# Town News

## Island Manager's Comments

Greetings Everyone,

**Long Beach Marina & Quail Circle Canal:** All of the docks are now in at Long Beach Marina including the new ones. Some of these new docks are smaller and are designed specifically for personal watercraft, (wave runners), while the others are regular boat slips. We will be reviewing the waiting list and making the new slip assignments soon. At the request of the Marina Committee, we may have to change a few slip assignments because the size of the boats combined with the present location of the slip interferes with navigation in the marina.

Remember, the entrance to the Marina and the entire Marina channel is a "No Wake Zone", so as you leave and return to the marina please drive at headway speed with care and caution. Both Long Beach Marina and Quail Circle are full and we have waiting lists for both sites. So, if you do not plan to renew your rental slip, please call the office so that we can assign your slip to someone on the waiting list. The fees for 2008 are the same as last year:

- Marina Equity Slips      \$225.00 \*
- Marina Rental              \$900.00 \*
- Quail Circle                 \$200.00

\* Denotes extra wide slips in accordance with the Yacht Club Policy.

**Note: Proof of insurance must be presented when registering your boat as is the case with Motor Vehicles.**

**DON'T FORGET:** Your Yacht Club fees must be paid by the time the office closes on Saturday, May 31st or you could lose your spot.

If you are installing a dock at Quail Circle, please make sure you install it correctly so that it doesn't infringe upon your neighbors space. The center of the dock should be located at the numbered pipe. In addition, it has been brought to my attention that some people at Quail do not secure the outboard (the end in the water) end of the dock and wave action and wind can cause the dock to swing into their neighbor's space. So, in addition to getting the dock in the right location, please consider this swinging potential when installing your docks.

**SAD 6 Budget:** The referendum election to validate the school budget was held on Tuesday May 13<sup>th</sup>. Nine Frye Islanders out of a possible 95 registered voters participated in the election process and voted 3 for the budget with 6 opposed. However, after the final tally of all votes in the District, the budget, as presented, passed. I don't have all of the figures yet but our portion of the '08 – '09 school budget will be about 1 million dollars.

### Personnel Changes:

**Police and Safety:** Dana Wessling has resigned as the police officer for Frye Island to pursue other interests. In his place, I have hired Rod Beaulieu to serve as our Chief of Police. Rod retired from the Sanford Maine Police Dept. after 20 years of service. During that time he served as a patrol officer, a detective, detective supervisor and spent 14 years as a patrol supervisor. He brings a lot of experience to the position. In addition, he has four other certified police officers that will be assisting him on an as needed basis.

**Code Enforcement Officer:** Paul White has resigned as our CEO to take a full time position in Eliot Maine. I have hired John Thompson to serve as our CEO. John has over twenty years experience as a Code Officer. He is retiring from the same position in Naples Maine and wanted some part-time seasonal employment. This should work out well for both of us. Unfortunately John is committed to Naples through June so he won't be on board until July. I have asked Paul White to help us out until John is available.

**Water System:** For the second time in 3 years we suffered another lightening strike at our water treatment plant on Wednesday evening. Fortunately, we had installed lightening arresters / surge protectors in the control system after the first strike damaged almost all of the control equipment. One of these sacrificial protectors was destroyed in the strike but the major components in the system were not damaged. It appears that the only damage was to a power supply which has been replaced. The system was operated in manual until the control system was repaired.

The Board of Selectmen / Executive Committee approved the first phase of the water distribution system replacement. This will consist of laying a new 4" pipe down Highpoint Drive from Sunset Road to the intersection of Highpoint, Birch and Ridge. We expect to start as soon as we can finalize the material list; but, we do not anticipate making all of the property connections until this fall. The new pipe will be installed along the eastern side of the road and may require some re-routing of traffic during the installation. I will keep you posted as we proceed.

**Golf Car Reminder:** The Department of Transportation allows 14 Islands to use golf cars on Island roads. Frye Island is one of the islands granted this privilege. However, in order to retain this privilege, there are a few requirements:

1. All golf cars driven on Frye Island roads must be registered with the Bureau of Motor Vehicles. This can be done at the Town Office during regular business hours. In order to register any golf car, you must show proof of insurance. In addition, the registration stickers issued at the time of registration, and the owners' lot number must be displayed on the golf car.
2. In order to legally drive a golf car on Frye Island roads the operator **must have a valid driver's license**. It doesn't have to be a Maine license. It can be a valid license issued by any state.

These are laws imposed by the State and infractions are prosecuted the same as all other motor vehicle violations.

**Fuel Costs:** I am sure that everyone is very aware of the high cost of fuel oil. Many ferry services have been forced to increase ticket prices in order to keep up with these increasing costs. The Maine Ferry Service recently announced a 12.5% increase which goes into effect June 1 and the Casco Bay Transit Authority applied a .50 cent surcharge to all of their adult passenger tickets on May 1. Both cited the high cost of fuel oil as the reason. We have no plans to make any changes at this time but we do have to watch this very closely.

Believe it or not, the last fuel invoice we got from a May 9<sup>th</sup> delivery was \$4.06, down \$.08 (8 cents) from the previous delivery. It will be interesting to see if this trend continues.

As I said, I will be keeping a close eye on our expenditures and the budget as we get into the season and will keep you informed in the FINS but it is inevitable that we will have to take some action in order to remain in budget. We will be discussing options at the next BoS / EC meeting.

**Recreation Director:** We are in need of a Recreation Director to oversee the children / teen programs at the recreation center. If anyone is interested or knows someone that might be interested please notify the office.

**Taxes:** I realize that it is a bit early but I want to remind everyone that the second half of the 2008 taxes are due June 30<sup>th</sup>. Interest will start to accrue after July 1<sup>st</sup> for all unpaid taxes. In addition, in accordance with the charter, all delinquent property owners will be placed on the "not in good standing list" and will not be allowed to purchase or use discount ferry tickets.

**Board Meeting:** The next Board of Selectmen / Executive Committee meeting has been scheduled for 9 AM Saturday June 14<sup>th</sup> at the Community Center.



## **Safe Boating Tips**

- Age Requirements-“When operating a motorboat with more than 10 horsepower, a person under the age of 12 must be under immediate supervision of a person located in the boat who is at least 16 years of age. A person under the age of 16 years may not operate personal watercraft, which includes jet skis. **A person between 16-18 years of age may operate a personal watercraft if they have successfully completed an approved education course, or if they are accompanied by a person 18 years of age or older.** Proof of age and course must be possessed while operating a personal watercraft.” For the safety of all, please abide by the above law.
- Watercraft may not be operated at a speed greater than “headway speed” while within a water safety zone (**200 feet of shore**), marina or approved anchorage. Headway speed is defined as the minimum speed necessary to maintain steerage and control of the watercraft while it is moving.
- Boaters must always consider the effects of the wash or waves created by their watercraft to piers, floats, shorelines, or property of others. The operator is civilly responsible for any damage incurred.
- Watercraft 16 feet or longer, must have a wearable U.S. Coast Guard approved Type I, II, or III PFD (personal flotation device) for each person on board PLUS at least one throw able device (Type IV) on board. Watercraft under 16 feet in length require one PFD for each person on board. All children 10 years of age and younger must wear a Type I, II, or III PFD while on board a watercraft.
- When commissioning your watercraft from storage, ensure that all hose clamps and hoses are reattached and hose clamps secured tightly. Check same periodically during the boating season. Vibrations will loosen those hoses and clamps.



## ***Protection Against Mosquitoes***

- Avoid places and times when mosquitoes bite. Generally, peak biting periods for the type of mosquitoes capable of transmitting WNV occur just before and after sunset and just before dawn.
- Apply insect repellent containing 25-35% DEET when you're outdoors.
- Assure door and window, patio and porch screens are tight-fitting and in good repair.
- Wear long-sleeved tops, long pants, socks and shoes and clothing made of tightly woven materials to keep mosquitoes away from skin. Light colored clothing is best.
- Eliminate stagnant water in bird baths, ponds, flower pots/trays/saucers, water fountains and water features and get rid of tires, buckets or other receptacles that could serve to contain water where mosquitoes might breed.
- Be sure to check clogged gutters and flat roofs that may have poor drainage.
- Make sure cisterns, cesspools, septic tanks, rain barrels and trash containers are covered tightly with a lid or with 16-mesh screen.
- Level the ground around residence so water can run off and not collect in low spots. Fill in holes or depressions near the building that accumulate water.
- Fill in tree rot holes and hollow stumps that hold water.
- Stock ornamental water gardens with fish (e.g. minnows, "mosquito fish" or goldfish) that eat mosquito larvae.
- Treat small pools of water with "Bti", a bacterial insecticide. Many hardware stores carry doughnut-shaped Bti briquettes (Mosquito Dunks) for this purpose. Be sure to follow the insecticide label exactly.
- Keep weeds and grass cut short; adult mosquitoes look for these shady places to rest during the hot daylight hours.
- Bird and wild game hunters should follow the usual precautions when handling wild animals and birds. They should wear gloves when handling and cleaning birds or animals to prevent blood exposure to bare hands.
