Town News

Island Manager's Comments

Greetings Everyone,

Referendum Elections: Two referendum elections were held this past Tuesday. The first was a State referendum containing two bond issues. Both bond issues passed. The second referendum vote was for the SAD 6 budget. This referendum contained 6 budget articles. All of the articles passed except for Article 4 which requested additional local funds totaling \$1,578,870 for educational services not recognized by the States Essential Programs and Services model. These include costs for special education, transportation costs and fuel costs. The School Board is meeting on Monday June 18th to discuss their options to address the failed article. The details of the school elections are posted on the Town Bulletin Board and are available in the office for everyone that would like a copy.

Island Boards: I have advertised the past few weeks for volunteers to fill some of the vacant seats that we have on the Board of Appeals. In addition to the Board of Appeals, we also need volunteers for the Planning Board and in October, we will have two vacant seats on the three person Board of Selectmen to fill. When Frye Island voted to become independent from Standish in the late 1990's, a major reason stated was to have more "local control" of governmental issues. State Statutes give all Maine municipalities the right to "Home Rule". In other words we have the right to establish how we wish to conduct our municipal business within the guidelines established by the State. We did this when the Frye Island Town Charter was enacted. Well, with this "local control" comes the responsibility to staff these important governmental positions which we, as voters, established. It is time for more people to get involved.

Meetings: The following meetings have been scheduled

- Board of Selectman / Executive Committee on Saturday June 16th at 9:00 AM at the Community Center.
- Public Hearing: Saturday June 23rd at 8:30 AM at the Community Center.
- Planning Board on Saturday June 23rd at 9:00 AM at the Community Center.

All of these meetings are open to the public.

Public Hearing: The Planning Board will hold a Public Hearing on Saturday June 23rd to hear an application from the Town of Frye Island to construct a new Raw Water Pump House adjacent to the existing one on Ridge Road. This Public Hearing is being conducted as required by our Land Use Ordinances. This hearing is open to the public.

Bingo: I am happy to report that Jackie Ossi and Neill Bovaird have volunteered to run the BINGO this summer so we have applied for the license. If all goes well we will start BINGO on Monday July 1st and go every Monday through August. I will let you know the days and times once we get the license approved.

Water System: At the last BoS / EC meeting the Board approved a project to replace the East Pump House. This is the water intake from the lake that feeds the treatment and distribution system. The existing building is literally falling apart. We are developing plans to present to the Planning Board for their review. Our plan is to have the structure completed before the Island closes for the season so that we can relocate the pumps and make the piping connections after shutting down the water system for the winter.

We have also received a preliminary report from Camp Dresser and McKee. They were contracted to do a computer model of our water distribution system to identify how we should go about correcting known deficiencies and what we need to do to accommodate the anticipated build-out to 750 homes. It was interesting to note that the model indicated that the 2 inch diameter piping that is presently used is large enough for much of the distribution system but a different type of fusible plastic piping should be installed in order to reduce the restrictions created by the insertion type fittings in the existing piping. The model also identified where larger piping should be installed to accommodate future growth. I will keep you informed as the report is finalized.

Transportation Committee: The Transportation Committee was re-commissioned by the BoS to review their previous work, and to make recommendations to the Board of Selectmen and the Planning Board regarding long term solutions to our ferry and parking issues, as we progress to the 750 build-out. I will keep you informed of their progress.

Fire Works: The fire works are scheduled this year on Saturday evening July 7th. Every year we get a number of calls asking what time the fire works display will be. That time is whenever the pyrotechnics technician feels it is dark enough. There is no specific time. The rain date has been set for Sunday the 8th. This is a non-budgeted event, so we need your donations to make it happen. You can make a donation to this event at the office.

Reminder: This year, like all others, we will have to move some of the boats out of the Marina for the fire works. The slip numbers are from #84 on the beach side to the end and from #67 on the causeway side.

Taxes: We are approaching that time of year again when the second half of the taxes are due. You have until June 30th to pay before interest starts accruing.

Public Safety: I really hate to have to say that we are continuing to get reports of thefts on the Island. Last week it was reported that a small outboard motor was cut off a boat on beach 5 and taken. Please help us. If you see or hear of anything that could help us solve this recent theft, call Dana at 655-2600.

Food Safety

Pantry Storage

Unopened shelf stable foods such as canned goods, cereal, baking mixes, pasta, dry beans, mustard, ketchup and peanut butter can be kept safely at room temperature. To keep these foods at their best quality, store in clean, dry, cool (below 85°F) cabinets away from the stove or the refrigerator's exhaust. Extremely hot (over 100°F) and cold temperatures are harmful to canned goods.

Never use food from cans that are leaking, bulging, badly dented, or with a foul odor; cracked jars or jars with loose or bulging lids; or any container that spurts liquid when you open it. NEVER TASTE such foods. Throw out any food you suspect is spoiled. In general, most canned foods have a long "health life," and when properly stored, are safe to eat for several years;

- ★ Low-acid canned goods – use within 2 to 5 years (canned meat and poultry, stews, soups except tomato, pasta products, potatoes, corn, carrots, spinach, beans, beets, peas and pumpkin)/
- ★ High acid canned goods – use within 12 to 18 months (tomato products, fruits, sauerkraut and foods in vinegar-based sauces or dressings).
- ★ Some canned hams are shelf stable. Never store ham or any foods labeled "keep refrigerated" in the pantry. Such foods must be stored in the refrigerator.
- ★ All home canned foods should be used within one year.


Poultry Cooking Pointers

165°F Safe Minimum Internal Temperature for Cooked Poultry

On April 5, 2006, USDA's Food Safety and Inspection Service advised consumers that cooking poultry to a safe minimum internal temperature of 165°F will eliminate pathogens and viruses. All poultry should reach a safe minimum internal temperature of 165°F as measured with a food thermometer.

For whole chicken, turkey or duck, check the internal temperature in the innermost part of the thigh and wing and the thickest part of the breast.

For reasons of personal preference, consumers may choose to cook poultry to higher temperatures.

4th of July Frye Island Road Race - 1 mile & 5 mile Walk/Run

The recreation department will be hosting its annual walk/run on Sunday July 1. The race starts promptly at 10am at the Community Center, so please arrive 15-30min early to allow time to register and select a T-shirt. BOAT BUILDING and RACING CONTEST

This is the 5th year!!! Frye Island families will again have a chance to show their boat designing, building and racing skills when they enter the 2007 contest at Recreation Beach on **Sunday, July 8th at 3:00 PM.** Open to residents of Frye Island and their extended families. At least one of the boat builders must be a child 16 years of age or under.

Red Mill and possibly another lumber company will provide the materials.

Each family team will receive the same materials:

2 sheets of 1/4 inch lauan plywood, 4' x 8'

4 8 foot long 2 x 4's

1 pound 3 penny galvanized nails

4 tubes construction adhesive

Only these materials can be used to build the boat. Your own paint or decorations (or cloth if you make a sailboat) may be added.

Teams may pick up their supplies on the Island, at the old firebarn next to the Post Office, on Saturday, June 30th. Families will race their boats after the judging.

Judges will make awards for such things as best construction, originality, painting, creativity, sleekness, patriotism, etc. Every team is a winner!!!!

For a register form, call Mary Deming, 655-4133 or RuthAnne Bourque at 655-3593. A \$30 fee is required when registering with the form. \$25 will be returned when you enter your boat on the 8th of July for judging and the race.


