Island Manager's Comments

Greetings Everyone,

Primary and Special Referendum: The primary / Special Referendum election was held last Tuesday. We had 18 voters participate out of 95 registered voters or a turn out of 19%. The referendum passed on the Island 12 in favor, 6 opposed and passed state wide as well. In the contested primary elections the following candidates won:

 - Charles Summers


All other positions were uncontested.

I would like to thank Carl Hommel, Phil Perry, Claire LaDow, John & Laura Crosby, and Lisa Kerrigan for assisting at the polls.

Fuel Costs: The cost of ferry fuel continues to fluctuate...mostly up. I have attached a graph showing our cost for fuel this season; and a chart showing budgeted and projected fuel usage and costs.

Ferry Tickets: The Town Charter allows for the sale of ferry tickets at a discounted cost to Islanders considered to be in "good standing". This privilege is extended to the property owners, their family and guests. This privilege is not extended to day workers or renters. The ferry crews have caught some people violating this privilege. The ferry service must operate on the revenues from the sale of ferry tickets. Every time someone cheats this system, the ferry service loses revenue. It should be quite obvious to everyone that the costs to run the ferries are increasing. We are all working hard to control costs and maximize revenue and we need your help as well. The Board has no immediate plan to increase ferry ticket price or to further decrease ferry service but it is reviewed weekly. The fact that a number of Islanders are still providing discount tickets to unauthorized recipients is just another reason that could expedite the need to address this.

Taxes: The second half of the 2008 property tax is due June 30th. Interest will start to accrue after July 1st for all unpaid taxes. In addition, in accordance with the charter, all delinquent property owners will be placed on the "not in good standing list" and will not be allowed to purchase or use discount ferry tickets.

Beach #6 Drainage Improvements

The Public Works Department has started drainage improvements to the parking area of beach 6.

The Portland Water District and the State DEP have both consulted on this project, a drainage swale will run down the middle of the parking lot, this swale will direct the parking area runoff into a shallow holding area, where it will percolate into the ground, the swale and holding area will be seeded and covered with straw matting. This project will eliminate parking lot flooding and beach erosion, we will also be making improvements to the Leisure Lane/North Beach Road intersection drainage. This project will be completed before high season begins.

Are you familiar with the Community Center Policy?

As we approach high season, we need to schedule all activities at the Community Center to avoid a scheduling conflict. If you hold meetings at the Community Center, this applies to you.

1. All activities shall be scheduled through the Town Manager or his/her designee.
2. All individuals and groups will be required to fill out an application for the use of this facility and turn it into the Town Office.
3. The Town Manager will assign the space to be used.
4. A fee and deposit will be charged for the use of the Community Center for all activities except as listed below:
 - a. Meetings of the Board of Selectmen, Executive Committee of the Board of Island Trustees, The Board of Frye Island, Inc., the Appeals Board, and the Planning Board.
 - b. Meetings/events of the advisory committees to any of the Boards listed in 4a.
 - c. Meetings/events of the Island Clubs, such as the Garden Club, Book Club, Sunday Morning Chapel, Yacht Club, etc.
 - d. Bingo will not be charged for use other than 10% of the proceeds currently being donated.
5. Fees and deposits will be charged as follows:
 - a. Island property owners may use the main meeting room for private activities as agreed to by the Town Manager at the rate of \$50.00 per hour or \$250.00 per day, whichever is less.
 - b. Off island for profit organizations/individuals may use the main meeting room if approved by the Town Manager for a fee as determined by the Board of Selectmen.
 - c. Recreational/educational groups or individuals offering activities to the Frye Island Community and who charge fees for those activities may use the main meeting room or other space if approved by the Town Manager for a fee of \$25.00 per hour.
 - d. There will be a \$35.00 surcharge for the use of the kitchen.
6. Any activities not specifically covered by this policy may use the facility at the discretion of the Town Manager.
7. All individuals, groups, or organizations using the facility are responsible for setting up, cleaning up, and leaving the facility in a clean and orderly fashion.
8. A \$250.00 security deposit will be charged all organizations/individuals listed under items 5c and 5d and a \$500.00 security deposit will be charged all organizations/individuals listed under items 5a and 5b for use of the facility. Deposit will be refunded within 14 days of final activity if the facility is left in satisfactory condition.
9. If the activity requires additional days or hours for set-up etc., the per diem or hourly fee will be charged for this time.
10. Fees will be paid at the time the application is filed and are 100% refundable if the Town Manager is notified of cancellation at least 15 days in advance, or 50% refundable if notified before 8 days of scheduled activity.
11. The Town of Frye Island office must receive applications for private functions at least 30 days in advance of the event to facilitate scheduling.

Conservation Update

Kiosk: A new kiosk has been erected on Small Frye Island on the end near the old fire barn and store. Only Conservation related material will be posted there. We want to thank our Public Works Dept., and especially Harry Holgersen, for the fine wood workmanship. A few items have already been posted.

Animal sightings: There were at least two alleged sightings of a black bear a few weeks ago but none lately. About fourteen fox have been seen including a mother and four little fuzzy “puppies”.

The number of mice and squirrels seem to be much decreased, perhaps due to the increase in the fox population. There are the usual deer roaming around including a group of three. A brave grouse followed me closely, about 10-15 feet away, when I was clearing a trail near the golf course. If you see any interesting animals on the Island, other than humans, please notify me at ed02420@lycos.com.

Trails: Many, but not all, trails have been cleared of limbs, branches and leaves. Thanks to Andy Lapati and Bill Keup for helping to do the cleanup. The remainder of the trails will be cleared and a work-day is planned to connect two key trails on the undeveloped part of the golf course. Unfortunately, the clearing for the golf driving range obliterated one of the best trail links. The surrounding trails remain intact.

Guided walks: As in previous years, trail, bird and nature walks will be offered for those who are interested. Young children seem to really enjoy the trail and nature walks along with adults of all ages.

Safe Boating Tips

- Storage Tips- Strategically place handfuls of mothballs in the bilge and compartments on your watercraft to deter field mice and nature’s critters from making their homes in your boat for the winter months. Place an uncovered five gallon plastic bucket filled with loose charcoal briquettes in the center of your galley area or cockpit for winter storage. The briquettes wick away moisture and give your watercraft a clean odor after a long winter.
- Always check your watercraft’s “capacity plate” and adhere to it’s guidance. Overloading your boat can lead to capsizing and the potential for loss of life.
- The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service recommends: “Do not release unused bait into the waters that you are fishing; dump it into a proper trash receptacle on land far away from any water body.” This will help in reducing the number of invasive species from our precious water resources.

Attention to safety concerns by all of us, whether we’re boaters or guests, will make our boating experiences fun and memorable. Please try to keep your fellow boaters and their guests in mind while utilizing either the Long Beach Marina or Quail Circle Marina. Try to be vigilant for unsightly trash and hazards (small stumps, brush, logs, discarded or lost boating equipment, etc.) Some of our boaters utilize our docking facilities during the hours of darkness. Early in the season, an unlighted stump or piece of winter “slash” could cause a serious injury. PLEASE take the time to remove these items and take them out of harms way, by making an effort to dispose of them in the proper manner. If we all pitch in, our marinas will be kept in a condition that we can all be proud of.


