# Town News

## Island Manager's Comments

Greetings Everyone,

**Long Beach Marina & Quail Circle Canal:** The Yacht Club Policy states: "For those Annually Renewable Slips that have not had payments in full made by Memorial Day, the Annually Renewable Slip will be made available to the next FI property owner on the Waiting List. If an Equity Rights slip owner does not pay the annual fee by Memorial Day, the slip may be assigned as a General Rental Slip". We have extended the deadline to Saturday. If you haven't paid your marina fee by the time the office closes this Saturday, you are in jeopardy of losing your slip.

The fees are as follows:

- Marina Equity Slips      \$225.00 \*
- Marina Rental              \$900.00 \*
- Quail Circle                 \$200.00

\* Denotes extra wide slips in accordance with the Yacht Club Policy.

**Note: Proof of insurance must be presented when registering your boat as is the case with Motor Vehicles.**

**Shoreland Zoning Ordinance:** I have heard of a number of instances where property owners have been cutting trees within the shoreland zone. I will assume that these Islanders do not understand the Ordinance or the ramifications of violations. The shoreland zone is defined in the Ordinance as:

The Shoreland Zone of the Town of Frye Island, consisting of all land areas within:

1. Two hundred fifty (250) feet, horizontal distance, of the normal high-water line of Sebago Lake.
2. Two hundred fifty (250) feet, horizontal distance, of the upland edge of a non-forested wetland

There are very specific requirements controlling the cutting of trees and other vegetation within this zone. In addition, the State legislature passed the following legislation:

**AUGUSTA** -A new law sponsored by Rep. Dawn Hill, D-York, requiring that trees cut in shoreland areas be replaced with trees of similar size and species, went into effect on Sept. 20. The new law requires that developers or individuals who illegally cut down trees in Maine's shoreland area must do more than just pay a fine. Trees, and understory vegetation, must be replaced by those of a substantially similar size and species.

This ordinance is enforced by the Town but if we fail to do so, the Department of Environmental Protection will so please understand the ordinance and if there are any questions ask the Code Enforcement Officer. A copy of all Frye Island ordinances are available on our web site.

**Police and Safety:** Dana Wessling has resigned as the police officer for Frye Island to pursue other interests. In his place, I have hired Rod Beaulieu to serve as our Chief of Police. Rod retired from the Sanford Maine Police Dept. after 20 years of service. During that time he served as a patrol officer, a detective, detective supervisor and spent 14 years as a patrol supervisor. He brings a lot of experience to the position. In addition, he has four other certified police officers that will be assisting him on an as needed basis.

**Code Enforcement Officer:** Paul White has resigned as our CEO to take a full time position in Eliot Maine. I have hired John Thompson to serve as our CEO. John has over twenty years experience as a Code Officer. He is retiring from the same position in Naples Maine and wanted some part-time seasonal employment. This should work out well for both of us. Unfortunately John is committed to Naples through June so he won't be on board until July. Paul White has agreed to help us out until John is available.

**Water System:** The Board of Selectmen / Executive Committee approved the first phase of the water distribution system replacement. This will consist of laying a new 4" pipe down Highpoint Drive from Sunset Road to the intersection of Highpoint, Birch and Ridge. We expect to start as soon as we can finalize the material list; but, we do not anticipate making all of the property connections until this fall. The new pipe will be installed along the eastern side of the road and may require some re-routing of traffic during the installation. I will keep you posted as we proceed.

**Golf Car Safety:** The Department of Transportation allows 14 Islands to use golf cars on Island roads. Frye Island is one of the islands granted this privilege. However, in order to retain this privilege, there are a few requirements:

1. All golf cars driven on Frye Island roads must be registered with the Bureau of Motor Vehicles. This can be done at the Town Office during regular business hours. In order to register any golf car, you must show proof of insurance. In addition, the registration stickers issued at the time of registration, and the owners' lot number must be displayed on the golf car. In addition, golf cars are

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subject to all the same laws that apply to regular motor vehicles.

2. In order to legally drive a golf car on Frye Island roads the operator **must have a valid driver's license**.

I have been preaching golf car safety for many years and we have been fortunate not to have any serious accidents involving golf cars. That almost came to an end last weekend. As you know, all of our roads are gravel, and as well as they are maintained, the fact that there will be rocks and potholes is inevitable. On Sunday, a young man with 3 passengers, going down Middle Beach Road hit one of these Frye Island moguls and lost control of his golf car. I understand that the golf car flipped over and all of the passengers were ejected. While they all received some bumps and bruises, one young man suffered a concussion and fairly serious bruises and required transport to the hospital. Thankfully he will be fine but I can't overstate the need to be extremely careful when traveling on our roads. Any time you combine golf cars, with full size vehicles, bicycles, pedestrians, and gravel roads you have a dangerous mixture with potentially serious consequences.

**Fuel Costs:** The latest price for fuel delivered to the ferry increased to \$4.16. I presented these projections to the Board of Selectmen / Executive Committee at the last meeting and it was decided to wait and watch for a while to see how the season progresses.

**Package Deliveries:** A reminder concerning the delivery of packages to Frye Islanders. We receive upwards of 4 to 5 package deliveries a day from the delivery services, (UPS, FedEx, DHL, etc). Each one provides a number of delivery options, i.e. overnight, express, ground etc, and each one is delivered by a different truck and driver. With the increase in internet shopping, the volume of packages has really increased in recent years. In addition, the types of packages have changed. The packages delivered now range everywhere from household appliances, to frozen foods, prescription drugs and urgent letters. There are days when we receive 40 or more packages. This has created difficulties for both the ferry crews and for Islanders. The ferry crews because it has really increased their work load and Islanders because of delays in receiving their deliveries. Most of the packages we receive are shipped regular ground and arrive at the ferry office between 3 PM and 5 PM. Monday through Friday. This also happens to be one of the busiest times of the day for the ferry crews and quite often they are not available to receive the packages when delivered. Because the ferry trailer is locked when the crew is not there, the packages are often just left outside. Because of this practice, some packages have been reported missing. In fact, some packages that were known to have been delivered to the Island Post Office have been reported missing. I have contacted most of the delivery services and they will not deliver to the Island. I am told they will not deliver to any island.

**Recreation Director:** We are still in need of a Recreation Director to oversee the children / teen programs at the recreation center. We have an Islander that can perform these duties for the month of July, but we would still need someone for June and August. If anyone is interested or knows someone that might be interested please notify the office.

**Taxes:** I realize that it is a bit early but I want to remind everyone that the second half of the 2008 property tax is due June 30<sup>th</sup>. Interest will start to accrue after July 1<sup>st</sup> for all unpaid taxes. In addition, in accordance with the charter, all delinquent property owners will be placed on the "not in good standing list" and will not be allowed to purchase or use discount ferry tickets.

Please help us help you by adhering to the following:

1. The ferry crews are not responsible for the delivery of packages to an individual. Even if they have to sign for them, they are typically signing for a large quantity of packages and they do not have the time to check through each one to insure that it is in the lot they signed for or if there are special delivery instructions. In addition, once they are delivered to the post office a number of people have access to those packages and in fact, some that were seen being delivered to the post office have disappeared.
2. If you are expecting an urgent or special delivery package you should notify the ferry office during the day when the clerk is in. If it arrives during her shift she will attempt to contact you and make arrangements for pickup. You can either meet the

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ferry on the Island if they can bring the package right over or you will be allowed free walk on passage to retrieve the package from the ferry office. You should be able to go on-line to see when your package has been released for delivery.

3. If you have very large or heavy packages delivered to the ferry office, the clerk will attempt to contact you so that you can go to the trailer to retrieve your package. We have very limited space in the ferry office and in the post office for storing these packages.
4. All packages will be delivered to the post office around 6 PM on the day they arrive at the ferry office. We have arranged to have one of the island employees pick up the packages at the ferry office and deliver them to the post office every evening. We decided to wait until 6 PM to insure that we have all of the daily deliveries so that we only have to do this once a day.

**Referendum Election:** There will be a Primary Election on Tuesday June 10 for all voters registered to vote in Frye Island. The polls will open at 10AM and close at 8 PM, or you may vote by absentee ballot.

We are also looking for registered voters in the Town of Frye Island to donate a couple hours to man the polls at the Community Center on the 10<sup>th</sup>. If you can help us out, please call the office.

**Board Meeting:** The next Board of Selectmen / Executive Committee meeting has been scheduled for 9 AM Saturday June 14<sup>th</sup> at the Community Center.



## **Marina News**

### **Safe Boating Tips**

- Watercraft towing a person or persons on water-skis, surfboards, aquaplanes, or similar devices shall not operate within water safety zones (area of water within 200 feet of any shoreline, mainland or island). Exception: to drop-off or pickup passengers, while ensuring that persons and property are not endangered in the process.
- No person shall operate any watercraft for the purpose of towing a person on water-skis, surfboards, or similar devices on any waterway between the hours of ½ hour after sunset until ½ hour before sunrise.
- Any person being towed on water skis, surfboards, or similar devices must wear a life jacket, life belt, or similar life saving device. No watercraft operator shall tow anyone involved in the aforementioned activities unless the person being towed has complied with this requirement.
- Watercraft towing a person on water skis, surfboard, or other similar devices must have a person in the watercraft who is at least 12 years of age, in addition to the operator, who is in a position to continually observe the person/s being towed.
- After a day on the water, remove any visible vegetation, animals, mud, fishing gear and all equipment exposed to the water while you are at the launch ramp. Frye Island has a wash down station at it's ramp located at Long Beach Marina.
- Get into the habit of cleaning your boating gear every time that you travel from one body of water to the next. Invasive water species are so small, you may not realize that they're "hitching a ride".

# Fire Department

## ***Open Fires***

Open fires in a screened enclosure designed for such use or a chimeneas are permitted with the following conditions:

It must be used only on an acceptable permit required burn day within the state. (A permit will not be necessary to use the device but it must be a day in which burning is allowed).

The device must be on sand or dirt in a wide open area to prevent any spread of fire. It must be placed away from any structure and CAN NOT be situated on a porch, deck or other similar area. It must be continuously monitored by an adult. A fire hose or bucket of water must be nearby. The fire department has the authority to extinguish any fire that constitutes a hazard.

A camp fire is not permitted or is any burning of slash, leaves, branches or tree trunks. A person using one of these devices accepts full responsibility for their action if a mishap occurs.

The Forest Service determines the class day every morning. They broadcast this information over the radio to notify all the fire departments. The Frye Island Fire Department gets this information over their portable radios. In addition, local fire departments, like Raymond, give out this information in their morning radio announcement. They give the class day and whether or not permits will be issued. If conditions are extremely dry or if there are high winds, there probably will be no permits issued. A call to the Raymond Fire Department dispatcher or asking one of our own members should give you the answer.

Class Days are grouped into five (5) categories.

Class 1 is when there is very little potential danger.

Class 2 is when there is some danger.

Class 3 is when there is danger present.

Class 4 is when there is moderate danger.

Class 5 is when there is extreme danger or fire threat.
