Island Manager's Comments

Greetings Everyone,

Referendum Election: The SAD 6 referendum vote was held on Tuesday, July 24th. The only article on the warrant was a request for an additional \$1,558,870 in local funds to cover educational services not covered by the States Essential Programs and Services funding. This article failed in the original referendum election held on June 12th but passed this time. The results were as follows:

Bingo: There is still no good news for BINGO. We have not heard from the State regarding the reactivation of Frye Islanders Corporation. As soon as we do, we will reapply for the license.

Milfoil: There has been some milfoil identified at Quail Circle and also at the Long Beach Marina. We have a permit from the Department of Environmental Protection to remove it. The stipulation is that the removal has to be done by people certified by them to remove milfoil. Larry Pilotte, a certified diver that is also certified to remove Milfoil, has been working Frye Island for a number of years. He has already begun in the Quail Circle area and will continue this project through the rest of the summer.

Marina: I have received a copy of the application that was submitted to the Department of Environmental Protection for dredging the inlet to the Long Beach Marina. This was done about 5 years ago with a "Permit by Rule" from the DEP. This year we were required to get a full permit and contracted with Main-Land Development Consultants, Inc. to prepare the permit application for us. Main-land did the initial work when the Marina was developed. The plan is to do the dredging after the Island closes in the fall when the

water level is lower and the boats have been removed if we can wait that long. Our goal is to accomplish the dredging with as little impact on the boaters as possible.

Transportation Committee: The Naval Architect has begun his structural analysis of the ferries. When finished, he will provide us with an estimate of the remaining useful life of the ferries. He will also provide us with possible modifications to the ferries to increase the deck space in an effort to improve safety during the loading and unloading processes. It is doubtful that the deck space will be able to be increased enough to change the vehicles capacity much, if at all. He, the Naval Architect, will also be providing us with general information on new ferries, including passenger ferries, with cost estimates, if we determine that this is the approach we want to take in the future. In addition, the Transportation Committee will be meeting with a site planner to identify potential uses of the Willis property for parking and ferry office space. He, the site planner, will also look at the existing ferry terminal to identify possible modifications should we decide to proceed with some sort of a passenger ferry.

Thanks to Dave Bond, a Frye Islander, we have learned of the Ferry Boat Discretionary Program, administered by the Federal Highway Administration, This program provides a special funding category for the construction of ferry boats and ferry terminal facilities. The Federal share of the costs for any project eligible under this program is 80%, meaning we could potentially get new ferries and facilities for just 20% of the total cost. All indications, so far, are that we MAY, (key word) be eligible to participate in this program. However, before we can even submit an application, we must have a detailed plan that identifies the deficiencies in our existing system, which the Transportation Committee has already done an excellent job at, including the safety issues, and our plan for correcting these issues both near and long term with all the associated costs. This is where the consultants come in. IF, (another key word) we are accepted into the program, we would be able to implement the plan in phases. The next deadline for submitting applications is March 2008. I am not sure that we can have everything put together by then but we will be trying. This will be presented to the Town before we actually submit anything.

Fire Works: We have received a few more donations for the 4th of July fireworks display; however, we are still short by \$458.00 so if you haven't contributed, we will gladly accept your donations. Next year is Frye

Islands 10th birthday and we were hoping to have some special activities including a larger fireworks display but it doesn't look too probable seeing we can't get the existing display funded.

Water System: In the past, I have mentioned some of the deficiencies in the water system and I want to remind everyone that the Executive Committee passed an emergency policy at its meeting on Saturday July 7th restricting the hours for outside watering. The policy is as follows:

The watering of lawns, from the town water supply system, is only allowed between the hours of 10:00 PM and 05:00 AM. The washing of cars is limited to the hours between 10:00 AM and 02:00 PM.

Please help all of your fellow islanders by abiding by this new policy.

Walking Trails: A number of people have asked for maps of the walking trails. A map is available on the fryeisland.com website by going to Documents > Town Documents > Island Maps. You can print one of these maps for your use. We can also print one for you at the office if you do not have computer access on the Island.

Frye Island Memorabilia: Wini Rogers has started collecting Frye Island memorabilia which she hopes to put on display for all to view. If you have any old items or photos that show Frye Island, during the good ole days, please contact Wini. Photos can be scanned and returned so you don't have to give them up but you could share them with others. In addition, the Portland Water District (PWD) is looking for photos of the lake for inclusion in a new lake map they are generating to commemorate their 100th anniversary in 2008. If you have anything that could be included in this map you can contact Lynn Richards at the PWD, 207-774-5961 ext 3324 or at lrichard@pwd.org. You can also contact Wini for this as well and she will coordinate with Lynn.

Vandalism: We had some vandalism at the golf course this week and we were able to find the young adults that caused the damage. Though I can't condone their actions, it was refreshing to have all of them admit their transgression and accept responsibility for their actions. Think how much better this world would be if more people would do the same.....Oh, these young adults will be working a little community service at the Golf Course as retribution for their actions.

Golf Carts: It appears time to remind everyone about some of the laws regarding the use of golf carts on the Island roads again. The most important of these is that in order to drive a golf cart you must have a valid drivers license. The laws and fines that apply to driving golf carts are the same as any other motor vehicle. These are not Frye Island laws, they are State of Maine laws. I have also had reports of adults driving golf carts with infants and/or very young children on their laps. This not only violates the law, it is extremely dangerous to the child. A sudden stop, for what ever reason could result in very severe injury to a child. Remember, the ability to use golf carts on our public ways is a privilege granted by the State. Abuse of this privilege could result in its loss.

Town Wide Assessment Review:

The review of all real property on the Island will take place during the months of July, August, September and part of October. The review will require access to the property for an exterior and interior analysis. To accomplish this task the plan is to divide the Island by Tax Maps. The Island has three tax maps (60, 61 and 62). You can identify your tax map by either checking the wall map in the Assessor's Office or by checking your tax bill. Property/Lots appearing on: Tax map 60 will be reviewed in July, Tax Map 61 will be reviewed in August, Tax Map 62 will be reviewed in September. Each lot may not require an interior review, but in the event a review is necessary and not made a card will be left on the property, usually on the door knob. Contact information will be on the card. Otherwise feel free to call the Assessor's office and leave times that are good for you. If your property is rented please leave word with the renter for permitting access.



Protection Against Mosquitoes

- Avoid places and times when mosquitoes bite. Generally, peak biting periods for the type of mosquitoes capable of transmitting WNV occur just before and after sunset and just before dawn.
- Apply insect repellent containing 25-35% DEET when you're outdoors.
- Assure door and window, patio and porch screens are tight-fitting and in good repair.
- Wear long-sleeved tops, long pants, socks and shoes and clothing made of tightly woven materials to keep mosquitoes away from skin. Light colored clothing is best.
- Eliminate stagnant water in bird baths, ponds, flower pots/trays/saucers, water fountains and water features and get rid of tires, buckets or other receptacles that could serve to contain water where mosquitoes might breed.
- Be sure to check clogged gutters and flat roofs that may have poor drainage.
- Make sure cisterns, cesspools, septic tanks, rain barrels and trash containers are covered tightly with a lid or with 16-mesh screen.
- Level the ground around residence so water can run off and not collect in low spots. Fill in holes or depressions near the building that accumulate water.
- Fill in tree rot holes and hollow stumps that hold water.
- Stock ornamental water gardens with fish (e.g. minnows, "mosquito fish" or goldfish) that eat mosquito larvae.
- Treat small pools of water with "Bti", a bacterial insecticide. Many hardware stores carry doughnut-shaped Bti briquettes (Mosquito Dunks) for this purpose. Be sure to follow the insecticide label exactly.
- Keep weeds and grass cut short; adult mosquitoes look for these shady places to rest during the hot daylight hours.
- Bird and wild game hunters should follow the usual precautions when handling wild animals and birds. They should wear gloves when handling and cleaning birds or animals to prevent blood exposure to bare hands.


