# Town News

## Island Manager's Comments

Greetings Everyone,

**Meetings:** The following meetings have been scheduled:

(Also see page 5 for additional meetings)

- Planning Board – Saturday August 25<sup>th</sup> at 8:30 AM at the Community Center.
- FII Stockholders Meeting – Saturday September 1<sup>st</sup> at 9A.M at the Community Center.
- Public Hearing – 1<sup>st</sup> draft of the 2008 Budget Saturday September 1<sup>st</sup> at 10:00 A.M at the Community Center.

**FII Board of Directors:** As was mentioned last week, there are 5 Directors on the Board of Frye Island Incorporated. All five serve a one (1) year term and are elected at the annual stockholders meeting. We presently have 3 candidates for the 5 positions. The candidates are:

- Ed Charrette (incumbent) – Ed lives at 79 Leisure Lane and in Lexington, Massachusetts. He is married with 5 children. Ed is a retired physician – executive. In the past, he has served as President of Frye Island, he has also served on the Board of Directors of FII, on the Planning Board and is presently the chairperson of the Conservation Committee. Ed has been coming to Frye Island for 35+ years.
- David Lowe – Dave lives at 1839 Ridge Road and in Saco Maine. He is married with 2 grown children. Dave owned and operated an independent insurance agency for 30 years which he recently sold. He continues to serve as the Agency Manager. Dave has lived on Frye Island for 10 years.
- Joe Potts (incumbent) – Joe lives at 1633 Ridge Road and in Punta Gorda Florida. Joe retired as a senior executive for GTE after 34 years of service. He has been very involved in various leadership roles on Frye Island and is currently the President of the FII Board of Directors and Treasurer for the Town of Frye Island.

We still need at least 2 more candidates for the FII Board. If you are interested please call the office.

**Selectmen:** The annual town meeting will be held on the Columbus Day weekend in October. We will be voting for 2 vacant selectmen's position at this meeting. One vacancy is for a one (1) year term to fill the position left open when Mr. Kuiken resigned. The other is a three (3) year term left open when Mr. Walker decided not to run

for re-election. We need candidates for these positions. In order to run for selectman, a candidate must be a registered voter in Frye Island.

**SAD 6 School Board Representative:** We will also be voting for a school board representative at the Town Meeting. If you are interested in being a candidate for this position, please call the office.

**Public Hearing:** Next Saturday, September 1<sup>st</sup> we will have the Public Hearing to present the first draft of the 2008 Budget. The hearing is scheduled for 10:00 A.M. at the Community Center. Everyone is welcome to attend and provide input.

**Beaches:** I have been asked to remind everyone about the rules that have been established for using the beaches again. Please be considerate of others using the beaches.

### BEACH RULES

1. No open fires on beaches.
2. No camping overnight on beaches.
3. No personal items left on beaches overnight.
4. NO DOGS on beaches between the hours of 10:00 am and 5:00 pm. (Must clean up after your dogs)

*I have heard complaints recently about dogs on the beaches and owners not cleaning up after them. Come on folks, this is just common sense and common courtesy. The beach committee is looking into the purchase of "baggy dispensers" for this purpose but in the mean time; please clean up after your pet.*

5. No powered watercraft left or tied up on beaches. Pick-up and drop-offs only. (All power boats on Long Beach must have a Frye Island sticker).  
*If you use the beach areas for boating please make sure that you have an appropriate Frye Island sticker on your boat. Acceptable stickers include marina slip stickers (Long Beach Marina or Quail Circle) and Frye Island Property Owner stickers which are available in the office.*
6. Canoes, kayaks, rowboats, and paddleboats must be pulled up beyond sandy area, racked, or in designated areas only.
7. No littering. Use trash containers provided.
8. Moorings must be out beyond swimming areas, and must not cause interference with swim area barriers.

**VIOLATORS WILL BE SUBJECT TO FINES**

**Police and Safety:** Last weekend proved to be busy for our police officer. First a young lady crashed a “borrowed” golf cart into a tree and then left the scene. She was later apprehended and escorted off the Island. She returned and was apprehended for disturbing the peace and was escorted off a second time, this time for good. Then during a routine patrol, a few very inebriated minors were noticed walking on Sunset Road. When escorted to the home they were staying at a lot of kids were seen running out of the house and into the woods. A couple of the kids were caught and put in the cruiser only to have them break out a window in the cruiser and escape into the woods wearing handcuffs (A felony). Dana called the Cumberland County Sheriffs Department for support and the Frye Island Fire Department to help search in the woods for the kids. As it turned out, 3 were arrested and taken to jail and another 15 were summonsed. All have a Court date in Bridgton. This was an accident looking for a place to happen. All too often, people get alcohol induced bravery or stupidity and some one gets hurt or killed. If you didn’t know it, it is not only illegal for minors to consume alcoholic beverages, but it is also illegal for a minor to have alcoholic beverages in their possession, it is illegal to provide alcoholic beverages to minors and it is illegal to provide a place for a minor to consume alcoholic beverages. I know a lot of people think that once you get to Frye Island anything goes but please – please use some common sense. We have been very fortunate that no one has been seriously hurt on the Island.....yet.

## **Town Wide Assessment Review:**

The review of all real property on the Island will take place during the months of July, August, September and part of October. The review will require access to the property for an exterior and interior analysis. To accomplish this task the plan is to divide the Island by Tax Maps. The Island has three tax maps (60, 61 and 62). You can identify your tax map by either checking the wall map in the Assessor’s Office or by checking your tax bill. Property/Lots appearing on: Tax map 60 will be reviewed in July, Tax Map 61 will be reviewed in August, Tax Map 62 will be reviewed in September. Each lot may not require an interior review, but in the event a review is necessary and not made a card will be left on the property, usually on the door knob. Contact information will be on the card. Otherwise feel free to call the Assessor’s office and leave times that are good for you. If your property is rented please leave word with the renter for permitting access.




