## **Island Manager's Comments**

Greetings Everyone,

**Meetings:** The following meetings have been scheduled: (Also see page 5 for more meetings).

Saturday September 1<sup>st</sup>, 10:00AM at the Community Center, Public Hearing to present the first draft of the 2008 Municipal budget.

Saturday September 1<sup>st</sup>, 9:00 AM at the Community Center, FII Stockholders annual meeting

**Ferries:** Last week I explained an issue that has developed concerning the delivery of UPS, FedEx, and other packages to the Island Post Office. I had discussed this issue with a local supervisor from UPS and he had agreed to deliver the packages directly to our post office. I had no sooner written this in last weeks FINS when I got a call from the gentleman that manages this area for UPS. He was coming over on the next ferry to discuss this with me. He explained the very tight time schedule that his drivers are following and that they would not be able to take the 20 to 30 minutes to deliver to the Island. Therefore, I apologize for the misinformation and have corrected the following procedure that we will use:

**The ferry crews are not responsible for the delivery of packages to an individual. Even if they have to sign for them, they are typically signing for a large quantity of packages and they do not have the time to check through each one to insure that it is in the lot they signed for or if there are special delivery instructions. In addition, once they are delivered to the post office a number of people have access to those packages and in fact, some that were seen being delivered to the post office have disappeared.**

**If you are expecting an urgent or special delivery package you should notify the ferry office during the day when the clerk is in. If it arrives during her shift she will attempt to contact you and make arrangements for pickup. You can either meet the ferry on the Island if they can bring the package right over or you will be allowed free walk on passage to retrieve the package from the ferry office. You should be able to go on-line to see when your package has been released for delivery.**

**If you have very large or heavy packages delivered to the ferry office, the clerk will attempt to contact you so that you can go to the trailer to retrieve your package. We have very limited space in the ferry office and in the post office for storing these packages.**

**All other packages will be delivered to the post office around 6 PM on the day they arrive at the ferry office. We are arranging to have an islander pick up the packages at the ferry office and deliver them to the post office every evening. We decided to wait until 6 PM to insure that we have all of the daily deliveries so that we only have to do this once a day. We appreciate your cooperation to help make this work for everyone.**

**Frye Island Incorporated:** The annual Stockholders meeting for Frye Island Incorporated (FII) will be held on Saturday September 1<sup>st</sup> at 9 A.M. in the Community Center. At this meeting, FII stockholders (all property owners) will have an opportunity to vote for the Board of Directors. The Board consists of 5 Directors, each serving a one year term. Of the five incumbents, two of those, Joe Potts and Ed Charrette have expressed a desire to run for election again. Therefore, there will be at least 3 vacancies. If you are interested in becoming a candidate for the FII Board, please call the office. In addition, we are asking all candidates to complete a "Volunteer Form". This is available on the Frye Island web site or at the office. I will publish the names of the candidates as we receive them.

**Selectmen:** On Saturday, October 6<sup>th</sup>, we will have the annual Town Meeting. In addition to voting on the budget, we will be electing new Selectmen. This year we will have two (2) vacancies on the Board. One vacancy is for a one year term to replace Mr. Kuiken who resigned last year. The other vacancy is to replace Mr. Walker who has decided not to be a candidate again. In order to run for one of these vacant positions all candidates must be registered to vote in the Town of Frye Island. In addition, in order to vote for selectmen, you must be registered to vote in Frye Island. I realize that we still have some time before the October election but I want to have plenty of time to give all potential candidates an opportunity to make themselves known.

**Year End Report:** Copies of the 2006 year end financial report are available in the office for your review.

---

**Beaches:** I have been asked to remind everyone about the rules that have been established for using the beaches.

#### BEACH RULES

1. No open fires on beaches.
2. No camping overnight on beaches.
3. No personal items left on beaches overnight.
4. NO DOGS on beaches between the hours of 10:00 am and 5:00 pm. (Must clean up after your dogs)

*I have heard complaints recently about dogs on the beaches and owners not cleaning up after them. Come on folks, this is just common sense and common courtesy. The beach committee is looking into the purchase of “baggy dispensers” for this purpose but in the mean time; please clean up after your pet.*

5. No powered watercraft left or tied up on beaches. Pick-up and drop-offs only. (All power boats on Long Beach must have a Frye Island sticker).  
*If you use the beach areas for boating please make sure that you have an appropriate Frye Island sticker on your boat. Acceptable stickers include marina slip stickers (Long Beach Marina or Quail Circle) and Frye Island Property Owner stickers which are available in the office.*
6. Canoes, kayaks, rowboats, and paddleboats must be pulled up beyond sandy area, racked, or in designated areas only.
7. No littering. Use trash containers provided.
8. Moorings must be out beyond swimming areas, and must not cause interference with swim area barriers.

#### **Walking Trails**

A number of people have asked for maps of the walking trails. A map is available on the fryeisland.com website by going to Documents > Town Documents > Island Maps. You can print one of these maps for your use. We can also print one for you at the office if you do not have computer access on the Island.

#### **Town Wide Assessment Review:**

The review of all real property on the Island will take place during the months of July, August, September and part of October. The review will require access to the property for an exterior and interior analysis. To accomplish this task the plan is to divide the Island by Tax Maps. The Island has three tax maps (60, 61 and 62). You can identify your tax map by either checking the wall map in the Assessor’s Office or by checking your tax bill. Property/Lots appearing on: Tax map 60 will be reviewed in July, Tax Map 61 will be reviewed in August, Tax Map 62 will be reviewed in September. Each lot may not require an interior review, but in the event a review is necessary and not made a card will be left on the property, usually on the door knob. Contact information will be on the card. Otherwise feel free to call the Assessor’s office and leave times that are good for you. If your property is rented please leave word with the renter for permitting access.


## **Barbecue Safety**

- Use all barbecue grills away from the house. LP gas grills should be at least 3 feet from the building, away from doors, windows and any air intake vents.
- All LP gas cylinders with a capacity between 4-40 lbs. must be equipped with an overfill protection device (OPD).
- We recommend LP gas cylinders be ten (10) feet away from the house, especially when in use.
- LP gas is heavier than air and sinks. A leaky grill or cylinder could pose a serious hazard if leaking. Possible ignition sources include smoking materials, pilot lights, automobiles, compressors and heating or cooling units.
- Make sure that all connections are tight and secure.
- Supervise children whenever any type of grill is in use.
- Use only charcoal lighter fluid to start charcoal grills. **NEVER** use gasoline. Once the coals are lit, **NEVER** add lighter fluid to the fire, flames may travel up the stream resulting in serious burns.

## **Gasoline and Lawn Mowers**

- Gasoline vapors are highly flammable. They stay on your clothing and **can ignite** if you light a match or cigarette.
- Store gasoline only in an approved container, outside, or in a building or shed not attached to the house. **NEVER** keep gasoline inside the home.
- Keep gasoline away from all heat sources such as smoking materials, pilot lights, and grills.
- **NEVER** fuel a lawn mower while it is hot. Give it a few minutes to cool off before refueling.
- Keep your hands and feet away from the mower while it is running.
