## Island Manager's Comments

Greetings Everyone,

**Bingo:** We have received notice that Frye Islanders Corporation has been reinstated by the Secretary of State's office. However, it is now getting too late in the season to apply for the bingo license. It typically takes a couple of weeks to receive the license which would only allow one, maybe two dates to conduct bingo so I don't think it is worth proceeding with this year. I will insure that Frye Islanders Corporation remains active going forward so we will be able to get the license and conduct bingo next season. I apologize to all of the bingo players for this snafu.

**Ferries:** An issue has come up recently concerning the delivery of packages to Frye Islanders. We receive upwards of 4 to 5 package deliveries a day from the delivery services, (UPS, FedEx, DHL, etc). Each one provides a number of delivery options, i.e. overnight, express, ground etc, and each one is delivered by a different truck and driver. With the increase in internet shopping, the volume of packages has really increased in recent years. In addition, the types of packages have changed. The packages delivered now range everywhere from household appliances, to frozen foods, prescription drugs and urgent letters. It is not unusual to receive 40 to 50 packages a day now. This has created difficulties for both the ferry crews and for Islanders. The ferry crews because it has really increased their work load and Islanders because of delays in receiving their deliveries. Most of the packages we receive are shipped regular ground and arrive at the ferry office between 3 PM and 5 PM. Monday through Friday. This also happens to be one of the busiest times of the day for the ferry crews and quite often they are not available to receive the packages when delivered. Because the ferry trailer is locked when the crew is not there, the packages are usually left outside. Because of this practice, some packages have been reported missing. In fact, some packages that were known to have been delivered to the Island Post Office have been reported missing. In light of these issues and because most of the packages are shipped UPS ground, I contacted UPS to see if we could

make different arrangements. They are willing, on a trial basis, to allow their truck to deliver directly to the Island Post Office. In order to accomplish this I had to agree to give their truck priority on the ferry similar to the way we treat the US mail carrier so if you see the UPS truck jumping the ferry lines don't get upset, we had to do this in order to get this service. Please help us help you by adhering to the following:

1. **The ferry crews are not responsible for the delivery of packages to an individual. Even if they have to sign for them, they are typically signing for a large quantity of packages and they do not have the time to check through each one to insure that it is in the lot they signed for or if there are special delivery instructions. In addition, once they are delivered to the post office a number of people have access to those packages and in fact, some that were seen being delivered to the post office have disappeared.**
  2. **If you are expecting an urgent or special delivery package you should notify the ferry office during the day when the clerk is in. If it arrives during her shift she will attempt to contact you and make arrangements for pickup. You can either meet the ferry on the Island if they can bring the package right over or you will be allowed free walk on passage to retrieve the package from the ferry office. You should be able to go on-line to see when your package has been released for delivery.**
  3. **If you have very large or heavy packages delivered to the ferry office, the clerk will attempt to contact you so that you can go to the trailer to retrieve your package. We have very limited space in the ferry office and in the post office for storing these packages.**
  4. **UPS ground shipments will be delivered to the Island Post Office between the hours of 3 PM and 5 PM, Monday through Friday.**
  5. **All other packages will be delivered to the post office around 6 PM on the day they arrive at the ferry office. We have arranged to have one of the island employees pick up the packages at the ferry office and deliver them to the post office every evening. We decided to wait until 6 PM to insure that we have all of the daily deliveries so that we only have to do this once a day.**
  6. **Please make sure the door is closed behind you.**
- We appreciate your cooperation to help make this work for everyone.**

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**Beaches:** I have been asked to remind everyone about the rules that have been established for using the beaches.

#### BEACH RULES

1. No open fires on beaches.
2. No camping overnight on beaches.
3. No personal items left on beaches overnight.
4. NO DOGS on beaches between the hours of 10:00 am and 5:00 pm. (Must clean up after your dogs)

*I have heard complaints recently about dogs on the beaches and owners not cleaning up after them. Come on folks, this is just common sense and common courtesy. The beach committee is looking into the purchase of "baggy dispensers" for this purpose but in the mean time; please clean up after your pet.*

5. No powered watercraft left or tied up on beaches. Pick-up and drop-offs only. (All power boats on Long Beach must have a Frye Island sticker).

*If you use the beach areas for boating please make sure that you have an appropriate Frye Island sticker on your boat. Acceptable stickers include marina slip stickers (Long Beach Marina or Quail Circle) and Frye Island Property Owner stickers which are available in the office.*

6. Canoes, kayaks, rowboats, and paddleboats must be pulled up beyond sandy area, racked, or in designated areas only.
7. No littering. Use trash containers provided.
8. Moorings must be out beyond swimming areas, and must not cause interference with swim area barriers.

#### VIOLATORS WILL BE SUBJECT TO FINES

**Fire Works:** The account for the 4th of July fireworks display remains \$458.00 short, so if you haven't contributed, we will gladly accept your donations. Next year is Frye Islands 10<sup>th</sup> birthday and we were hoping to have some special activities including a larger fireworks display but it doesn't look too probable seeing we can't get the existing display funded.

#### **Walking Trails**

A number of people have asked for maps of the walking trails. A map is available on the fryeisland.com website by going to Documents > Town Documents > Island Maps. You can print one of these maps for your use. We can also print one for you at the office if you do not have computer access on the Island.

#### **Town Wide Assessment Review:**

The review of all real property on the Island will take place during the months of July, August, September and part of October. The review will require access to the property for an exterior and interior analysis. To accomplish this task the plan is to divide the Island by Tax Maps. The Island has three tax maps (60, 61 and 62). You can identify your tax map by either checking the wall map in the Assessor's Office or by checking your tax bill. Property/Lots appearing on: Tax map 60 will be reviewed in July, Tax Map 61 will be reviewed in August, Tax Map 62 will be reviewed in September.

Each lot may not require an interior review, but in the event a review is necessary and not made a card will be left on the property, usually on the door knob. Contact information will be on the card. Otherwise feel free to call the Assessor's office and leave times that are good for you. If your property is rented please leave word with the renter for permitting access.

## ***Medical Emergency Procedure***

### ***Dial 9-1-1***

Your 9-1-1 call will be received at the Raymond Dispatch Center.

State your name, your location, and the nature of the emergency.

The Raymond Dispatch Center will dispatch the Frye Island Fire Department medical First Responders and Raymond Rescue. The Raymond Dispatch Center will also notify the ferry captain for an emergency run. This will occur during normal operating hours and during off-hours.

Time is critical in an emergency! Stay at your location until help arrives. Medical personnel are responding to your location. If you leave that location, you may bypass responding rescue personnel.


## ***Fire Emergency: Dial 9-1-1***

Your 9-1-1 call will be received at the Raymond Dispatch Center.

State your name, your location, and the nature of the emergency. Then **get out of the building if there is a fire.**

The Raymond Dispatch Center will dispatch the Frye Island and Raymond Fire Departments. Raymond Dispatch will also notify the ferry.

Note that all streets and fire lanes on the island are clearly marked. All owners and visitors should know the street, lot number, fire lane, and a nearby landmark where they are located in the event of a fire, medical, or police emergency. This information will greatly expedite the response time for the emergency service that is answering your call. Time is critical!
