Town News

Island Manager's Comments

Greetings Everyone,

Meetings: The following meetings have been scheduled:

- Board of Selectmen / Executive Committee meeting
– 8:00 AM Saturday October 13, at the Administration Building.

Note: The BoS / EC meeting has been moved to the Administration Office.

Town Meeting: The annual Town Meeting was held last Saturday. There were approximately 75 property owners in attendance.

Prior to the meeting, Jeff Diercks, an engineer from CDM, conducted a very informative power point presentation and question and answer session on the recent study they performed on the water distribution system. It was suggested that the slides used for this presentation be put on the web-site so I have asked Joe Potts to do this if it is feasible.

The following people were elected to office at the meeting:

- Phil Perry – Selectman
Term: October 2007 to October 2008
- Mark Thomas – Selectman
Term: October 2007 to October 2010
- Bruce Nisula – BIT Executive Committee
Term: October 2007 to October 2010

All other warrant articles passed as presented.

I would like to thank Grace Morin for stepping up to fill the selectman's position left vacant when Mr. Kuiken resigned and to Brian Walker for his service on the Board.

Lake Level: I have been reporting for a few weeks now that SAPPI will be lowering the lake level again in an effort to get to an elevation of 261.5 by the end of October and to 261 by the end of November. I was also told that they planned to lower the level a little more aggressively beginning in October. It appears that they are doing that. During September the lake level dropped about ½ inch per day. For the first couple of days in October, the level dropped about ¾ inch per day. As I have said before, we don't intend to close early but we will be keeping a close eye on the level. If you have heavy equipment on the Island or planning on having equipment out here you had better check with the ferry office so your equipment doesn't get stranded. I have asked the engineer that designed the system to let me know at what level it would be unsafe for a fire truck to

be loaded on the ferry. That level may be the deciding factor in determining when we will have to shutdown the ferry service and the Island. The level today is about 262.8 feet. At the rate it is going down, we will be at a level of 261.9 by the end of October.

Marina: I have made arrangements to have the docks removed at the Long Beach Marina on the weekend of November 3rd & 4th. Please have your boat out of the marina by then. We have contacted the contractor to dredge the entrance to the Marina to schedule the project. He has a new barge and excavator that he hopes to have in our area soon. We will begin the process as soon as he is in place.

Off Season Office: We are going to set up the off season office in the ferry trailer this year. Our plan is to move the computers and other necessary equipment to the trailer on the 25th of October. We want to get everything set up and running before the Island closes. If you have business to conduct in the office please try to do it before the 25th. We hope to be set-up at the trailer by Tuesday October 30th to sell ferry tickets if necessary.

Referendum Election: There will be a statewide referendum election on Tuesday, November 6th. There will also be a referendum election for Cumberland County conducted at the same time. We will be opening the polls at the ferry trailer on the 6th at 10:00 AM and closing at 8:00 PM. Sample ballots for both are posted on the bulletin boards at the Administration Office. Absentee ballots are now available in the office if you prefer to vote using that process.

Memorial Fund: In response to many requests, the Nisula Family has established a memorial fund for Sue Nisula. To accommodate this, the Town has established an account to collect contributions to this fund. Everyone interested in contributing can make checks payable to the Town of Frye Island – Sue Nisula Memorial Fund, and send them to The Town of Frye Island, One Sunset Road, Frye Island Maine 04071. Proceeds will be used to construct a permanent memorial in Sue's name at the golf course. 
