Island Manager's Comments

Greetings Everyone,

Meetings: The following meetings have been scheduled:

- Saturday September 1st, 10:00AM at the Community Center, Public Hearing to present the first draft of the 2008 Municipal budget.
- Saturday September 1st, 9:00 AM at the Community Center, FII Stockholders annual meeting

Elections: On Saturday, September 1st, at 9:00 A.M. Frye Island Incorporated (FII) will hold its annual stockholders meeting. The election of officers to serve on the Board of Directors will be held at this meeting. There are five officers on the Board and each officer serves a one year term. Therefore, all five positions are to be elected at this meeting. Of the five incumbents, two, Ed Charrette and Joseph Potts, are candidates for reelection. Three of the incumbents have decided not to run for reelection, therefore, we need at least 3 new candidates to fill these open positions. If you are interested in becoming a candidate for the FII Board, please call the office. In addition, we are asking all candidates to complete a "Volunteer Form". This is available on the Frye Island web site or at the office. I will publish the names of the candidates as we receive them.

On Saturday, October 6th, we will have the annual Town Meeting. In addition to voting on the budget, and other warrant articles, we will be electing 2 new Selectmen, 1 Board of Island Trustee (BIT) representative to the Executive Committee, and a representative to the SAD 6 School Board. One Selectman's vacancy is for a one year term to replace Mr. Kuiken who resigned last year. The other vacancy is a three year term to replace Mr. Walker who has decided not to be a candidate for reelection. In order to run for one of these vacant Selectmen's positions a candidate must be registered to vote in the Town of Frye Island. In order to run for the BIT Executive Committee, a candidate must own "real Property" (a house) on Frye Island. All Frye Island registered voters are eligible to vote for Selectmen and SAD 6 Representative. All owners of real property on Frye Island are eligible to vote for the BIT representative to the Executive Committee. I realize that we still have some time before the October election, but I want to have plenty of time to give all potential candidates an opportunity to "throw their hat into the ring". Please contact the office if you are interested in becoming a candidate for any of these positions.

Golf Carts: It is time to remind everyone of the laws pertaining to the use of Golf Carts on the roads of Frye Island.

- All golf carts being used on the public roads of Frye Island must be registered by the State of Maine Bureau of Motor vehicles. This must be done annually at the Town Office.
- Proof of insurance is required in order to register a golf cart.
- The lot number of the owner must be displayed on the golf cart in lieu of a license plate.

The following practices constitute unsafe use of golf carts on Town public roads and are prohibited by ordinance:

- A. Use of a golf cart one half hour after sunset to one half hour before sunrise without headlights and rear lights installed and illuminated.
- B. Use of a golf cart without a rearview mirror.
- C. Use of a golf cart without a warning device such as a horn.
- D. Use of a golf cart with more than three people on any seat. In no case shall there be more people on any seat than the golf cart is designed to carry.
- E. Use of a golf cart with passengers riding on fenders, bumpers or in the location designed for the transportation of golf club bags.
- F. Use of a golf cart by a driver without a valid motor vehicle driving license in any class.
- G. Operating a golf cart in violation of ordinances or regulations applicable to motor vehicles, except as expressly permitted by the article, or in a reckless manner in such a way as to recklessly create a substantial risk of serious bodily injury to another person.
- G. Operating a golf cart in a manner to endanger, so as to endanger any person or property.
- H. Operating a golf cart under the influence or with excessive blood-alcohol level. A person commits the crime of operating a golf cart while under the influence of intoxicating liquor or drugs if that person operates or attempts to operate a golf cart while under the influence of intoxicating liquor or drugs or a combination of liquor and drugs; or, for a person 21 years of age or older, while having alcohol levels in that person's blood; higher than the minimum requirements under TITLE 29-A, CHAPTER 19 for operation of motor vehicles, or,

for a person less than 21 years of age, while having any amount of alcohol in the blood. Operating a golf cart while under the influence of intoxicating liquor or drugs is a Class D crime.

- I. Failure to comply with duty to submit. A person is guilty of failure to comply with the duty to submit to and complete a blood-alcohol or drug concentration test under TITLE 29-A, CHAPTER 23 of the Maine State Statutes, if that person refuses to submit to or fails to complete a blood-alcohol or drug concentration test or both, when requested to do so by a law enforcement officer who has probable cause to believe that the person operated or attempted to operate a golf cart while under the influence of intoxicating liquor or drugs.

If you do not comply with all of these laws and ordinances you will be subject to state and / or municipal fines.

Boating Safety: There have been a couple of boating accidents recently that warrant comment. On Long Lake in Harrison 2 people died recently when their boat was hit by a larger boat while boating after dark. I don't claim to know any of the details but just a reminder that everyone must be extremely careful when boating at night, Make sure all of your running lights work and you pay attention when operating a boat after dark.

In addition, I want to remind everyone about the dangers of boating on Sebago Lake. This lake can get very rough very quickly. On Monday of this week, a weather front caused the lake to become very rough, especially in the channel between Frye Island and Raymond Cape. Around 10 AM, we got a call in the office from a woman on the mainland that had just watched her husband capsize in a small rented boat near Frye's Leap. This woman called 911 and was told to call the Warden Service which she did. She was told by the Warden Service to call Frye Island because we could respond quicker than they could. Well, we are very ill equipped to respond to rescue missions of this nature but did dispatch one of the ferries to the area. We also notified Paul Bourque who responded with his tow boat. Fortunately, the boater was able to get to the rocks near Frye's Leap and was safe, but this could have turned into another tragedy very easily. So, please be very careful when boating on Sebago Lake, be aware of the weather conditions and use some common sense so that a Frye Islander doesn't become a Sebago Lake statistic.

Fireworks: We have collected more monies and now are only short \$236.40. If you have not yet donated to this extremely worthy cause and would like to, please see us at the office on your next visit.

Town Wide Assessment Review:

The review of all real property on the Island will take place during the months of July, August, September and part of October. The review will require access to the property for an exterior and interior analysis. To accomplish this task the plan is to divide the Island by Tax Maps. The Island has three tax maps (60, 61 and 62). You can identify your tax map by either checking the wall map in the Assessor's Office or by checking your tax bill. Property/Lots appearing on: Tax map 60 will be reviewed in July, Tax Map 61 will be reviewed in August, Tax Map 62 will be reviewed in September. Each lot may not require an interior review, but in the event a review is necessary and not made a card will be left on the property, usually on the door knob. Contact information will be on the card. Otherwise feel free to call the Assessor's office and leave times that are good for you. If your property is rented please leave word with the renter for permitting access.

ROAD, FIRE LANE AND LOT NUMBERS

All owners and renters should know the road, fire lane and lot number where they are located in the event of a fire, medical or police emergency.

This information will greatly expedite the response time for the emergency service that is answering your call. Time is critical!

All road signs and fire lanes signs on the island are clearly marked.

Every house, by town ordinance, shall have a lot number in large, contrasting colors that can be seen by emergency responders approaching from either direction.

If possible, a person should meet the emergency responders on the street and at night turn on all outdoor lighting.

If you have any questions or concerns regarding your road, fire lane or lot number, they can be addressed by members of the fire department at the central station on Sundays, between 1030 and 1230.

GARDEN CLUB CELEBRATES ITS TENTH ANNIVERSARY

Last Saturday evening, August 11th, a Tenth Anniversary Champagne Reception was held to celebrate the achievements of the Frye Island Garden Club. The reception was held at the lakeside home of Debra and Eric Luther.

Each guest was asked to bring a stemmed flower or leaf from their Frye Island garden to form a commemorative arrangement symbolic of the contributions the Garden Club members have made that beautify the island. These flowers were inserted into a large container of island ferns and formed a unique centerpiece when completed.

Nancy Perry, President of the Garden Club recognized each of the past presidents: Barbara Hannah, Claire Ladow, Judy Comley, Deb Anthony, and Mary Ann Niles.

She then introduced the present board of officers: Rita Lapati, VP/Publicity; Elaine Vande Hei, Secretary; Sue Nisula, Treasurer; and Pat Karpacz, Program.

Pat Karpacz presented a large board displaying a list of the charter members of the club, photographs from the past, and a copy of the minutes of the first business meeting.

The mood of those present was festive, and each time a person or event was mentioned by Mrs. Perry the group would cheer and raise their glasses in celebration.

A description of each of the gardens created in the past ten years was presented by Maria Charrette and by Kathy Potts and Rita Lapati.

Ten years ago Barbara and Bob Hannah called together a group of men and women to form a garden club. Barbara envisioned how such a club could enhance the beauty of the island. The first project was a multi-faceted design to beautify the grounds of the Community Center. Over the next few years, foundation gardens were established,

light posts, surrounded by shrubbery, were installed, and the lawn was established. Then a patio and a walkway leading to the front entrance were constructed using paving bricks. The last phase of the project was to plant Rugosa Roses as a border around the front lawn.

While this work was in progress, work on the gardens at the ferry landing was also started. The beds were established and then planted with perennials. This garden was later named “Vic’s Garden” in honor of Vic Richards, who had been the manager of the island for many years, and who had urged the Garden Club to establish a garden at the ferry landing. The garden to the left of the ferry landing, which for years had been cared for by Kathy and Joe Potts, was also taken on by the Garden Club and replanted with Rugosa Roses.

Bob Hannah designed an irrigation system for each of the gardens, and, with a team of volunteers, installed it.

Today, islanders and visitors who arrive at the island are greeted by the lovely beds of flowers at the ferry landing and the beautifully designed gardens and entrance to the Community Center.

Nancy Perry also called upon Deb Anthony to describe the latest project of the Garden Club, which is being accomplished together with the Conservation Commission. It is to clean out and replant the center divide at the approach to the ferry landing, which has recently been named, “Small Frye Island”.

Members maintain the gardens during monthly work sessions; however, with so many gardens being created in the past few years, it was decided that the opening and the closing of the gardens would be contracted out to an independent landscaper.

To pay for all this, the Garden Club in 1998 held a very successful garden tour of the ‘Hidden Gardens of Frye Island’. They also sponsor a Plant and Bake Sale every Memorial Day in which many members participate. Nancy Perry recognized those men and women who have been a mainstay of this fundraiser every year. One can also say that the Plant and Bake Sale is the first social event of the summer.

Mrs. Perry thanked John Crosby and the Public Works Department for their past assistance. In addition, appreciation was extended to the Town for including a stipend in the annual budget to forward the work of the Garden Club.

The highlight of the evening was the special recognition given to Barbara and Bob Hannah.
