Island Manager's Comments

Greetings Everyone,

Ferry Service: A public hearing was held last Saturday to discuss the projected shortfall in both ferry revenue and the expense budget due to the high cost of ferry fuel. I thought there was a very good turn out and some excellent suggestions for long term solutions to issues that are probably going to continue for awhile. Following the meeting the Executive Committee decided to place the following two articles on the warrant for vote at the special BIT meeting to be held on Saturday the 26th.

Article 1: To see if the Board of Island Trustees will vote to apply a three (\$3.00) fuel surcharge to the cost of each \$12.00 ferry ticket and a six dollar (\$6.00) fuel surcharge to the cost of each \$24.00 ferry ticket. This surcharge will be collected on each ticket used for the remainder of the season; and will be applied to the ferry operating revenue account. Pre-purchased tickets are not exempt from this surcharge. The six dollar surcharge to heavy equipment will be charged per unit. (i.e. A dump truck equals 1 unit, a dump truck and trailer equals 2 units, Dump truck cost \$96.00 + \$6.00 = \$102.00; dump truck and trailer costs \$96.00 + \$6.00 + \$6.00 = \$108.00).

It is estimated that implementation of **Article One** would raise an additional \$47,000 assuming projected ticket sales are accurate.

Article 2: To see if the Board of Island Trustees will vote to suspend the transfer of the \$3.00 contribution from the sale of a discounted ferry ticket and \$4.00 contribution from the sale of a full price ferry ticket to the Ferry Capital Reserve. These respective amounts would be added directly to the ferry operating revenue account. This is considered a short term solution and will end at the end of the 2008 season or sooner as determined by the Executive Committee should revenues and expenses become more favorable.

It is estimated that implementation of **Article Two** would transfer an additional \$52,240 to the ferry operating account assuming projected ticket sales are accurate.

The Executive Committee would prefer **Article One** to avoid spending Capital Funds on operating expenses.

Passage of **Article One** would add a three dollar surcharge to every discount ticket used until the end of the 2008 season. The key word here is used. Use of these tickets would require a three dollar charge. This could be done in bulk at the office or when used at the ferry terminal. It would also add a \$6.00 surcharge to all full price tickets used until the end of the season.

The existing policy takes \$3.00 from the sale of each discount ticket and \$4.00 from the sale of each full price ticket and adds these amounts to the Ferry Capital Reserve Fund. Passage of **Article Two** would suspend the addition of these monies to the reserve fund and leave them in the operating account. The Capital reserve, which currently has \$165,000 in it, is intended for capital purchases for the ferry system (ferry engines, gantry equipment, ferries etc.)

I am now going to do something that I am very reluctant to do. Not because I don't value others opinions, but I try to remain neutral in what we publish and let our Islanders reach their own decisions based on the facts. I am sure that everyone on the Island has an opinion, especially when discussing the ferry service, and we don't have the time, the money, or the resources to publish everyone's opinion. So, in a moment of weakness, I agreed to publish this Islanders opinion.

Some are proposing that ferry fees be raised to address ferry operational shortfalls for the 2007/2008 season, but we urge Cottage Owners to vote NO to increased ferry fees on July 26th at 9AM. We appreciate the opportunity to express why we believe this. There has been much discussion about the impact of fuel costs on ferry operation, but taking into account higher fuel cost, total expenses are projected to be over budget by only 4.42% (budgeted expenses were \$336,424 and projected expenses are \$351,307 including fuel). The bigger problem is a reduction in ticket sales revenue. Actual revenues are projected to be down from budgeted revenues by 15.75%. Even if these numbers vary slightly from those projected in last week's FINS, our biggest issue is revenue reduction, not increased expenses. In the past, raising ferry fees did not adversely affect revenue, although certain ticket sales were impacted in the short term. However, in this current economic climate with consumers cutting non-essential expenses, we very well may see break even or negative revenue gains from fee increases. Sales and usage may go down, but fixed ferry expenses will remain mostly the same. It is reasonable to believe that we could end up with increased fees AND the same or greater revenue shortfall at the end of the year. There are many long term ferry financial issues and potential solutions that need to be addressed and

considered. Several were raised at the meeting on July 19th, and now is the time to begin thinking about these for next year and beyond. For the 2007/2008 shortfall, we urge Cottage Owners to hold steady with the current fees and schedule and all work together to face the ferry infrastructure issues that are to come. This year's shortfall can be addressed by either a diversion of reserve funds or by the general fund at the end of the year. Thank you, Betsy and Eric Gleysteen, 1076 Lower South Beach Rd

I have not received any fuel invoices since July 11th. With that invoice we paid \$4.48 per gallon. Based on what I have read recently, I would like to think the cost might be going down a little but I am not going to count on it. Expense projections remain about \$15,000 over plan.

The traffic on the ferries continues to be light as well. The construction traffic seems especially light; so the revenue projections remain about \$30,000 less than planned. We have been lucky so far this season so our maintenance costs are below budget but it doesn't take much of a problem with the ferries or the gantry system to gobble up \$10,000 to \$15,000.

Voting: The Town Charter authorizes the Board of Island Trustees (BIT) to establish the fee charged for ferry tickets.

The charter also sets the following eligibility requirements for Membership in the BIT: He or she must be a citizen of the United States, at least 18 years of age, and an owner or a spouse of an owner of real property located within the Town of Frye Island with a fixed home currently occupied by the person, maximum two people per fixed home

Memorabilia: Wini Rogers, Joan Rivard and others have gathered some interesting memorabilia and have it on display in the Town Office. Please feel free to drop by to see it.

Bingo: Diana Luchor has volunteered to run Bingo at the Community Center this year. We have scheduled the first session for Monday July 21st beginning at 7:00PM and each Monday thereafter through August.

Special Board of Island Trustee Meeting: Saturday 26 July, 9:00AM at the Community Center to approve warrant developed from Public Hearing to increase ferry ticket pricing.

Town of Frye Island Public Works Department – Transfer Station

Because of after hours illegal dumping inside and outside of the Transfer Station, the Public Works Department will be restricting after hours access to the transfer station.

Residents have been leaving televisions, computers, lawn chairs, used motor oil, paint, insecticides, tires, boat, automobile and jet ski batteries, wood, furniture etc. all so that they can avoid transfer station fees.

This illegal dumping is not fair to those taxpayers who go by the rules and pay their fair share. We all end up paying for your illegal dumping.

Starting this weekend (6-21-08) anyone caught inside the transfer station fence with anything other than bagged household trash shall be fined the maximum penalty allowed by state law.

The Public Works Department and the Frye Island Police Department will be aggressively monitoring the transfer station.

Failure to pay any fees or fines may affect you or your guests right to use or purchase discounted ferry tickets.

When the Transfer Station is closed, you may walk around the fence only with bagged household trash and deposit it in the back of the truck.

Everyday a property owner is coming to the office while waiting for the ferry and expecting us to rush. Any time you hurry through a transaction it is a recipe for mistakes.





Safe Boating Tips

- During and after refueling operations, your vessel's power ventilation system should be activated for at least 4 minutes after refueling to remove all gasoline/fuel vapors from the engine compartment, **BEFORE STARTING** your engine. A fully charged fire extinguisher should be readily available for emergency use. After fueling, open the door of the engine compartment and sniff to check for evidence of gas fumes. Do this before starting the engine.
- Never use water to extinguish a gasoline fire. Water will only spread the area of the fire. Fire extinguishers should be kept full at all times and be in good condition. Ensure that nozzles are obstruction free and in good condition.
- Trash bags(kitchen size) and gallon size zip lock bags come in handy while boating for numerous uses(especially for securing trash). Please encourage your boating passengers to use them and secure them while underway. A trash bag sucked onto a boat's outdrive, could prove fatal to the engine that picks it up.

Don't Feed the Ducks


When ducks become tame and use to humans they may not be able to protect themselves from predators.
