Island Manager's Comments

Greetings Everyone,

Anniversary Celebration: I would like to thank everyone that helped arrange the activities for the anniversary weekend, the many people that decorated their cars, trucks and golf cars and everyone else that attended the celebration. In my humble, but somewhat biased opinion, I think the whole weekend was a great success.

Ferry Service: I have been writing regularly about the significant discrepancy between what was budgeted for fuel and what we are actually paying. The last invoice for fuel was at \$4.32 per gallon compared to the \$2.75 that we budgeted. I am projecting a year end shortfall of approximately \$17,000 in fuel costs. We are in hopes of making up some of this in other areas of the expense budget but it is not an approach that can be relied on because any mechanical problems with the ferries can be a very costly impact on the budget.

As much as the cost of fuel is a concern to the ferry budget, the reduction in revenue from the sale of tickets appears to be having a far greater impact. I have been tracking ferry revenues from the start of the season; and at the end of May they were actually slightly higher than we budgeted. Unfortunately, they now appear to be headed south. The operating revenues by the end of June were almost \$20,000 short. If this trend continues, I project we could be as much as \$70,000 short by the end of the season. Almost all of this shortfall is due to the reduction in the sale of full price tickets.

The Executive Committee was hoping that the higher fuel costs could be absorbed by the Ferry Operating Reserve, and, had the revenues been somewhere near planned, we probably could have made it or at least come close. But, we certainly can't when we consider the projected revenue shortfall.

Consequently, the EC has scheduled a special public hearing to discuss adding a surcharge to the cost of each ferry ticket used. At this point, the Committee is considering adding \$3.00 to each discount ticket and \$6.00 to each regular ticket. I am not sure this will be enough but a public hearing has been scheduled for Saturday, July 19th at 8:00 AM to discuss a surcharge. In addition, a special Board of Island Trustees (BIT) meeting has been scheduled for the following Saturday, July 26th, at 9:00AM to determine what if any surcharge will be added.

I have looked at reducing the schedule of the second ferry but even if we cut it out completely, the savings are marginal and if you look at the fact that we would probably have to shuttle the operating ferry, it is doubtful there would be much if any savings.

I recall a few years ago having a discussion concerning what we would do for ferry revenues when the construction traffic went away. Well, it hasn't disappeared completely but this could be considered a precursor to times to come. The revenue from the sale of full price tickets in 2005 was almost \$190,000. In 2006 and 2007 it was around \$135,000. If the existing trends continue for the rest of the summer, this year projects to be about \$85,000.

I will be watching this very closely and will try to keep you informed

Discount Tickets: As I have mentioned a couple of times in the past, the report from the ferry crews is that the inappropriate use of discount tickets appears to be rampant. The charter allows property owners in good standing, their families and guests to use discount tickets. This does not include renters or day workers. It is really difficult to estimate how much this practice is contributing to the loss of revenue but if it is as bad as the ferry crews think, it has to be having an impact. The only way renters and day workers can get half price tickets is when they are distributed by property owners. The ferry crews are going to monitor this much closer going forward. I have asked people to discontinue this practice to no avail. This is just another reason that the Executive Committee is going to have to take action that will impact everyone. The ferry service has to operate with the revenue received from the sale of tickets. If all of these trends and practices continue, don't be shocked if the discount disappears or the ferry service is reduced drastically.

Mainland Parking: I am sure that you are aware that parking on the mainland is very limited. Parking along the access road is permitted but the parked vehicle must be completely off the pavement. This is essential to insure that emergency vehicles can get through. Anyone violating this policy could have their vehicle towed at the owners' expense.

Taxes: The second half of the 2008 property tax was due June 30th. Interest on the unpaid taxes started accruing on July 1st. In accordance with the charter, all delinquent property owners will be placed on the "not in good standing list" and will not be allowed to purchase or use discount ferry tickets.

Memorabilia: Wini Rogers, Joan Rivard and others have gathered some interesting memorabilia and have it on display at the Town Office. Please feel free to drop by to see it.

Bingo: Diana Luchor has volunteered to run Bingo at the Community Center this year. The license has been applied for and as soon as we get it we will start. I suspect the first night will be Monday July 21st and each Monday evening after that through August. More information will be provided once we receive the license.

Board Meeting: The next regular Board of Selectmen / Executive Committee meeting has been scheduled for 9AM on August 9 at the Community Center.

Safe Boating Tips

- Get into the habit of cleaning your boating gear every time that you travel from one body of water to the next. Invasive water species are so small, you may not realize that they're "hitching a ride".
- During and after refueling operations, your vessel's power ventilation system should be activated for at least 4 minutes after refueling to remove all gasoline/fuel vapors from the engine compartment, **BEFORE STARTING** your engine. A fully charged fire extinguisher should be readily available for emergency use. After fueling, open the door of the engine compartment and sniff to check for evidence of gas fumes. Do this before starting the engine.
- Never use water to extinguish a gasoline fire. Water will only spread the area of the fire. Fire extinguishers should be kept full at all times and be in good condition. Ensure that nozzles are obstruction free and in good condition.
- Trash bags(kitchen size) and gallon size zip lock bags come in handy while boating for numerous uses(especially for securing trash). Please encourage your boating passengers to use them and secure them while underway. A trash bag sucked onto a boat's outdrive, could prove fatal to the engine that picks it up.

Town of Frye Island Public Works Department – Transfer Station

Because of after hours illegal dumping inside and outside of the Transfer Station, the Public Works Department will be restricting after hours access to the transfer station.

Residents have been leaving televisions, computers, lawn chairs, used motor oil, paint, insecticides, tires, boat, automobile and jet ski batteries, wood, furniture etc. all so that they can avoid transfer station fees.

This illegal dumping is not fair to those taxpayers who go by the rules and pay their fair share. We all end up paying for your illegal dumping.

Starting this weekend (6-21-08) anyone caught inside the transfer station fence with anything other than bagged household trash shall be fined the maximum penalty allowed by state law.

The Public Works Department and the Frye Island Police Department will be aggressively monitoring the transfer station.

Failure to pay any fees or fines may affect you or your guests right to use or purchase discounted ferry tickets.

When the Transfer Station is closed, you may walk around the fence only with bagged household trash and deposit it in the back of the truck.

SUMMER SAFETY TIPS

On extremely hot and muggy days, exposure to heat can lead to heat exhaustion and heat stroke. Seniors, infants and individuals in poor health are at greatest risk. Joggers and other who exercise outdoors are also at risk. The Frye Island Fire Department recommends the following prevention tips for beating the heat this summer.

- Stay out of the sun because sunlight increases body heat, and sunburn prevents the release of body heat.
- Avoid jogging, or do it at night when it is cooler.
- Wear clothing that is lightweight, light-colored, and loose fitting.
- Drink plenty of water and cool, non-alcoholic beverages.
- Stay indoors; use a fan and air conditioning if possible.
- Eat light food and avoid high protein and high calorie foods, which increase body heat.

- Seek medical advice if you or someone you know becomes ill. If someone develops a high temperature, is flushed, and stops perspiring; bathe the person in cool water and seek medical advice immediately.
- Keep a flashlight with fresh batteries close by since blackouts often occur during extremely hot weather. Please remember that candles are a serious fire hazard.
- Check on elderly or infirm neighbors to see if they need help. Escort them to a "cool area" if necessary.

Annual Frye Island Fourth of July Walk Run

150 runners turned out to participate in this year's Frye Island walk/run – by far the largest turnout ever. Due to the larger number of registrations and strong t-shirt sales we raised almost \$1000 which will be used to fund recreational activities on the Island.

A big thank you to all the people who volunteered their time to help with registration, marking the course, manning water stops, etc... The event could not have happened without you.

Chris Lemieux ran away with the 1-miler and set a new course record of 5:19. That is a fantastic time given the course is run on dirt, downhill out and uphill back and it was a hot day. Honestly, I think he could have run even faster if someone had been there to challenge him. He looked like he was hardly working when he crossed the finish line.

Margo Cassidy was the top female finisher in the one-miler and also established a new course record with a fantastic time of 6:15.

Similarly, Chris Deming dominated the 5-miler, crossing the line with a time of 32:25, just 25 seconds off the course record that he set two years ago.
