Island Manager's Comments

Greetings Everyone,

Meetings: The following meetings have been scheduled:

- FII Stockholders Meeting – Saturday September 1st at 9A.M at the Community Center.
- Registration will begin at 8:30 A.M.
- Public Hearing – 1st draft of the 2008 Budget Saturday September 1st at 10:00 A.M at the Community Center.

FII Board of Directors: As was mentioned last week, there are 5 Directors on the Board of Frye Island Incorporated. All five serve a one (1) year term and are elected at the annual stockholders meeting. We now have 6 candidates for the 5 positions. The candidates are:

- Ed Charrette (incumbent) – Ed lives at 79 Leisure Lane and in Lexington, Massachusetts. He is married with 5 children. Ed is a retired physician – executive. In the past, he has served as President of Frye Island, he has also served on the Board of Directors of FII, on the Planning Board and is presently the chairperson of the Conservation Committee. Ed has been coming to Frye Island for 35+ years.
- David Lowe – Dave lives at 1839 Ridge Road and in Saco Maine. He is married with 2 grown children. Dave owned and operated an independent insurance agency for 30 years which he recently sold. He continues to serve as the Agency Manager. Dave has lived on Frye Island for 10 years.
- Joe Potts (incumbent) – Joe lives at 1633 Ridge Road and in Punta Gorda Florida. Joe retired as a senior executive for GTE after 34 years of service. He has been very involved in various leadership roles on Frye Island and is currently the President of the FII Board of Directors and Treasurer for the Town of Frye Island.
- Nancy Donio – Nancy lives at 859 Sunset Road and in Farmingdale New Jersey. She has served on the Frye Island Beach Committee, is the President of her local P.T.A. and worked in the Human Services Department of a municipal government prior to having children. Nancy has lived on Frye Island for 8 years.
- Neill Bovaird – Neill lives at 1655 Ridge Road and in Worcester Massachusetts. He has worked in corporate settings since 1968 and recently retired after working for Hewlett-Packard for the past 23 years. Neill has lived on Frye Island for 24 years.

- Jacquie Ossi - Jacquie lives at 1680 Ridge Road and in Cary North Carolina. She holds two nursing degrees and has worked in a variety of nursing positions over the past 14 years. She has three daughters and has volunteered in many areas that supported their educational and sporting interests. She also served a two year term on the Frye Island Municipal Services Corporation Board in the mid 80's.

One owner from each property on Frye Island is eligible to vote for these candidates. If a person owns multiple lots, he / she will be allowed one vote for each lot owned.

Selectmen: The annual town meeting will be held on the Columbus Day weekend in October. We will be voting for 2 vacant selectmen's position at this meeting. One vacancy is for a one (1) year term to fill the position left open when Mr. Kuiken resigned. The other is a three (3) year term left open when Mr. Walker decided not to run for re-election. We need candidates for these positions. In order to run for selectman, a candidate must be a registered voter in Frye Island.

SAD 6 School Board Representative: We will also be voting for a school board representative at the Town Meeting. If you are interested in being a candidate for this position, please call the office.

Public Hearing: On Saturday, September 1st we will have the Public Hearing to present the first draft of the 2008 Budget. The hearing is scheduled for 10:00 A.M. at the Community Center. Everyone is welcome to attend and provide input.

Memorial Service: On Tuesday the Island received some very sad news when the word spread that Sue Nisula had died suddenly and very unexpectedly. She had been in Portland, conducting some family business with her husband Bruce and son Brian, when she suffered a fatal heart attack. She will be sadly missed by all Frye Islanders that knew and loved her. The Nisula family has invited everyone to join them at a special service to celebrate Sue's life which will be held at 1:00 P.M. Sunday at the Community Center followed by refreshments at the Golf Club.

We also learned that Ken Dolloff had a very serious heart attack while at home in Methuen Massachusetts. Word is that he was taken to the hospital after having chest pains and actually suffered the heart attack in the hospital. We are told that he is on the road to recovery.

On behalf of all Frye Islanders I would like to extend our thoughts and prayers to the Nisula family for their loss and to Ken Dolloff for a speedy and complete recovery. Have a safe and enjoyable week!

Town Wide Assessment Review:

The review of all real property on the Island will take place during the months of July, August, September and part of October. The review will require access to the property for an exterior and interior analysis. To accomplish this task the plan is to divide the Island by Tax Maps. The Island has three tax maps (60, 61 and 62). You can identify your tax map by either checking the wall map in the Assessor's Office or by checking your tax bill. Property/Lots appearing on: Tax map 60 will be reviewed in July, Tax Map 61 will be reviewed in August, Tax Map 62 will be reviewed in September.

Each lot may not require an interior review, but in the event a review is necessary and not made a card will be left on the property, usually on the door knob. Contact information will be on the card. Otherwise feel free to call the Assessor's office and leave times that are good for you. If your property is rented please leave word with the renter for permitting access.

Your Pet

Is your dog running at large? Running at large as per State Law RS 7 719, Section 3911 states: It is unlawful for any dog, licensed or unlicensed to be at large, the owner or keeper of any dog found at large is subject to the penalties provided in this chapter.

If a dog is found at large, a court summons will be issued to appear in Bridgton court. The normal fine is \$50 +/- plus cost of court.

At large

At large means off the premises of the owner and not under the control of any person whose personal presence and attention would reasonably control the animal (i.e. a dog may run or roam anywhere he/she wishes on the owner's property - when the dog is off this property he/she must be on a leash, such as the public street or way and the public beach.



Fire Department

THERE IS NO OPEN BURNING PERMITTED ON FRYE ISLAND.

Only permits for warming or cooking are issued provided that an adequate weather advisory has been dispatched to us from the state and that additional guidelines are met.

There are no other types of open burning allowed, including campfires or bonfires either on private or public property.

The state issues what is referred to as a Class Day on a daily basis. Class Days are assigned by number depending on the moisture in the fuels on the ground, the amount of moisture we have received, wind conditions, and general weather conditions.

Class Days are grouped into five (5) categories.

Class 1 is when there is very little potential danger.

Class 2 is when there is some danger.

Class 3 is when there is danger present.

Class 4 is when there is moderate danger.

Class 5 is when there is extreme danger or fire threat.

The issuing of any permit or permission for allowable burning depends on the following criteria:

- Forest fire danger (Class day)
- Time of day and season of the year
- Temperature, humidity, wind speed and direction
- Type of burning proposed
- The length of burning period

- The presence or availability of sufficient force and equipment to control the burning
- Experience and capability of the permittee in the safe use and control of the burning


If a permit is issued, the burning must be conducted according to the terms and condition of the permit and may not create a nuisance.

Any person who engages in out-of-door burning in violation of this article, or who fails to comply with any stated permit condition or restriction commits a Class E crime. In addition, if the State proves that while in violation that person's out-of-door fire resulted in fire suppression costs to municipal or State Government, the court, as part of any sentence imposed, may order restitution to be paid to the government entities incurring the suppression costs.

When bringing an action under this article, the State shall, to the fullest extent permitted by law, seek restitution of fire suppression costs incurred by state government entities relating to the violation.

Please remember that if you are issued a permit you are responsible for the fire and the proper extinguishment of the fire when you are done. Do not leave a fire unattended or let the fire burn itself out.

LAKES LIKE LESS LAWN

On Sunday evening, August 26th, The FI Garden Club sponsored a presentation given by Jennifer Charrette and Donna Mc Cullough, both Master Gardeners, on the topic, "Lakes Like Less Lawn". Approximately forty Frye Islanders attended this talk, which was followed by a Pot Luck Supper.

Sebago Lake is one of the healthier lakes in Maine; however, we cannot take its water quality for granted. Human development can have a detrimental effect on the quality of the water. Changes that once occurred over centuries now can occur in decades.

The master gardeners outlined steps that those who live around a lake might take to minimize an adverse effect on the lake. They advocated keeping buffer strips of land between the developed area and the water, where natural or landscape vegetation is allowed to flourish.

Natural buffers are preferred over a lush, well-groomed lawn, which is not ideal for lake shorefronts. However, for those who have lawns, there are many measures that a homeowner can take (choice of grass type, fertilizers, pesticides, and mowing practices) which will minimize the detrimental impact of a lawn.




