Town News

Island Manager's Comments

Greetings Everyone,

Referendum Election: Last week I mentioned that one of the articles in the SAD #6 budget referendum failed to pass. The School Board has decided to hold another referendum vote on the failed article only. This vote will be held on Tuesday July 24th at the Community Center. The polls will open at 10:00 AM and close at 8:00 PM. There will be an informational meeting at the Bonny Eagle Middle School, Sokokis Trail in Buxton at 7:00 P.M. on Tuesday July 10th. The warrant has been posted and absentee ballots are available in the office for those registered voters that are unable to get to the polls in person. We will need ballot clerks and ballot counters for that day. If you are interested in volunteering for either of these tasks, please call Lisa in the office at 655-4551.

Infrastructure: This week should have given, at least some, Frye Islanders an indication of how fragile some elements of our infrastructure really are. On Thursday, one of the two ferries was out of service for most of the day because of propeller problems. The Public Works and Ferry crews worked all day keeping one ferry operating even though it had water pump problems while a machine shop was making special parts for the other. While this was going on, the line of cars on the Island, trying to get off, got as long as 40 and was never less than 15. These lines lasted from 8AM until 4PM. I offer some numbers to think about. The maximum number of vehicles a ferry can move in one trip is 9. Considering the time it takes for loading, transit and off-loading, one ferry can average 3 trips per hour. This equals a maximum of 27 vehicles per hour that can be moved. With two ferries running that number doubles to 54. We now have about 480 homes on the Island. Most of those have a couple of cars each. We anticipate that an additional 250 homes will be built during the next 25-30 years. Assuming that most of those will also have two vehicles in their driveways, we could have as many as 1500 vehicles on the Island. If half of those vehicles want to leave on a Sunday afternoon to return home, the existing ferry service could take as long as 14 hours with both ferries shuttling to get all of the vehicles off. With one ferry out of service this time would double. When you consider the fact that the boats have endured 40 years of service, the engines are 25 years old and the gantry systems are 15+ years old, it becomes very obvious that something has to be done, and done soon, to insure we have a reliable service for the future. As the

Transportation Committee has stated, "the ferries are our lifeline". Without them, access to the Island would be almost non-existent and our investments would become worthless. This is why the Transportation Committee is working diligently to develop recommendations for long term improvements to the ferry service. The "status quo" is not going to cut it!!!!

The other issue this week was the water system. A number of homes had very little water pressure if they had water at all. When we tried to increase the water pressure in the system, the 40 year old lines started to fail. The Public Works crews have worked day and night to repair water system failures. We had an engineering firm evaluate our system and make recommendations for improvements. These recommendations include replacing a good portion of the distribution lines along the main roads and increasing the line sizes to accommodate future growth. An estimate to accomplish this totaled 3 million dollars. We are reviewing this now to see what, if anything, can be done to reduce these costs. This, like the ferry service, requires immediate action if we are to be able to continue to provide these services as our Island grows and the population increases.

Meetings: The following meetings have been scheduled:

- Board of Selectman / Executive Committee on Saturday, July 7th at 9:00 A.M. at the Community Center.
- Zoning Board of Appeals on Friday, July 13th at 7:00 P.M. at the Community Center.

These meetings are open to the public.

Bingo: We still have not been able to resolve the BINGO issues but we are continuing to try. I will keep you informed.

Transportation Committee: Members of the Transportation Committee met last week with a naval architect to get some insight into what options we may have with our existing ferries as we attempt to look into the future and what different types of ferries we may want to consider for the long term. I have received a proposal from him to accomplish this evaluation, and have forwarded it to the Committee for their review. If this covers all of the issues that we discussed, which it appears to, I will authorize this study to begin as soon as possible.

Fire Works: HELP!!! The fire works display has been scheduled for Saturday July 7th. This is a non-budgeted event, so we need your donations to make it happen. We have committed to \$5500.00 for this years display and to date we have only collected \$3966. We need a lot of help these final days to get the money we need to support the fire works display this year and to continue the fire works display in the future. If you haven't contributed, please stop in at the office and make a donation so that we can continue this enjoyable event.

Reminder: This year, like all others, we will have to move some of the boats out of the Marina for the fire works. The slip numbers are from #84 on the beach side to the end and from #67 on the causeway side. The State Fire Marshall will not allow us to even set up the fire works display with boats in these slips. It is the boat owners' responsibility to move his / her boat. If the Town has to move a boat, the owner will be fined and the Town is NOT responsible for any potential damage.

Water System: The Planning Board held a public hearing last Saturday to review the Town's site plan and application to construct a new pump house on Ridge Road adjacent to the existing pump house. Following a presentation by Paul White and John Crosby, and a question and answer period, the Planning Board approved the site plan allowing the Town to begin construction on the new building. The goal is to complete construction this summer so that the pumps and equipment can be transferred to the new building after the Island is closed and the water system is shut down for the season.

Taxes: This is it!!! If your taxes are not paid by now your account has started accruing interest. The next step in the process is the lien process. Those notices will be issued in September.

Board of Appeals: We still have an opening on the Board of Appeals. If any one is interested in volunteering for this position, please call the office at 655-4551. This Board provides a very important service to the Town and to all of our residents. We certainly could use a few people to step up and volunteer for these positions.

Town Wide Assessment Review:

The review of all real property on the Island will take place during the months of July, August, September and part of October. The review will require access to the property for an exterior and interior analysis. To accomplish this task the plan is to divide the Island by Tax Maps. The Island has three tax maps (60, 61 and 62). You can identify your tax map by either checking the wall map in the Assessor's Office or by checking your tax bill. Property/Lots appearing on: Tax map 60 will be reviewed in July, Tax Map 61 will be reviewed in August, Tax Map 62 will be reviewed in September.

Each lot may not require an interior review, but in the event a review is necessary and not made a card will be left on the property, usually on the door knob. If you find a card call the office and make arrangements for a review. Contact information will be on the card.

Otherwise feel free to call the Assessor's office and leave times that are good for you. If your property is rented please leave word with the renter for permitting access.



Fire Department Notice

Rules pertaining to the use of open fires in screened enclosures and chimeneas.

Open fires in a screened enclosure designed for such use or chimenea are permitted under the following conditions:

- The device must be used only on an acceptable permit-required burn day within the state. (A permit will not be necessary to use the device, but it can only be used on a day on which burning is allowed.)
- The device must stand on sand or dirt in a wide-open area to prevent any spread of fire.
- The device must be placed away from any structure and **cannot** be situated on a porch, deck, or other similar area.
- The device must be continuously monitored by an adult.
- A fire hose or bucket of water must be nearby.

Anyone using one of these devices accepts **full responsibility** for their actions if a mishap occurs.

The fire department has the authority to extinguish any fire that constitutes a hazard.


Violators of these rules will be reported to the Maine Forest Service, Forest Protection Division, for disciplinary action.


