Island Manager's Comments

Greetings Everyone,

Selectmen: There will be two (2) vacant positions on the Board of Selectmen to fill at the October 6th Town Meeting. To date we have one announced candidate, Phil Perry, for the one year term left vacant when Mr. Kuiken resigned. There is still time to volunteer to run for this one year term or run for the three year term left vacant when Mr. Walker decided not to run again.

Phil Perry—Phil lives at 276 Leisure Lane and lived in Cumberland Foreside, ME for 30 years prior to moving to Washington, DC and Alexandria, VA. He is married with 4 children and 8 grandchildren. He served as a line officer in the US Navy and is a retired senior executive from Digital Equipment Corp and earlier from Fairchild Semiconductor Corp. He has served 4 years on the FII Board, the last as Treasurer, and for 3 years on the FI Recreation Commission. Phil has lived on Frye Island for 17 years and is willing to devote his energy to making FI a better place to live.

Board of Island Trustees (BIT): The term of Bruce Nisula on the BIT Executive Committee will expire at the October Town Meeting. Bruce has expressed his intentions to run for another three year term. Bruce lives at 16 Leisure Lane, in one of the original cottages built on the Island by his parents, and in Plantation Florida. Bruce is a retired physician. He has served on the Executive Committee and on the Golf Committee.

SAD 6 School Board Representative: We will also be voting for a school board representative at the Town Meeting. If you are interested in being a candidate for this position, please call the office.

Oleg Svetlichny has indicated a desire to run again for this position. See page 5 for his biography.

If you are interested in becoming a candidate for any of these positions, please contact the office.

Water Level: I spoke with Tom Howard, from SAPPI (formerly S.D. Warren), this week and was informed that it is their intention to attempt to lower the lake level again this year. They were unable to reach their goal last year so they will be trying again this fall. They have not developed the final plan yet but he thought that it would probably be the same as last year. If this is true, they will reduce the lake level to 261.5 feet mean sea level (msl) by the first of November and to 261.0 feet msl by the end of November. They plan to increase the drawdown around October 1st to reach their November 1st goal by.

We have applied for a permit with the Department of Environmental Protection to dredge the entrance to the Marina. They have had our application for a couple of months and are still waiting comments from the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife. We call frequently in an effort to expedite this process but the wheels of government turn very slowly. I have asked for permission to clean out the shallow areas near the beach if necessary in case we don't have the permit when the water level gets down to the point that access to the Marina becomes an issue.

There is no need to panic. I just want everyone to be aware of the situation. We have no plans to close early. We made some physical changes to the gantry system and the engineers have recalculated the allowable loads so we will attempt to allow heavy equipment to use the ferry until the lake level reaches 262 feet which is 1 foot lower than our cut-off in past years. However, if you have heavy equipment on the Island I would suggest that you keep in touch with the ferry department once the level goes below 263 as we will be watching this very closely. We are in hopes that regular passenger vehicles will have access to the ferry right to the scheduled closing date of November 6th. The lake level today is 263.85 feet and holding because of all the rain.

I will keep you posted.

Animals: There has been an unconfirmed sighting of a Wolf (the 4 legged kind) on the Island. We have contacted the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife and quite frankly they doubt that there would be a wolf out here. However, they did call us back saying that there was a black "Hybrid" (wolf bred with a dog) missing in Raymond somewhere. That doesn't mean that it is over here; however, I would suggest you keep an eye on your pets until we can get more information. Again, there is no need to panic, but you do need to be aware of this possibility.

Golf Course: I was fortunate to be able to play a little golf last weekend and observed an activity that was a bit disturbing. While we were waiting to tee off on the 6th hole, we saw a couple strolling up the fairway towards the green. These people were not playing golf but apparently were out for an afternoon walk. I later heard from another golfer that he had encountered a couple with children “frogging” on the 6th hole. Folks, the golf course is for golfing only. It is extremely dangerous for anyone to be wandering around the golf course. People have suffered serious injury when hit by an arrant golf shot, and believe me I have personal knowledge of many an arrant golf shot on this course. Please, a word to the wise, if you want to go for a walk and are not playing golf, find another place to walk. It could prove to be better for your health.

Memorial Fund: In response to many requests, the Nisula Family has established a memorial fund for Sue Nisula. To accommodate this, the Town has established an account to collect contributions to this fund. Everyone interested in contributing can make checks payable to the Town of Frye Island – Sue Nisula Memorial Fund, and send them to The Town of Frye Island, One Sunset Road, Frye Island Maine 04071. Proceeds will be used to construct a permanent memorial in Sue’s name at the golf course. A Note from the Office

Please make sure we have your current e-mail address (before the island closes) so that you may receive any important correspondence as well as the winter newsletter.

Attention All Property Owners

As we quickly approach the end of our season here on the Island, this reminder goes out to all while closing up your properties for the season – **be sure to disconnect your waterline** from the Town System **and leave it disconnected** to avoid getting water in your piping when lines are abandoned.

Town Wide Assessment Review:

The review of all real property on the Island will take place during the months of July, August, September and part of October. The review will require access to the property for an exterior and interior analysis. To accomplish this task the plan is to divide the Island by Tax Maps. The Island has three tax maps (60, 61 and 62). You can identify your tax map by either checking the wall map in the Assessor’s Office or by checking your tax bill. Property/Lots appearing on: Tax map 60 will be reviewed in July, Tax Map 61 will be reviewed in August, Tax Map 62 will be reviewed in September. Each lot may not require an interior review, but in the event a review is necessary and not made a card will be left on the property, usually on the door knob. Contact information will be on the card. Otherwise feel free to call the Assessor’s office and leave times that are good for you. If your property is rented please leave word with the renter for permitting access.

Greetings,

My name is Oleg Svetlichny, Lot 13. I am a candidate for the MSAD #6 School Board. If elected, this would be my third three-year term of service. In the past six years, I served on every committee of the Board: Finance, Facility, Salary & Personnel, Policy, and Budget. Finance Committee members are elected by the Board (I was elected twice). The Board Chair appoints members to other committees. The Budget Committee has one member from each town. Each committee elects its Chair. I chaired (once each) the Finance and the Budget committees. I was elected to full Board Chair in the 05-06 school year; the year before that, I was its Vice Chair. Other appointments included District Continuous Improvement Team, Adult Education Advisory Board, Wellness Committee, and several Search Committees, including Superintendent's.

A major achievement that I can take credit for was initiating a change in the budgeting process from the incremental to the needs-based (a.k.a. zero-based) paradigm. Under the new rules, all requests must be justified in terms of the next year needs – regardless of what the current budget figures are. In addition, all needs -- current and new -- must be articulated, whether or not they would/could be included in the budget. This way, unpleasant surprises can be kept at bay and priorities can be assigned in a more rational manner.

Other highlights of my background are:

Public Service – Town of Frye Island

Our first year on the Island was the first year the Island was opened for development. (My grandchildren are the fourth generation of islanders!) Thus, I have lived through all of the Island's ups and downs and was involved in various ways with its affairs, including supporting formation of the Frye Island Corporation, serving on the FII Board of Directors, and being one of the founders of the Town of Frye Island. Then, in 1998, when the Island became the Town of Frye Island, I served on the Board of Selectman. In addition, I was member of the Charter Commission, Comprehensive Plan Committee, and Planning Board (alternate). Six years ago, I was elected (first term) to the MSAD #6 Board.

Education

I completed only five grades in Russia (then Soviet Union) before WWII bombs started to fall. My sixth grade was in a Displaced Persons camp in postwar Germany -- U.S. Zone. I stepped onto US soil in October of 1949. In 1950, I joined the United States Air Force. I graduated (with honors) from the Aircraft & Engine Mechanics School and spent the rest of my four-year enlistment as a Flight Line Crew Chief. I continued my education through the United States Armed Forces

Institute -- a correspondence school. Upon discharge, I earned BS (Penn State) and MS (Rensselaer) degrees in Aeronautical Sciences and an MBA from Alexander Hamilton Institute of New York.

Professional Experience

In one sentence, my professional experience is thirty plus years in the aerospace industry. It was interesting, varied, and constantly changing following rapid changes in the sciences and technologies. I was involved primarily with high technology systems, such as inertial guidance and navigation, and large-scale systems, such as air defense and air traffic control. I did put my MBA to test by becoming an entrepreneur for a number of years – a high technology small firm. After the collapse of the Soviet Union, I did consulting work helping two American small companies and Russian space engineers in Moscow on the matters of joint projects.

Because of my life experiences and because of my “tortured” road to get an education, I feel strongly about public education. Its role is to build a nation. MSAD #6 is a good District. Its Board is dedicated to the process of continued improvements in three strategic areas: Highest Student Achievement, Safe Learning Environment, and High Performance Organization. I am looking forward to continue contributing to these goals.

TIPS FOR MAINTAINING WOOD STOVES AND FIREPLACES

Being educated about fireplaces and wood stoves before accidents happen can prevent serious loss of property and life. These safety tips can help you keep your fireplace or wood stove in safe operating condition during the cold weather.

Have the fireplace or wood stove professionally installed according to the manufacturer's guidelines and clearance requirements. Stoves and manufactured fireplaces should pass the test of a nationally recognized testing lab, such as Underwriter's Laboratories, or pass testing equal to UL testing standards.

Purchase a UL listed smoke detector for your house and have it properly installed.

Hopefully your house is already hard-wired for smoke detectors. Purchase a UL listed multipurpose fire extinguisher.

Use the proper fuel for the stove or fireplace. Burn only logs in a wood burning stove, not paper or building material wood.

Make sure the ashes are completely cool before removal. Place them in a **noncombustible container** for disposal, preferably one not kept inside the house or garage.

Have a professional chimney sweep regularly clean the chimney to reduce creosote buildup

Don't place furniture or household items on or near the stove during operation






