employees:** I want to remind everyone that the Town Employees have been given priority on the ferry in the morning on their way to work and in the afternoon on their way home. We had an accident at the Island ferry landing last week when a motorist got upset when an employee was waved onto the ferry and the motorist backed into a vehicle in the line. So if you see an employee going to the front of the line please be patient and don't get upset.

**Bingo:** I am happy to report that Jackie Ossi and Neill Bovaird have volunteered to run the BINGO this summer, so we have applied for the license. If all goes well we will start BINGO on Monday July 1<sup>st</sup> and go every Monday through August. I will let you know the days and times once we get the license.

**Water System:** At the last BoS / EC the Board approved a project to replace the East Pump House. This is the water intake from the lake that feeds the treatment and distribution system. The existing building is literally falling apart. We are developing plans to present to the Planning Board for their review. Our plan to have the structure completed before the Island closes for the season so that we can relocate the pumps and make the piping connections after shutting down the water system for the winter.

We have also received a preliminary report from Camp Dresser and McKee. They were contracted to do a computer model of our water distribution system to identify how we should go about correcting known deficiencies and what we need to do to accommodate the anticipated build-out to 750 homes. It was interesting to note that the model indicated that the 2 inch diameter piping that is presently used is large enough for much of the distribution system but a different type of fusible plastic piping should be installed in order to reduce the restrictions created by the insertion type fittings in the existing piping. The model also identified where larger piping should be installed to accommodate future growth. I will keep you informed as the report is finalized.

**Transportation Committee:** The Transportation Committee was re-commissioned by the BoS to review their previous work, and to make recommendations to the Board of Selectmen and the Planning Board regarding long term solutions to our ferry and parking issues, as we progress to the 750 build-out.

**Fire Works:** The fire works are scheduled this year on Saturday evening July 7<sup>th</sup>. Every year we get a number of calls asking what time the fire works display will be. That time is whenever the pyrotechnics technician feels it is dark enough. There is no specific time. The rain date has been set for Sunday the 8<sup>th</sup>. This is a non-budgeted event, so we need your donations to make it happen. You can make a donation to this event at the office.

**Reminder:** This year, like all others, we will have to

move some of the boats out of the Marina for the fire works. The slip numbers are from #84 on the beach side to the end and from #67 on the causeway side.

**Taxes:** We are approaching that time of year again when the second half of the taxes are due. You have until June 30<sup>th</sup> to pay before interest starts accruing.

**Public Safety:** I really hate to have to say that we are continuing to get reports of thefts on the Island. Last week it was reported that a small outboard motor was cut off a boat on beach 5 and taken. Please help us. If you see or hear of anything that could help us solve this recent theft, call Dana at 655-2600.

## **STATE BUREAUCRACY DOES IT EVERY TIME**

Greetings,

The language (dictated by the State) of the two articles -- Article 2 and Article 4 -- of the MSAD6 Budget Referendum is confusing and it does not clearly represent the reality.

Article 2 asks the voters to say Yes or No to the \$35,316,122 for the total cost of education. Article 4 asks the voters to say Yes or No to the \$1,578,870 for additional local funds. This amount is not additional funds. This amount is essential to meeting the needs of educating 4,000+ students at Bonny Eagle. Article 4 is on the ballot because State does not fully fund its share of the cost of the education. In reality, the \$1,578,870 dollars is a shift of the costs from the state aid to taxpayers of the five towns.

Another problem with Article 2 is that one needs to do some thinking and arithmetic in order to learn how many dollars state contributes towards District's budget. Take the \$35,316,122 and subtract from this amount \$15,628,464 to get to the amount of state aid. This comes out to be \$19,687,658. However, there is a catch 22 in this deal. District's budget must include the full amount of the local contribution of \$15,628,464 in order to receive the full amount of the state aid.

There is also a hidden reality in Article 2. In 2006-2007 the percentage of required local dollars to dollars in the state aid was  $13,643,900/19,178,225 = 0.71$  or 71%. In 2007-2008, this percentage went up:

$15,628,464/19,687,658 = 0.79$  or 79%. This represents another shift of educational costs from the state aid to local taxpayers.

As my final note on the state government's attempts to fix the state budget at the expense of education, one should recognize that as of this date (6 June 2007) the amount of state aid of \$19,687,658 dollars is not firm. It is conceivable that people in Augusta may change it. One should not expect that it would go up, though.

Now a few words about the budget itself. Let the "fixing" that goes on in Augusta not distract us from the real need to educate kids. The proposed budget is a needs-based budget. No longer, the administration can ask "just a small increase" in this or that budget line. They must justify each line on the bases of needs for the forthcoming school year. Obviously, not all needs could be satisfied. The Budget Committee and Administration made many hard tradeoffs in order to keep down the inevitable increase in the total budget. You can learn details by going through the Power Point budget presentation on Frye Island web site or by picking up a copy of the budget handout at the Town Office.

Thank you for getting informed and participating on June 12 referendum. It is all about educating kids who will be competing, directly or indirectly, on a global scale for jobs.

## Summer Safety Tips

On extremely hot and muggy days, exposure to heat can lead to heat exhaustion and heat stroke. Seniors, infants and individuals in poor health are at greatest risk. Joggers and others who exercise outdoors are also at risk. The Frye Island Fire Department recommends the following prevention tips for beating the heat this summer.

- Stay out of the sun because sunlight increases body heat and sunburn prevents the release of body heat.
- Avoid jogging, or do it at night when it is cooler.
- Wear clothing that is lightweight, light-colored, and loose fitting.
- Drink plenty of water and cool, non-alcoholic beverages.
- Stay indoors; use a fan and air conditioning if possible.
- Eat light food and avoid high protein and high calorie foods, which increase body heat.
- Seek medical advice if you or someone you know becomes ill. If someone develops a high temperature, is flushed, and stops perspiring; bathe the person in cool water and seek medical advice immediately.
- Keep a flashlight with fresh batteries close by since blackouts often occur during extremely hot weather. Please remember that candles are a serious fire hazard.
- Check on elderly or infirm neighbors to see if they need help. Escort them to a "cool area" if necessary.



Teams may pick up their supplies on the Island, at the old firebarn next to the Post Office, on Saturday, June 30<sup>th</sup>. Families will race their boats after the judging.

Judges will make awards for such things as best construction, originality, painting, creativity, sleekness, patriotism, etc. Every team is a winner!!!!

## **Starting Women's Golf League**

This is intended for all levels of play. It's to have fun and enjoy each other's company, so don't be afraid to join us. So often we hear "Who wants to play golf, when's a good time?"

So, here are 3 suggestions - just follow the Notes; if 1 doesn't work for you, perhaps another will.

**NOTE 1:** Starting a Women's golf league!

We've got tee times booked starting this Saturday at 10:00 a.m.

We really do want all levels of play; we'll use your existing handicap, so it will be fair for everyone. (note, can only have up to 2 strokes on par 3's). \$5.00 per week.

Non-members may certainly join us, but will be liable for green and cart fees (as applicable.)

Please sign up on the glass door prior to 9:45 am on Saturday so we can assign teams and review the weekly format. (note, you can certainly play with whomever you wish except in the cases of the 'team' formats.)

This is all about fun, but hey, let's put a little extra incentive in it and play some formats that we usually don't get a chance to enjoy. We'll play every Saturday at 10 am, unless there's a tournament, then we'll play after the Sunday Scramble.

Week 1 - Score only even holes

Week 2 - N.O.S.E. (count scores on holes 9,1,6,7 and 8)

Week 3 - Score only odd holes

Week 4 - Score only putts

Week 5 - Short game - start from 200 marker (red tees on 4/8) and count score from there

Week 6 - Point Par (1 point for double bogey, 2 - bogey, 3-par, 4-birdie)

Week 7 - Team Scramble

Week 8 - Closed to Pin on 8

Week 9 - Closed to the Line on 7

Winnings will be in the form of pro shop credits.

**NOTE 2:** If the League time doesn't work for you, there are also individuals who have expressed an interest - starting Friday 6/30 - playing Fridays at 3:30. This is just a pick up game. We don't have tee times for this event.

**NOTE 3:** Ladies' Ringer

This is something we did 2 years ago to see what your true potential score can be. Everyone who participated in this fun event was pleasantly surprised at just how good they really can be. And I think we all improved our game. Here's how it'll work.

For your next round, score card must be placed on a scorecard, attested by a witness, and placed in the PROSHOP RINGER BOX with your \$3.00 one-time payment. Those scores will be entered onto a sheet and put on a Ringer Sheet on the glass door. Throughout the season, after every round, each player has the opportunity to improve her ringer score on each hole (per round).

When players come in from playing golf, they compare their new scores with their own ringer score and choose which holes to change (if any).

Her partners will cross out the old ringer score, mark in the new score and initial the change. The player has to make sure that she puts a ring round the score on that hole on her card (hence the "ringer"! ) to alert the Ringer Coordinator, and place the card in the Ringer Box.

This helps to encourage players so that if they did not have a very good round overall they can see that they have managed to improve their score on at least one hole.

To qualify for a ringer change a player must play at least 6 consecutive holes (if she has a 9 hole ringer score).


A nominal \$3.00 per player for the entire period (6/9 - 8/31) whomever improves the most will earn a PRO SHOP credit.
