# Town News

## Island Manager's Comments

Greetings Everyone,

**Referendum Election:** Last week I mentioned that one of the articles in the SAD #6 budget referendum failed to pass. The School Board has decided to hold another referendum vote on the failed article only. This vote will be held on Tuesday July 24<sup>th</sup> at the Community Center. The polls will open at 10:00 AM and close at 8:00 PM. We will need ballot clerks and ballot counters for that day. If you are interested in volunteering for either of these tasks, please call Lisa in the office at 655-4551.

I have not yet received the warrant or the ballots. As soon as I do they will be posted. Absentee ballots will also be available for all registered Town voters.

**Ferry Service:** I was talking recently with a couple of Islanders about our ferry service and explained why I thought we provided one of the best and least expensive services anywhere. I know that there will be a number of people that disagree with me but let me give you a few examples of why I feel this way:

- **Frye Island Ferry:** runs a minimum of one round trip every ½ hour. Service begins at 7:00 AM every day, (Mondays we start at 6 AM for commuters), and runs until at least 7:00 PM every evening which we extend to midnight and 1:00 AM on the weekends. We charge property owners \$12.00 for a passenger vehicle and all of the occupants. In addition, we extend this discount to immediate family members and guests. Contractors and other non-property owners are only charged \$24.00 for a vehicle and all of its occupants. If we leave anyone at either terminal, we “shuttle” until all of the traffic is cleared up.
- **Casco Bay Lines:** operates a number of ferries to the islands in Casco Bay from its mainland terminal on Commercial Street in Portland. Only one of these ferries carries vehicles on a regular schedule and that ferry only services Peaks Island. A different ferry will service a few of the other islands but that is not on a regular schedule, it does not provide same day round trip service and requires advance reservations. This ferry carries cars and light pick-ups only and, between mid-April and Columbus Day, costs \$120.00 one way. The Peaks Island vehicle ferry has varying rates on different days of the week. Thursday, Friday, Saturday, and Sunday until 5PM the rate is \$80.00 for the vehicle and the driver. All other passengers pay the passenger fee of \$7.25 each. Children under 12 are \$3.60 each, and the

family dog is \$3.75. On the other days of the week the rate for the vehicle and the driver is \$60.00. This is about a fifteen minute trip. The other islands in Casco Bay are served by passenger ferries. The rates for these ferries vary from \$7.25 per person to \$11.00 per person. Children under 12 get a 50% discount. Peaks Island gets the most frequent service with the ferry running every hour between 5:45 AM to 11:30 PM. Not all of these are vehicle ferries. The other islands are serviced as few as 5 times per day and as many as 8 times per day. Commuter books containing 5 tickets are available at about 60% of the normal cost but they expire 2 weeks after the issue date. I can tell you from experience that if you miss the last ferry they will not make a special run and they do not shuttle if there is more traffic than they can handle.

- **Maine Ferry Service:** operates a number of ferries to islands in the Penobscot Bay area. Their ferries are combination vehicle and passenger ferries. Their runs vary from as short as 6 miles which takes about 40 minutes, to 23 miles taking 2 hours and 15 minutes. These islands are serviced as infrequently as 3-4 times a month to 6 times a day. Like the Casco Bay Lines, the cost per vehicle includes the driver only. All passengers must pay the passenger rate. Round trip passenger rates vary from \$6.50 per person to \$26.00 per person. Vehicles vary from \$19.25 to \$70.00 per vehicle. The space on the ferries is limited as well so they do take advanced reservations.
- In addition, with both the Casco Bay Lines and The Maine Ferry Service, there are parking fees required.

I met a select person from one of the islands recently and part of our discussion included a comparison of ferry services. A couple stories that I was told give you some idea about life on some of these islands. The first involved this select person. She happened to be in line to buy a ticket one day to leave the island. The rule is that if you leave the line for any reason you have to go to the back of the line. Apparently on one particular day she had almost reached the ticket agent when one of her constituents approached her to ask a question. She didn't really leave the line but did turn away to talk to her constituent and the line passed her by so she had to go to the rear of the line. By the time she got back to the ticket agent all of the vehicle tickets had been taken so she wasn't able to get off the Island until the next day.

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A second story involved the son of a very prominent political family that owned property on the island. This young man had been visiting his family on the island and on a Sunday afternoon had to return to the mainland to catch a flight back home. He had placed his luggage on the ferry as soon as he was allowed to board but left again to say a final goodbye to his parents. When the ferry captain blew the whistle indicating time for departure he headed for the ferry. Before he got there the ferry started pulling away from the dock and as loud as he yelled the ferry backed out of the dock area and took off leaving him standing on the dock with his luggage on the ferry. A \$150.00 water taxi ride later he got to the mainland, found his luggage but by now he had missed his flight. The long and the short of it is that we provide our property owners with a pretty good ferry service.

**Revaluation:** We recently received a draft copy of the State assessment for the Island for the 2008 tax year. Again our State assessed value has increased in excess of 25%. The assessed value determined by the State increased from \$141,600,000 in 2007 to \$179,100,000 in 2008. In addition, when our assessed values were compared to the fair market value as determined by recent property sales, our assessed values were only about 55% of the fair market value. It was recommended by the State assessor that we consider re-evaluating the properties on the Island and the Board of Selectmen agreed to have this done. This revaluation will include a review of all of the improved property on the Island as well as a review of the "Neighborhood Factors". These are the factors established in the real estate program that value the property itself based on its location and its attributes. These factors basically compare the waterfront property to the one-backs vs. the inland lots etc. The land values are relatively easy to identify but the dwellings are more difficult. In order to get a true value of your dwelling the assessor needs to have access to your home to confirm the information contained on the property cards. We need your cooperation to allow this to happen so that the revaluation will be as accurate as possible. Without being able to do this he will have to make assumptions which could be to your detriment. So it is very important that you cooperate in this effort. The new values will be used when the taxes are determined for the 2008 tax year. The revaluation will be conducted by Paul White with assistance from Jerry Daigle. Jerry used to be the assessor and CEO for Frye Island and is now the assessor for Waterboro. This revaluation will be funded by money remaining in the revaluation reserve from the 2003 revaluation and will begin immediately. I want to assure everyone that this revaluation shouldn't have a great impact on what you pay in taxes unless the value that has been assigned to your property is grossly inaccurate.

**Meetings:** The following meetings have been scheduled:

- Public Hearing: Saturday June 23<sup>rd</sup> at 8:30 AM at the Community Center.
- Planning Board on Saturday June 23<sup>rd</sup> at 9:00 AM at the Community Center.
- Board of Selectman / Executive Committee on Saturday, July 7<sup>th</sup> at 9:00 AM at the Community Center.

All of these meeting are open to the public.

**Public Hearing:** The Planning Board will hold a Public Hearing on Saturday June 23<sup>rd</sup> to hear an application from the Town of Frye Island to construct a new Raw Water Pump House adjacent to the existing one on Ridge Road. This Public Hearing is being conducted as required by our Land Use Ordinances. This hearing is open to the public.

**Bingo: We have experienced a bingo glitch!** The State of Maine, Department of Public Safety, has denied our application for a license to run bingo. The reason for the denial is because the non-profit corporation that previously ran the bingo, Frye Islanders Corporation, is under administrative suspension by the Secretary of State's office. I believe this is because most of the members of Frye Islanders Corporation have moved on and the corporation has not filed an annual report recently. We attempted to license the bingo under Frye Island Inc. but were unable to do so because FII is a "for profit" corporation and the State will not license "For Profits" to operate bingo. I will try to get this license snafu straightened out as soon as possible but it may interfere with the start of the bingo season. I will keep you informed of the progress.

**Transportation Committee:** The Transportation Committee was re-commissioned by the BoS to review their previous work, and to make recommendations to the Board of Selectmen and the Planning Board regarding long term solutions to our ferry and parking issues as we progress to the 750 build-out. The committee will be meeting with a naval architect next week to discuss what options might exist with our own ferries and what we might want to look at as we consider new ferries.

**Fire Works:** The fire works are scheduled this year on Saturday evening July 7<sup>th</sup>. Every year we get a number of calls asking what time the fire works display will be. That time is whenever the pyrotechnics technician feels it is dark enough. There is no specific time. The rain date has been set for Sunday the 8<sup>th</sup>. This is a non-budgeted event, so we need your donations to make it happen. You can make a donation to this event at the office. We have committed to \$5500.00 for the fire works display and to date we have \$2993 in donations and time is running out.

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**Reminder:** This year, like all others, we will have to move some of the boats out of the Marina for the fire works. The slip numbers are from #84 on the beach side to the end and from #67 on the causeway side.

**Taxes:** We are getting close to the due date for the second half of the taxes. You have until June 30<sup>th</sup> to pay before interest starts accruing.

## Heart Attack Warning Signs

Some heart attacks are sudden and intense, but most heart attacks start slowly, with mild pain or discomfort. Here are signs that can mean a heart attack is happening:

- **Chest discomfort.** Most heart attacks involve discomfort in the center of the chest that lasts more than a few minutes, or that goes away and comes back. It can feel like uncomfortable pressure, squeezing, fullness or pain.
- **Discomfort in other areas of the upper body.** Symptoms can include pain or discomfort in one or both arms, the back, neck, jaw or stomach.
- **Shortness of breath.** This feeling often comes along with chest discomfort. But it can occur before the chest discomfort.
- **Other signs.** These may include breathing out in a cold sweat, nausea or lightheadedness.

**If you or someone you're with has chest discomfort, especially with one or more of the other signs, Call 9-1-1 - Get to a hospital right away.**

If you're the one having symptoms, and you can't access the emergency medical services (EMS), have someone drive you to the hospital right away. Don't drive yourself, unless you have absolutely no other option.

## ROAD, FIRE LANE AND LOT NUMBERS

All owners and renters should know the road, fire lane and lot number where they are located in the event of a fire, medical or police emergency.

This information will greatly expedite the response time for the emergency service that is answering your call. Time is critical!

All road signs and fire lanes signs on the Island are clearly marked.

Every house, by town ordinance, shall have a lot number in large, contrasting colors that can be seen by emergency responders approaching from either direction.

If possible, a person should meet the emergency responders on the street and at night turn on all outdoor lighting.




