Island Manager's Comments

Greetings Everyone,

Anniversary Celebration: We anticipate a very busy weekend as we celebrate **Independence Day** and the 10th birthday of the **Town** of Frye Island. I do not intend to identify all of the scheduled activities because they appear later in the FINS. However, there are some things you should know in order to ease the congestion that is sure to exist in the ferry landing area on Saturday morning as the parade concludes and the brief celebration takes place.


- **Parking** – There will be no parking allowed in the “downtown” area between the hours of 10:00 AM and the conclusion of the ceremonies. If you must drive downtown please park at the old recreation area and walk down Playground Lane.
- **Parade** - The parade will leave the Community Center at 10:00 AM and will travel down High Point Drive to Sunset, left to Leisure, right to Timber, straight to Leisure, right to Sunset and then to the downtown area. Please use extreme caution if you must be driving near this parade route while the parade is in progress.
- **Ferry Service:** Because of the congestion anticipated in the downtown area, the ferry service will be suspended during the ceremonies. The last ferry run from the Island Saturday morning will be at 10:00 AM. The ferry will return to the Island at 10:15 AM and will remain there until the ceremonies are finished and the congestion in the area allows traffic to resume. We have taken steps to be able to respond to emergency situations if necessary. Hopefully, this will not be required.

- **Fire Works:** The fire works display has been scheduled for dusk on Saturday evening with a rain date for Sunday. As usual, the boats in the Marina from slips 84 on the beach side and slip 67 on the road side must be removed by 5:00 PM. Please.... Please..... Please, if you have a boat in one of these slips move it out before 5:00 PM. If you don't, we will have it moved for you at your expense.
- **Office:** If you have business to conduct this weekend, please do it before noon. The office is scheduled to be open both Friday and Saturday but I am considering closing at noon both days to give the office staff time to enjoy some of the activities. Please consider this your only warning.
- **Ferry Schedule:** We will run the ferry until midnight Thursday night in anticipation of higher traffic for the holiday weekend.

I have been asked to MC the ceremonies at the conclusion of the parade and have been told to keep it short; 15 minutes, so there will be plenty of time to enjoy all of the activities scheduled with family and friends. Please enjoy the activities this weekend. A number of people have worked hard to make this a very special weekend.

Mainland Parking: I am sure that you are aware that parking on the mainland is very limited. Parking along the access road is permitted but the parked vehicle must be completely off the pavement. This is essential to insure that emergency vehicles can get through. Anyone violating this policy could have their vehicle towed at the owners' expense.

Fuel Costs: I will continue to chart the cost of ferry fuel vs. the budget for your information.

Discount Tickets: A few weeks ago I mentioned that the ferry crew has identified a number of renters and day workers using discount tickets and requested that good sense prevail. The charter allows property owners in good standing, their families and guests to use discount tickets. This does not include renters or day workers. If this practice continues, we will be forced to take action. It has been suggested that we reduce the amount of the discount, or consider violators “not in good standing” please help everyone out and abide by the established policies.

Taxes: The second half of the 2008 property tax was due June 30th. Interest on the unpaid taxes started accruing on July 1st. In accordance with the charter, all delinquent property owners will be placed on the “not in good standing list” and will not be allowed to purchase or use discount ferry tickets.

Board Meeting: The next Board of Selectmen / Executive Committee meeting has been scheduled for 4 PM Wednesday July 9th at the Community Center.

A Message from the Marina Committee

Now that we are in High Season, the Marina Committee would like to remind all Marina and Long Beach users that parking in and around the Long Beach Marina area is at a premium. If at all possible, please travel to and from Long Beach and the Marina by golf cart. The upper parking lot is reserved for cars and vehicles with boat trailers. Those Islanders bringing their boats and launching them for the day should make every effort to park their vehicles and trailers in a straight line against the tree line so as to maximize the available space in the lot. Beachgoers should not park on Marina Road. The area near the turn around at the far end of the Marina is now posted for emergency vehicles only.

The Marina Committee is actively seeking to relieve some of the parking congestion in the Long Beach/Marina area and appreciates your cooperation.

Safe Boating Tips

- Watercraft may not be operated at a speed greater than "headway speed" while within a water safety zone (**200 feet of shore**), marina or approved anchorage. Headway speed is defined as the minimum speed necessary to maintain steerage and control of the watercraft while it is moving.
- Boaters must always consider the effects of the wash or waves created by their watercraft to piers, floats, shorelines, or property of others. The operator is civilly responsible for any damage incurred.
- Watercraft 16 feet or longer, must have a wearable U.S. Coast Guard approved Type I, II, or III PFD (personal flotation device) for each person on board PLUS at least one throw able device (Type IV) on board. Watercraft under 16 feet in length require one PFD for each person on board. All children 10 years of age and younger must wear a Type I, II, or III PFD while on board a watercraft.
- When commissioning your watercraft from storage, ensure that all hose clamps and hoses are reattached and hose clamps secured tightly. Check same periodically during the boating season. Vibrations will loosen those hoses and clamps.

Town of Frye Island Public Works Department – Transfer Station

Because of after hours illegal dumping inside and outside of the Transfer Station, the Public Works Department will be restricting after hours access to the transfer station.

Residents have been leaving televisions, computers, lawn chairs, used motor oil, paint, insecticides, tires, boat, automobile and jet ski batteries, wood, furniture etc. all so that they can avoid transfer station fees.

This illegal dumping is not fair to those taxpayers who go by the rules and pay their fair share. We all end up paying for your illegal dumping.

Starting this weekend (6-21-08) anyone caught inside the transfer station fence with anything other than bagged household trash shall be fined the maximum penalty allowed by state law.

The Public Works Department and the Frye Island Police Department will be aggressively monitoring the transfer station.

Failure to pay any fees or fines may affect you or your guests right to use or purchase discounted ferry tickets.

When the Transfer Station is closed, you may walk around the fence only with bagged household trash and deposit it in the back of the truck.



Protection Against Mosquitoes

- Avoid places and times when mosquitoes bite. Generally, peak biting periods for the type of mosquitoes capable of transmitting WNV occur just before and after sunset and just before dawn.
- Apply insect repellent containing 25-35% DEET when you're outdoors.
- Assure door and window, patio and porch screens are tight-fitting and in good repair.
- Wear long-sleeved tops, long pants, socks and shoes and clothing made of tightly woven materials to keep mosquitoes away from skin. Light colored clothing is best.
- Eliminate stagnant water in bird baths, ponds, flower pots/trays/saucers, water fountains and water features and get rid of tires, buckets or other receptacles that could serve to contain water where mosquitoes might breed.
- Be sure to check clogged gutters and flat roofs that may have poor drainage.
- Make sure cisterns, cesspools, septic tanks, rain barrels and trash containers are covered tightly with a lid or with 16-mesh screen.
- Level the ground around residence so water can run off and not collect in low spots. Fill in holes or depressions near the building that accumulate water.
- Fill in tree rot holes and hollow stumps that hold water.
- Stock ornamental water gardens with fish (e.g. minnows, "mosquito fish" or goldfish) that eat mosquito larvae.
- Treat small pools of water with "Bti", a bacterial insecticide. Many hardware stores carry doughnut-shaped Bti briquettes (Mosquito Dunks) for this purpose. Be sure to follow the insecticide label exactly.
- Keep weeds and grass cut short; adult mosquitoes look for these shady places to rest during the hot daylight hours.
- Bird and wild game hunters should follow the usual precautions when handling wild animals and birds. They should wear gloves when handling and cleaning birds or animals to prevent blood exposure to bare hands.

Come to the Parade!

On Saturday, July 5, at 10:00 a.m. (assemble at Community Center at 9:30) the 10th Anniversary Parade will begin. Conservation and Your Garden

Last Saturday, June 28th, the Garden Club met at the home of Ed and Maria Charrette. Ed Charrette is the Chairman of the Frye Island Conservation Commission. The purpose of the program was "Making Conservation Work in your Garden—from Rain Barrels to Moss".

The first phase of the program was to visit Maria's shade garden, a lovely section of the property containing such plants as hosta, astilbe, evening primrose, iris, day lilies, and columbine, as well as container plantings.

Second, Ed brought the group to the moss garden. In his travels he had seen a moss garden in Kyoto, Japan, which had fascinated him and inspired him to create such a garden on Frye Island. He started with moss that already existed and added many other different species. Moss is like a mini-forest, he told us, with varied larvae and minute life going on it. It likes acidity and will grow not only on the ground but also on logs, roofs, and rocks.

The third phase of his talk was the rain barrel. This is a specialized barrel, which collects water draining from the roof of his house. The overflow from this barrel is directed by hoses to water the plants in his garden and to collect in the bog.

The fourth phase was the lily pond. The lily pond is man made and uses water which Ed pumps from the lake. It is a quiet and lovely place containing tropical water lilies, calla lilies, iris, water hyacinth, and a performing frog, which croaked as we watched. Japanese snails are used to clean the algae from the pond.

Last was a bog garden that was adjacent to the lily pond. Ed explained that if one sets up proper conditions, a bog will develop.

We noticed that a stone bench was constructed in front of the lily pond and bog—a perfect place to sit in quiet meditation.

SOIL

Soil erosion is our #1 pollutant, washing chemicals and debris from our roads, driveways, and construction sites into the lake:

What YOU can Do:

- Plant shrubs and trees to create a buffer between you and the water to filter pollutants
- Mulch and plant bare soil and avoid lawn areas
- Use meandering paths and driveways
- Avoid clear cutting of trees and bushes
- Use “no-wake speed” when boating within 200 feet of the shoreline. It's the law.

PLANTS

On any island walk you will notice a wide variety of plant life. Natural is beautiful. When landscaping, using Maine's native greenery is key to preserving habitat for local plants and animals. For a complete list visit Maine Dept. of Conservation at www.state.me.us

WATER

Sebago Lake was formed over 12,000 years ago from glacier deposits. Our watershed area is a bowl shaped land mass in which water collects from various sources.

All lakes age and sediment builds on lake bottoms. As the lake depth changes, so do plant and fish species. This aging process is known as “eutrophication”. Maine lakes have been filling for years. Water quality changes are related to phosphorus and other materials carried into the lake by rain water. Remember that you and your family are drinking Sebago Lake water.

What YOU can DO:

- Use mulch rather than grass over leach field areas.
- Use non-phosphate detergents
- Pump septic systems every 2-3 years
- Maintain ditches and driveways
- Limit use of fertilizers
- Use free mulch from the transfer station instead of grass.
- Collect rain water to water gardens. Water barrels are available at the Portland Water District.
- Conserve water daily at home: fix leaks, use low flow shower heads.
- Recycle and dispose of hazardous wastes properly.
- Remove invasive plants from boats
- Avoid the use of septic tank additives.
- Treasure our island's vernal streams and pools.

NEW BUILDERS

Building a new home is a great opportunity to preserve, rather than mar the natural beauty of this magnificent island. This can be accomplished by following the suggestions mentioned in the brochure.

All too often, every tree and bush are removed from a building lot and replaced with grass cover. This causes an erosion risk and extra water and fertilization required can endanger lake ecology. Seriously consider using a builder who preserves the natural beauty of the lot.
